



Mobile Trades Trailer Sets Up Shop in Espanola



By Chloe Kneer - A shortage of tradespeople in northern Ontario and Canada at large has been a huge problem for years, especially as existing tradespeople age and eventually retire. Younger people or even those looking for a different or more rewarding career are needed to replace those leaving the trades. Another issue is delivery of education and training to potential students in rural or not easily accessible areas. Cambrian College, along with funding from the Ministry of Training Colleges and Universities, has come up with a solution and it is parked right in our backyards: the Mobile Trades Trailer. The trailer is used as both a classroom and a shop and has three main components: a 1000 square foot main along with two support trailers. The program itself has four phases over 36 weeks:

Espanola Money Matters

Bv Chloe Kneer - Espanola Town Council took up the issue of eliminating the school crossing guard program at the April 9 regular council meeting. The program may be scrapped in an effort to further cut the municipal budget. Costs from September to December for the guards ran \$7400. Mayor Lehoux and Coucillors McMillan and McMaster were all opposed to having the guards taken away from the Highway 6 crossing, citing safety concerns. Councillor Meikleham suggested contacting the local school boards to get their input on the program and to see if they would take it over and also to get a report from Police Chief Towns on the busiest intersections that students cross. After discussion it was moved to defer a decision to a later time.

Also at the meeting, it was decided that the town would withhold any payments to MPAC. Councillor McMaster asked if penalties and interest would accrue and Clerk Cynthia Townsend said yes, although she wasn't sure of the rates or fines that would be levied.

After the regular meeting adjourned, budget deliberations continued with Chief Librarian Charles Gravson and Leisure Services Manager Dianne Polden presenting their second draft budgets. The library reduced their costs by \$9900 by eliminating Grayson's conference trip, reducing student worker hours, and by not purchasing new computers and software. There was around a \$400,000

reduction in the Leisure Services budget bringing the total budget to \$2.1 million. Revenues stand at \$472,000 for the complex. Currently, the complex employs 11 full-time and 8 part-time people in addition to casual and seasonal workers. Upcoming expenditures include a new condenser unit and either an overhall or replacement of a compressor and Polden explained that the Zamboni is soon tabled for replacement at a cost of between \$80-100.000.

She also discussed discretionary items, such as the summer parks program and the scaling back of the program to half days, using only 4 students to run it, and the centralization of the program to one location. She called the program "heavily subsidized" and Councillor Miekleham asked if enrollment would suffer should parents have to pay a fee that would make it break-even. Polden said she didn't think so. Closing the outdoor rink and not leasing or maintaining the tennis courts were also options that were brought to the table.

Overall it was continued cuts to services and not administration and staff that was the focus. Councillor Howard and Deputy Mayor Beer both emphasized the need for an external service review. Townsend said that the review would now likely cost in the neighborhood of \$50-80,000, a much higher price tag than initially thought. Beer said that once the budget is finalized she hopes to hold another public information session for residents.

The Ontario Provincial Police is advising all residents to use extreme caution when venturing out onto area waterways. The spring weather has caused conditions to begin changing rapidly. Air holes and open water are now being noted in many places. If you plan to venture out onto the ice, watch for thin ice and open water conditions. What may have been safe today may very well be dangerous tomorrow. Remember--if you don't know then don't go.

Parents are also encouraged to speak to their children about the dangers of fast moving water. The spring thaw is now causing higher than normal and fast moving water conditions in area creeks and rivers. Children should be discouraged from playing near the fast moving water until the water levels subside.

Addicting Skillet Corn

- 1 bag of frozen corn 16 oz
- 2 tablespoons of butter
- 1/3 cup of parmesan cheese
- 1/4 teaspoon of garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon of pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon of paprika

Over medium heat, melt butter in a medium size skillet. Add frozen corn. (Do not add water). Cook for about 5 - 7 minutes. Stir every 2 minutes. Add seasoning and keep stirring until all the corn is well coated. Remove skillet from heat and add the cheese. Stir for about 10 seconds.

Cup Wind Chime

- paper or plastic cup
- hole punch
- string
- cord or twine
- beads
- washers
- markers
- jewels, sequins or stickers

Use the hole punch to punch holes in the bottom of the cup. Cut one 6-inch piece of string for every hole. Thread a string through each hole and tie the string to the cup. Thread some beads onto the string, and then tie a metal washer to the end of the string. Decorate the sides of the cup with markers, jewels, sequins or stickers. Turn the cup upside down. Use scissors to cut an "X" in the bottom of the cup. Feed the cord through the "X" and tie a knot on the inside of the cup. Use the cord to hang the wind chime.
