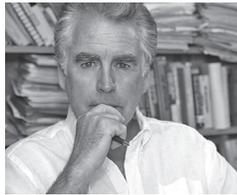

The latest addition to Bill Bryson's ongoing series of travel books written, as always, from the keen eye of a curmudgeon is titled *The Road To Little Dribbling*. Not my favourite, but few writers can take the utterly mundane and make it instantly funny as hell.

In this book about meandering around his adopted country of Britain, he referenced the Dunning-Kruger Effect, a theory put forth by two academics at N.Y.'s Cornell University claiming that this world has become so stupid, we the people are unable to realize how stupid we have become.

And it's not just individual stupidity. Not just what Justin Bieber does or Donald Trump says or Lady Gaga wears, although the puzzling support for Trump's bid to become President of the United States suggests a public dumbing down of an entire nation that is happening faster than the onslaught of global warming.

The Dunning-Kruger Effect points to a more general slide in values and poor judgment in the world – global brain cramps like The Panama Papers, Brexit and the ongoing existence of the Canadian Senate.

A small section illustrating the rape of our oceans is based on the book *Ocean Of Life* by Callum Roberts. As we constantly overfish and under-manage our seafoods and driving all life below the surface into extinction, Roberts offers up a startling example of deep sea stupidity. The following is a documented ledger of a fishing boat off the Pacific coast with a licence to catch only mahi-mahi, thereby making all other types of sea life illegal to keep. In one day, this professional trawler caught 211 mahi-mahi, but in the process hauled aboard and tossed back

dead: 488 turtles, 455 stingrays and devil rays, 460 sharks, 69 sailfish, 34 marlin, 32 tuna, 11 wahoo, 8 swordfish and 4 giant sunfish. And you thought your kids with their picky eating habits were wasteful?!? What's worse, this red sea slaughter according to international fisheries rules or the illegal pillage of marine life by the Chinese who enjoy throwing sharks overboard after they've sliced off their fins for soup? Should this commercial fishing brainlessness continue, someday soon there will be no edible life in the oceans.

In the 1980s the world fell in love with personal home computers, machines that broke down for no apparent reason, wiped out information, lost files and without warning, just crashed. So did we go back and fix the technology that was rushed prematurely to the market place? No, we proceeded to redesign cars that so that they are now essentially computers on wheels. Hackers can now honk your horn, lock your doors and disable your car while you are motoring down the highway. Idiocy in motion.

In a colossal mistake by misinformed voters, Britain exits the European Union, thereby restricting their young to domestic-only jobs and making David Cameron the man who will go down in history as the dumbass Prime Minister who broke up the British Isles. And instead of a 'do-over' or a snap election to reverse this example of mass stupidity, British leaders stumble down the path of their own ruination. Once brilliant enough to break down Nazi Germany's Enigma code system, how thick have the Brits become?



Recipe

Use a leftover ham bone to make this creamy, satisfying, and very wholesome soup. Cooking it low and slow is the best method for creating creamy, delicious split pea soup. It all starts with a 16 ounce bag of green split peas which are rich in soluble fiber keeping cholesterol and blood sugar levels in check. They are high in protein and low in fat, and make us feel full for a long time. Be sure to rinse and pick through the peas to remove any small pebbles or debris that commonly get mixed into the bag.



Slow Cooker Split Pea Soup

Servings: 6 to 8 servings

Ingredients

- 1 (16 ounce bag) green split peas, rinsed well and drained
- 2 carrots, peeled and chopped small
- 2 ribs celery, chopped small
- 1/2 cup finely chopped white or yellow onion
- 1 tablespoon minced garlic
- 1/3 cup chopped fresh Italian (flat leaf) parsley
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh thyme
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 teaspoon salt, plus additional as needed
- Fresh ground pepper, to taste
- 1 meaty ham bone
- 6 cups low-sodium chicken broth (or more, as needed), divided

Layer the ingredients, around the ham bone, in a slow cooker in the order listed. Add about 4 to 5 cups of chicken broth, just enough to cover ingredients. Reserve remaining chicken broth for later. Cover and cook on HIGH for 7 to 8 hours. Stir occasionally during cooking time. When peas are tender, remove ham bone to a cutting board. Pull off and tear the ham into small pieces and return it to the slow cooker. Discard ham bone and bay leaf. Use a spoon to lightly mash some of the peas against the side of the slow cooker and stir until nice and creamy, adding more broth, if needed, to reach desired consistency. Taste and season with additional salt and pepper, as needed.

This soup freezes exceptionally well. Freeze cooled soup in freezer containers. Thaw overnight in the refrigerator and then reheat in microwave or in a saucepan on the stove. When reheating, thin with a little water or chicken broth, if desired.
