#### **Safe Travels For Easter Long Weekend**

The Easter Holiday Weekend is one of the busiest traffic weekends of the year. Many Ontario residents are travelling to spend the weekend with their friends and families. Post secondary students are also travelling home for the last holiday weekend of the school year. Because of the heavier snowfalls and cooler temperatures this year, skiers, ice fisherman and snowmobilers are also going to be taking advantage of the spring conditions to enjoy the outdoors. #### Recipe

We bake for months in preparation for Christmas and I think we should do the same for Easter. If you ask me, I think it's an acceptable reason to eat sweets. The following recipe is not only simple to make, the spring pastel colours make this a pretty dessert. Use an Easter egg shaped cookie



cutter (or other shaped cookie cutters) or simply cut them into squares. The kids won't be the only ones who love this colourful Easter treat.

#### **Easter Marshmallow Bark**

- 1 bag white chocolate chips (12oz)
- 3 cups mini rainbow marshmallows
- about 1 tbsp shortening (optional, but it really makes the melting process easier)
- Easter sprinkles or pastel sprinkles



Measure out 3 cups of marshmallows. Line an 8x11 glass dish or a smallsized cookie sheet lined with parchment paper. Put white chocolate and shortening in a medium-sized glass bowl. Melt chocolate in the microwave for 1 minute. Stir, and then return to the microwave in 30 second increments, until chocolate melts completely when you stir it. It will take about 2 minutes. Be careful to not overcook it. After chocolate is melted, add the marshmallows and stir to coat. You'll want to do this quickly to be sure the chocolate coats the marshmallows well but doesn't melt the marshmallows. Transfer chocolaty marshmallows to your prepared pan. Using a rubber scraper, make sure marshmallows extend to the edge of the pan. Press down slightly to make it all somewhat even. Shake on any sprinkles you'd like to decorate the bark with. Put in the freezer for about 20 minutes, until chocolate is set. This cools the mixture quickly without melting the marshmallows. Remove from the freezer and let sit on the counter to return to room temperature. Cut into pieces or use Easter cookie cutters. If using metal cookie cutters, spray edges with cookie spray.

#### **Paper Plate Easter Bunny**

- 2 dessert-sized paper plates
- 2 cotton balls
- small pink pompom
- 2 googly eyes
- black marker
- pink crayon
- scissors
- glue
- small piece of scrap cardstock or construction paper (for bow)

Cut one of the paper plates in half and colour in with pink crayon on the inner part of each plate. Glue to back of other plate to form ears. Glue cotton balls and pink pompom to center of plate for muzzle and nose. Glue on eyes. Colour in mouth with pink crayon. Cut out tie shape from cardstock and glue on.


