
2) Giving to a supervisor, or boss, is best done as a group. Gather your fellow employees and decide on a budget for one item and then chip in on something special.

## **Espanola Police Report**

On October 17, 2013 at 12:00 p.m., while in the area of the Espanola High School, an Espanola Police officer observed three males in their late teens smoking Marijuana at the traffic circle on Mead St. When the officer approached the three males, they all identified themselves, and one of the males was found to be bound by both a Probation Order, and a Recognizance of Bail with conditions to keep the peace and be of good behaviour. As a result, 20-year old Darwin Flamand of Webbwood was charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance contrary to section 4(1) of the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act, Failing to Comply with a Recognizance of Bail contrary to section 145(3) of Criminal Code, and Breach of Probation contrary to section 733.1(1) of the Criminal Code of Canada.

He appeared in Bail Court on the October 18, 2013.

The other two males were cautioned for possession of a controlled substance.


On October 22, 2013 at 1:25 p.m., the Espanola Police Service received a call from the superintendent of an apartment building on Barber St., advising that he had located two teenaged males in the laundry room, who were trespassing, and suspected of attempting to break into the coin operated laundry machines.

Upon arrival, police identified the two 16-year old males, and during a search of one of the males, an officer located one-half gram of Marijuana on his person.

As a result, a 16-year old from Espanola who can not be identified pursuant to the provisions of the Youth Criminal Justice Act, was charged with one count of Possession of a Controlled Substance contrary to section 4(1) of the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act. The male was released on an Appearance Notice, and will attend Youth Court in Espanola on the November 19, 2013 to answer to his charge.

On October 29, 2013, while on routine patrol, an Espanola Police Officer observed a 13year old male on Mead St., in the accompaniment of another young person. The officer was aware that the young male was bound by conditions as a result of an Undertaking not to associate with the individual he was with. As the officer had just cautioned the male the previous day for breaching his Undertaking, the officer arrested the male on this date. As a result, the 13-year old male, who cannot be identified under the provisions of the Youth Criminal Justice Act, was arrested and charged with one count of Breach of Undertaking contrary to section 145(3) of the Criminal Code of Canada. He is to appear in Youth Court on the December 3, 2013.

## Recipe

My friend and I decided to adjust the original recipe for Rangoon Dip by adding shrimp and cheddar cheese to it and we think it turned out delicious; a hot, cheesy dip that you would order off a menu at a popular restaurant. It's perfect for upcoming holiday parties or family gatherings. This



parties or family gatherings. This makes a large dip that can be halved easily for a smaller group.

## Crab and Shrimp Rangoon Dip

- 4 green onions, chopped
- 2 (8 ounce) packages cream cheese
- 1 package of imitation crab
- 1 can of cocktail shrimp, drained
- 1 1/2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 1 1/2 cups of shredded cheddar cheese, divided

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Soften the cream cheese in the microwave for about thirty seconds. Add all the other ingredients including ½ cup of cheddar cheese and mix well. Pour dip into an oven-safe casserole dish that you have sprayed with non-stick cooking spray. Top with remaining cheddar cheese. Bake for 30 mins at 350 degrees, or until dip is hot and bubbly. Serve the dip with nacho chips, crackers or pita triangles.

- a small paper plate
- 2 pieces of construction
- paper- one red and one white
- cotton balls
- googly eyes
- glue
- scissors

Start by drawing a large U shape on the white construction paper to make the beard. Use the paper plate as a guide for how wide it should be. Cut out beard. Add glue all over the beard. Make sure to leave an empty space to glue on the mouth. Add the cotton balls to the glue. Cut out a small red mouth out of the red paper. Glue on the mouth where you left space on the beard. Set the beard aside to dry. On the paper plate glue on the eyes and a pom- pom nose. Cut out a hat from the red paper; add glue on the bottom edge and top of the point. Add cotton balls to the hat. Let dry. When the glue is dry; glue the beard and hat onto the plate.
