Changes In The Works At Espanola Domtar Mill



Domtar Regional Public Affairs Manager, Bonny Skene, says the company has developed a plan to simplify and modernize operations at the Espanola pulp and paper mill, which will prepare the facility for capital projects over the next three years. She says they are consolidating the fiber production line from two to one bleach plant, and reducing batch digesters from five to three to improve the mill's sustainability over the long-term. That work will be carried out

during the upcoming Spring shutdown. Skene adds both specialty paper machines will continue to operate and around 70 jobs will be affected through attrition and retirement. Massey Teen Visits Family Member's Grave Site, Vimy Ridge

Faith Emiry of Massey was one of 20 youths from Canada to attend the Vimy Ridge Memorial as a participant of the Vimy Pilgrimage Group. April 4th was the first day and a special one as she relates her story: Today was the first day on the program that we got the chance to set foot in cemeteries and on battlegrounds of the First World War. The emotions that I experienced while visiting these sites was something I never could have prepared for, and the atmosphere at each site was indescribable. It was a beautiful sunny day and each location we visited had birds chirping which I thought really contributed to the environment in each site. We visited the Maple Cope Cemetery where my great great uncle Bud is known to be buried. His grave was in a beautiful location that was especially moving as it was very secluded and felt very peaceful. We walked down a pathway before the cemetery could finally be

seen, and the site had a very nice archway that we walked under to get to the graveyard. Shortly before his death, my uncle Bud had written home asking his mother for a warm pair of knit socks- but he never lived to receive them. I brought a pair of socks that I knit in memory of my Uncle Bud, and though it was a century too late- I was very honoured to be able to lay these socks at his grave. On the last day of the program, April 9th, which is also Vimy Ridge Day in Canada, the Vimy Pilgrimage 2019 students visited the Canadian National Vimy Memorial, a very important and moving experience. The group also visited the Vimy Education Centre, the new Vimy Centennial Park and participated in a ceremony commemorating the 102nd anniversary of the Battle of Vimy Ridge where Aidan and Keneisha read the Commitment to Remember as Eric, Zach, and Rosalie laid a wreath. Later in the day, they visited the Maison Blanche underground tunnels and the Neuville St-Vaast German Cemetery. The Vimy Foundation, founded in 2006, is a Canadian charity with directors and members across Canada. The mission of the Vimy Foundation is to preserve and promote Canada's First World War legacy as symbolized with the victory at Vimy Ridge in April 1917, a milestone where Canada came of age and was then recognized on the world stage. Emiry says she was honoured to be able to take part in this program - in which she was able to gain so many new perspectives about Canada and the First World War.

Espanola Mayor Jill Beer brought back a defeated motion from a sub-committee meeting because she felt council did not have all the information it needed to make an informed decision, but her fellow councillors were having none of that.

Beer wanted to provide the council with the opportunity of discussing a property on Highway Six where a gas station used to be and ongoing remediation continues.

The Economic Development Committee looked at purchasing the property surface rights for \$5,000 but turned it down citing

budgetary concerns.

Beer wanted to bring it back for discussion, but councillors are also concerned about possible liability in regards to environmental impact and other incurred costs.

Several councillors also felt the motion was out of order and did not follow the procedural bylaw, so it was defeated once again.

Recipe

If you love Mexican food and easy meals, then this casserole is for you. Serve with a salad and you have a meal!

Ingredients

- 1 pound lean ground beef
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- ¾ cup of water
- 1 (1.25 ounce) package taco seasoning mix
- 8 ounces macaroni (2 cups)
- 1 (10.75 ounce) can condensed tomato soup
- 1 small jar of salsa
- 2 cups of shredded cheese, divided (Mexican blend is good)
- 1 cup crushed tortilla chips
- 1/2 cup sour cream (optional)
- 1/4 cup chopped green onions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Cook pasta in a large pot of boiling water until al dente. Drain. In a large skillet, cook and stir ground beef and chopped onion over medium heat until brown (drain off the fat); add in the taco seasoning mix and water; stir and bring to a boil, turn down heat and allow to simmer. Add in the soup, salsa and pasta; mix well. Stir in 1 cup of cheese. Spoon beef mixture into a 9x13 inch baking dish and top with remaining 1 cup of cheese. Bake for 15- 20 minutes, until the cheese is melted and casserole is heated through. For serving, top with chopped green onions, crushed tortilla chips and sour cream, if desired.
