


> "Ah, that's my superior," replied the detective.

On December 1, 2012, Linda was in a severe car accident that eventually took her life. While in the hospital, Linda required 40 units of blood. Although Linda succumbed to her injuries, the blood she received extended her life and gave her an opportunity to say goodbye to her family.

"Throughout her work and volunteerism, Linda was a shining light" say Robert Creaser, son-in-law of Linda Bujold. "We hope that by recognizing what a special person Linda was, we will also raise awareness for the need for blood and why it is so important that people donate blood".

For this year (2012/13) we need to recruit 89,600 new donors. By 2015, that number will grow to 100,000 new donors annually as the Canadian population ages and some of our loyal donors may be users of blood products.

# Recipe

I make homemade soup often and do it the old school, boil the chicken carcass kind of way, but if you are in a hurry and are craving a hearty dish of chicken soup this is a great substitute. I'm giving you the recipe as I found it which calls for canned



carrots. This keeps preparation time to a minimum but feel free to use fresh carrots if you have the time.

### Homestyle Chicken Noodle Soup (in less than 30 minutes)

- 1/2 of medium onion, chopped
- 2 stalks of celery, diced
- 1 bag of egg noodles (you can use either medium or wide)
- 2 cups of cooked chunk chicken breast
- 1 can of sliced carrots, strained
- Water
- Chicken Bouillon cubes
- Parsley Flakes
- 1 In a large soup pot, saute onion and celery in olive oil until translucent.
- 2. Fill pot 2/3 full with hot water and add bouillon cubes (3 or 4).
- 3. Bring to a rolling boil and add the bag of egg noodles.
- 4. Boil until noodles are tender (approx. 12-15 minutes), and stir occasionally.
- 5. Add carrots and chicken and reduce heat to low. Simmer for 10 more minutes. (Do a quick taste test here and add more seasoning if it needs it.)
- 6. Sprinkle parsley flakes on top and serve. (Don't skip out on the parsley flakes- it really adds to the "homestyle" look of the soup.)


