



Espanola Presents Strategic Plan and Budget

By Chloe Kneer - Espanola Deputy Mayor Jill Beer presented and explained the accepted 2013 budget as well as the strategic plan during a public forum at the Espanola Recreational Complex on June 12. The crowd at this public meeting was noticeably much smaller than the last, which was held in February. Back then, Beer said, "Yes, there will be higher taxes." Her statement was based on the just handed-down decision of the Assessment Review Board to award Domtar's Espanola mill \$4.9 million in back taxes from the years 2008-2012.

At the original meeting, Beer explained that the town had tucked away approximately \$1.7 million in a "rainy day fund" in anticipation of having to pay Domtar retroactively. When questioned at the June 12 meeting, Mayor Lehoux admitted that the money isn't actually on hand, but rather the town had been forgiving Domtar's tax payments over time. He also said that the town. "Has no plan to pay Domtar back. They've offered generous repayment terms, but they won't forgive [the debt]." Beer added, "We don't have the provisions to pay it back." The very next day, Clerk Treasurer-Cynthia Administrator Townsend attended a meeting in Toronto dealing with the issue. She says, "MPAC and the ARB were in attendance at our meeting with the Ministry of Finance and Ministry

Acting as an emotional stimulant, laughter at work in measured doses can't help but increase productivity and longevity of employment. Most employees rate a pleasant and happy work environment higher than a wage increase when listing reasons they like their job.

But you have to be very careful. Humour is perilously subjective. As American humourist Ray Blount Jr. was fond of saying: "A good joke is like a hefty sneeze. If it's any good at all, somebody's going to get some on them."

changed the title because at 89 years of age, she threatened to get a lawyer. We settled out of court. Yet part of that title 'all humour needs a victim' is true.

Choose your victims wisely. One workplace study shows that 70% of jokes told in the workplace mock their coworkers' age, sex or weight. This not only defeats all the benefits of laughter, the real butt of the joke, yours, will find itself in a real bind.

The best victim of humour is always you. Self-deprecating humour, poking fun at yourself is a solid and safe form of humour.

"Sorry about all that waving," said Jerry Seinfeld. "I couldn't control my arms. I shouldn't have been at that meeting. I was just a puppet in there.'

The next best victim is us. All of us. Observational humour that takes all of us to task for our human foibles is safe by inclusiveness.

The biting satirist Mark Twain was funny but inoffensive because he held all humans to the same (low) standard. "Familiarity," said Twain, "breeds contempt ... and children."

Twain's stress-reducer? "When angry, count to four. When very angry swear."

Looking at the state of the world, then and now, no words ring truer than Twain's take on people. "Man is the only animal that blushes. Or has need to."

To get more laughter in your life and humour in your workplace, be creative. Some hospitals in the States have "humour carts" full of everything from rubber chickens to water pistols to remind the sick that fun

Recipe

In honour of Canada Day and the stereotypical notion that Canadians like their beer, here is a delicious way to spruce up onions for beef on a bun or hamburgers using a bottle of your favourite beer. These golden onions cooked to sweetness will add pizzazz to any beef sandwich.



Caramelized Beer Onions

- 2 tbsp (30 mL) butter
- 6 onions, thinly sliced
- 2 tbsp (30 mL) packed brown sugar
- 2 tbsp (30 mL) white balsamic vinegar or white wine vinegar
- $1/4 \operatorname{tsp}(1 \operatorname{mL})$ salt
- 1/4 tsp (1 mL) pepper
- 1 bottle (341 mL) beer, such as lager or ale

In a large skillet, melt butter over medium heat; cook onions, stirring often, until softened, about 10 minutes. Add sugar, vinegar, salt and pepper; cook, stirring, for 3 minutes. Stir in beer and bring to boil; reduce heat to medium and simmer, uncovered and stirring occasionally, until onions are golden and liquid has evaporated, about 30 minutes. Let cool. (Make-ahead: Refrigerate in airtight container for up to 1 week.)

Fireworks Safety To Ensure a Bang Up Time on Canada Day

- 1. Only Use Fireworks Outdoors
- 2. Choose a Clear, Open Area
- 3. Check For Wind: Check wind direction and wind speed: fireworks should be lit with the prevailing wind blowing
- away from spectators and closest dwelling. Don't set off aerial fireworks in strong winds.
- Have Water Nearby: Keep a hose or bucket ready. 4.
- 5. Read All Instructions Carefully
- 6. Use Ground-Based Fireworks on a Hard Surface
- 7. Bury Aerial Fireworks: For aerial fireworks (Roman candles), bury (do not pile) the device to half its length in the ground or in a large pail or box filled with earth or sand.
- Keep Spectators Safe: Keep all spectators at least 20 m away from location where articles are functioned.
- 9. Use Proper Eye Protection and Wear Proper Clothing: Wear safety goggles and non-flammable clothing.
- 10. Keep Children Away From Fireworks
- **11.** Use Care When Handling Fireworks: Prevent dropping them and don't carry fireworks in your pockets. Never smoke while handling fireworks.
- 12. Use Care When Firing Fireworks: Don't throw them at others or bend over them while lighting.
- **13.** Duds or Misfires: Never attempt to re-light fireworks that have misfired (duds). Wait 30 minutes and then place them in a bucket of water.
- 14. Clean-Up After the Show: Wait 30 minutes after the display has finished. Check the firing area for duds, clean up all debris, and check it again the next morning.
