Huron Central Railway To Shut Down Next Year

By *Rosalind Russell* - The parent company that owns the Huron Central Railway is planning to shut down the spur, which could be a major concern for three major businesses that utilize the line along the North Shore corridor. Genesee & Wyoming Canada owns the line between Sudbury and Sault Ste. Marie commonly known as the Huron Central Railway. Company president, Louis Gravel, says they are not getting the financial support they need from governments to continue operating, so they will be shutting down the line in 2020. He says the railway needs some \$40 million dollars over the next five years to be able to rehabilitate and maintain safe operation of the line.





LaCloche Foothills Municipal Association look at regional EDO

Four North Shore corridor communities are looking at hiring a regional economic development officer.

The LaCloche Foothills Municipal Association is taking the next step in putting a regional EDO in place for the region.

The Town of Espanola has given its approval, the first of the four to do so.

The townships of Nairn & Hyman, Baldwin and Sables-Spanish Rivers now have to give their stamp of approval for the initiative to move ahead.

Funding to cover the cost of the position would be provided through the Community Investment Initiative for Northern Ontario.

The LaCloche and Manitoulin Assistance Corporation (LAMBAC) would hire the staffer and provide office space at the Espanola office.

The rest of the municipalities all have the proposal on their agendas for discussion this month.

The CIINO would contribute 90% of eligible costs to a maximum of \$100,000 or up to \$170,000 for a regional project. The eligible costs would cover salary, benefits and travel. Espanola's 10% share would depend on the number of municipalities, as well as surrounding unorganized areas and First Nations that decide to come on board.

Oracle Poll Shows Jobs Are Number One For Espanola

Economic concerns top the list of issues for Espanola residents and businesses.

Espanola council has released its Oracle Poll results.

The 2019 Citizen Survey Report was carried out in July and August of this year, updating the previous one done three years ago.

Economic stability, especially jobs, was number one with some expressing concerns about attracting new businesses to Espanola and the future of the Domtar Mill.

Taxation was the second-highest issue at 13%, but down from 22% in 2016 while crime and/or public safety was third on the list at 10%.

The detailed document means the council has some homework to do in compiling and using the information to benefit the municipality while also providing direction in developing several programs, such as the Strategic Plan and recreation.

According to the report released by council, it was conducted by phone and an online survey with 473 residents and 36 businesses surveyed.

Public Health Sudbury And Districts Unveils Racial Equity Action Framework

A new Public Health Racial Equity Action Framework is being put in place by the board for Public Health Sudbury & Districts.

Board chair, Rene Lapierre says the framework is the first of its kind for the agency and under the law everyone has the right to exist free from racial discrimination and harassment.

He adds the Ontario Human Rights Code provides those protections in social aspects of life including accessing public services, health services and social assistance.

Lapierre says the new policy will be put in place in the near future.

Health is about much more than access to medical care. Everyone has different opportunities for health and these are largely influenced by

avoidable injustices, including societal responses to race, culture, and ethnicity," said Dr. Penny Sutcliffe, Medical Officer of Health and Chief Executive Officer, PHSD. "As an agency with a vision of healthier communities for all, (PHSD) is proud to highlight our commitment to racial equality and we encourage other organizations to consider how they too can improve this important opportunity for health." Systemic racism takes place when an institution or set of institutions create or maintain racial inequity in their policies and practices. This can be unintentional and does not mean that people within an organization are racist. It is often caused by hidden biases that privilege or disadvantage people based on race.

Recipe

This recipe contains some fall favourites. It makes a large casserole for a group. It's also a perfect and healthy dish to prep for weekday lunches. Feel free to season it to your taste.



Harvest Chicken Casserole

- 2 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil, divided, plus more for baking dish
- 2 lb. boneless skinless chicken breasts
- Salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 1/2 onion, chopped
- 2 medium sweet potatoes, peeled and cut into small cubes
- 1 lb. brussels sprouts, trimmed and quartered
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tsp. fresh thyme leaves
- 1 tsp. paprika
- 1/2 tsp. ground cumin
- 1/2 c. low-sodium chicken broth, divided
- 6 c. COOKED wild rice
- 1/2 c. dried cranberries
- 1/2 c. sliced almonds

- Preheat oven to 350° and grease a 9"-x-13" baking dish with oil. In a large, deep skillet over medium-high heat, heat 1 tablespoon oil. Season chicken with salt and pepper. Add chicken to skillet and cook until golden and cooked through, 8 minutes per side. Let rest 10 minutes, then cut into 1" pieces.
- Heat another tablespoon oil over medium heat. Add onion, sweet potatoes, Brussel sprouts, garlic, thyme, paprika, and cumin. Season with salt and pepper and cook until softened, 5 minutes. Add 1/4 cup broth, bring to a simmer, and cook, covered, 5 minutes.
- Place cooked rice in a large baking dish and season with salt and pepper. Stir in chicken, cranberries, cooked vegetables, and remaining 1/4 cup broth. Top with almonds and bake until dish is hot and almonds are toasted, 15 to 18 minutes.

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers will hold a public meeting on Wednesday, November 13, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers at 11 Birch Lake Road, Massey, Ontario.

THE PURPOSE of the Public Meeting is to invite comments from the public on revisions to the Official Plan proposed as Official Plan Amendment # 2 and to the proposed zoning by-law amendment. Revised and new policy areas for the update to the Plan include: building strong, healthy communities; providing a range and mix of housing types including affordable housing and tiny housing; planning for the integration and management of infrastructure and community services; conserving the natural environment, water resources and natural heritage resources; promoting alternative and renewable energy systems that reduce the dependence on fossil fuels, and planning for the impacts climate change; providing for local food security; ensuring land use compatibility and protection against natural and human-made hazards; protecting natural resources (i.e. minerals, agricultural lands, forests, pits and quarries) and coordinating land use decision making including consultation with Indigenous communities. The Amendment incorporates changes requested by the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing as their role in the review of the Amendment. The updated official plan is consistent with the 2014 Provincial Policy Statement and complies with the 2011 Growth Plan for Northern Ontario. The effect will be to better manage growth and development, community services and infrastructure in the Township to 2028. The format of the meeting will include a presentation by the Township's planning consultant followed by an opportunity for the public to make verbal or submit written comments. As these amendments pertain to all lands within the jurisdictional limits of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers, a key map has not been produced. A corresponding zoning by-law amendment will be presented at the meeting which is intended to implement the official plan amendment.

IF YOU WISH TO BE NOTIFIED of the decision of the Council of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers on the proposed Official Plan Amendment, you must make written request to the Clerk of the Township (see address below).

IF A PERSON OR PUBLIC BODY would otherwise have an ability to appeal the decision of the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal but the person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted and zoning by-law amendment is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision.

IF A PERSON OR PUBLIC BODY DOES NOT MAKE ORAL SUBMISSIONS AT A PUBLIC MEETING OR MAKE WRITTEN SUBMISSIONS TO the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before the proposed Official Plan Amendment is adopted, and the zoning by-law amendment is passed, the person or public body may not be added as a party to the hearing of an appeal before the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal unless, in the opinion of the Tribunal, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.
