

Espanola Council Awards Contract To Update Strategic Plan

Espanola's updated Strategic Plan is expected to be completed by June of next year, but not before there has been input from the community.

Last week, Espanola council approved hiring Municipal Planning Strategic Associates, David King and Bill Winegard to carry out the work of coordinating a consultation process that includes input from council, staff, and residents in putting together, first a draft plan to be presented early in the new year and then, final document by June. CAO Allan Hewitt says the work on a

new plan started back in early 2020, but when the pandemic hit, the work was put on hold, and he did not start in his new position until July 2021.

He says the Strategic Plan serves as a community's roadmap for the goals it has and is designed to be a big-picture document toward a clearly defined vision for the community.

He adds council also agreed to allocate \$27,000 for the contract to come out of the modernization reserve with a healthy \$400,000 still available to implement the plan.

Espanola Elks Suspend Sale Of Building

Members of the Espanola Elks voted in favour of suspending the sale of the hall following the outpouring of support over the last six months.

At Wednesday night's meeting, members agreed to remove the for-sale signs and continue the fundraising process including launching an in-kind campaign asking for labour and materials for renovations, and the launch of a Go Fund Me campaign.

The members voted to put the building up for sale due to finances but with the support of the community over the last six months has been able to re-evaluate the situation and have decided to forge ahead in getting upgrades done and continue to offer their services to the community.

The hall is now available for bookings throughout 2023 and people are also

encouraged to join the organization.

Baxter Cup Goes To Espanola This Year

By Rosalind Russell - One of the longest-running, friendly sports feuds has ended this year with the Espanola Curling Club coming out on top with the Baxter Cup.

The Baxter cup competition has been going on for an astounding 97 years between the Espanola club and its counterpart in Little Current. The cup is named after George Baxter, a salesman who arrived in Little Current in 1910 and

established the competition in 1925.

It has been a staple of the curling family and is recognized at the national level for its longevity.

Originally the Baxter Cup games were twelve ends (natural ice in February), but this changed to ten ends and the number of teams increased to ten from eight. They now play eight ends with a break in the middle. Total score

of the ten games (5 at each Club) determines the winner. Four trustees, two from each club, see to it that the tradition continues.

Starting in 1925, it survived The Depression, accidental dips in the North Channel, the Cup being stolen (and found), World War 2, and horrendous weather. In fact, when they first started

out, there was no Highway Six, only the rail line, so players would travel back and forth on the train to take part.

Each side has several players who have participated for twenty or more years. This year is the 97th and somehow, despite the pandemic and other challenges, the dedicated curlers continue the tradition.





Project Lifesaver launches on Manitoulin Island and in Espanola

By Rosalind Russell - Espanola and Manitoulin Island are now benefitting from Project Lifesaver, in partnership with the Manitoulin OPP. Constable John Hill, who is also

the community safety officer, says Project Lifesaver utilizes a wristband, radio frequency and antennas, which uses a frequency-based tracking system to keep track of or find high-risk individuals who go missing.

He says these vulnerable individuals can include those diagnosed with Alzheimer's, other dementias, or other forms of cognitive delay.

Hill says the client wears a personalized wristband that emits a unique signal so when someone goes missing, trained OPP officers can respond to the area where the lost person was last seen and carry out a search with a mobile location tracking system.

He says the support of Domtar and the Manitoulin Northshore Victim Services were vital in launching Project Lifesaver, thanking them for their support.


