FIRE DEPT.

Fire Safety Education is a Priority in Sables-Spanish Rivers Township

By Chloe Kneer - While fire prevention and safety week isn't until October, the Sables-Spanish Rivers Township Volunteer Fire Department has been touring area schools to teach about fire safety and doing fire demonstrations this spring.

We caught up with them at Webbwood Public School where the fifty students who attend were treated to many cool activities, like spraying an actual fire hose and seeing a fire extinguisher demo. While there was fun to be had, the message was serious and clear that children should know the basics about fire safety, which includes exiting a home that is on fire if it is safe to do so, calling 9-1-1 in a fire emergency, and never going back into a burning house to save anything, including a family pet. It was a beautiful, sunny Monday morning when all the trucks rolled into the parking lot. There was no trace of the huge amount of snow left from the long winter and conditions were very dry. The area, in fact, had just seen its first

Fire Safety Education is a Priority




Photo: Sables-Spanish Rivers Fire Chief Rodney Houle explains equipment on the new rescue vehicle. Here he shows the students the "jaws."

bush fires over the weekend. "Our fire hazard went from moderate to extreme in about three days," said Fire Chief Rodney Houle. He showed the students the shiny new rescue vehicle and explained all of the equipment contained in the compartments, including "the jaws" which students got to see in action once the presentation went inside to the gym. "For the older students who might know what this means," said Houle, "the jaws have the ability to push at 44,000 pounds per square

inch. They can open anything we want them to." He then explained how the jaws are used to open locked vehicle doors to rescue people from inside cars in an accident.

After seeing the jaws in action, four firefighters suited

up for a mock rescue of "Rescue Randy," a dummy that weighs roughly 185 pounds. The goal of having the firefighters dress in full gear in front of the children is so that they realize there is nothing to be afraid of if they ever encounter a firefighter in an actual emergency. It can be scary to a child to see someone in full gear and breathing with a mask.

The Volunteer Fire Department has gotten help from the Metis Nation of Ontario the past three years. Dale Xilon, Aboriginal Healthy Babies, Healthy Children, and Megan Kant, Community Wellness Director, do questions and answers with the students. "We try to make it interactive and fun so that they remember what we are teaching them," said Xilon.

In addition to their regular practices, fire duties, and the school tours, the fire department has been busy fundraising since last March to purchase a public safety training trailer. Through dances, meat raffles, and draws, 50/50 they have collected about \$12,000 so far towards their goal of \$50,000 to acquire the trailer. The trailer will be another tool for the fire department to use in its education programs. It will also be made available to other fire departments for use. The township has committed helping with funding, but they have yet to state an amount, so the volunteers are asking for as much help as

Recipe

I made this for supper the other night and it was delicious! I prepared everything and let everybody assemble their own salads as they pleased. I heated some tortilla chips in the oven which accompanied the salad perfectly. A quick and easy salad that is perfect for busy days



and hot summer days when you won't want your oven on.

Chicken Fajita Salad

- 1 skinless, boneless chicken breast fillet per person
- Red, yellow and/or green bell peppers cut in strips
- ½ yellow onion, cut in strips
- Sliced mushrooms
- Olive oil
- Fajita seasoning
- Fresh ground black pepper
- Fresh chopped lettuce
- Tomato diced
- Green onions (white and green parts) thinly sliced
- Shredded cheddar cheese
- Ranch dressing (or your favourite dressing)

Slice the chicken into bite-size strips and season with dried fajita seasoning and fresh ground black pepper. Heat oil in a deep skillet and cook chicken until done. It doesn't take long to cook. Remove to a plate and keep warm. Add the peppers, onions and mushrooms to the skillet. Add a little fajita seasoning and pepper to the vegetables. Cook until vegetables are soft and almost done. Return the chicken to the skillet. Mix and keep warm. Serve over a bed of your favorite greens. Top with the diced tomato, green onions, shredded cheese and your favourite dressing.

Kids Korner

Make homemade Chia pets at home. Use any colour sponge or shape to customize your project. The kids will think it's neat that seeds can grow without soil.

Sponge Sprouts

- sponges
- seed packet (lettuce, spinach, and broccoli seeds)
- · water mister
- shallow plate
- marker
- scissors



Trace your shape onto the dry sponge with a marker. Cut out your shape from the sponge. The sponges are easier to cut when wet. Soak the sponge once again; you want it to be damp, but not dripping. Arrange your sponge(s) on a plate. Scatter the seeds (spinach, broccoli and lettuce seeds work well) across the top of the sponge, gently poking them into the holes. Keep the sponge moist by misting with water; it's important to not let the seeds dry out. You can turn a clear plastic container over the plate at night to keep the moisture in. During the day the kids will want to check on the progress, so you can leave the plastic container off. Mist often with a water mister.

In The Loop

We begin this week's article by explaining that our intent is to provide information for those residents unable to attend Council meetings and for those uncomfortable doing so. The ECG covers the Council meetings, reads the agendas, listens intently to what is being discussed and writes about it. This allows you to form your own opinions. In some cases when we believe additional information is needed, we either approach Councillors or file a Freedom of Information request for this material. It is then carefully studied and relevant facts are published in this column and/or on our website. We believe that YOU have the absolute right to know how your tax dollars are used. Previous administrations have not been subject to this degree of transparency, but economic factors have changed, and therefore so has public interest..

At the May 7th Council meeting there was healthy debate on whether or not all avenues had been explored before voting on the third draft of the Budget. Council had requested that the chair of the Police Services Board attend a meeting and answer questions concerning policing expenditures. Despite the fact that this did not happen, 5 of 7 Councillors voted to accept the budget as presented. Councillors McMaster and Meikleham felt it important to wait until after hearing from the PSB chair and voted against passing the budget at this meeting.

FYI: The Executive Summary Overview states, "The average residential property tax bill will increase by approximately 0.76%...". This would equal the 2012 increase in the cost of living. Crossing Guards Stay In Espanola



By Chloe Kneer - Espanola town council approved the meeting Tuesday, against approving budget, Stewart Meikleham Marleen McMaster. Councillor Meikleham, while Development Officer delighted that crossing guards remain fully funded by the town, said, "I could not vote Other cuts include reduced in favour of a budget that hours for staff, resulting in will result in a residential tax increase with service cuts."

The adoption of the new budget changes the town tax rate from .02612 to .0233 (including the educational portion). While the tax rate (the rate the municipality sets to calculate property taxes) has gone down slightly, area Agendas and Minutes.

MPAC assessments have increased by an average of 12% this year, so Espanola rate pavers will be paying more.

Included in the budget was \$25,000 for a service delivery review. The review is expected to help prioritize how the money is being spent. As a percentage of the total, here is how the money is being divided: Recreation

Transportation 18%; 27%; Police – 14%; third draft of the municipal Library and Fire – 3% each; budget at a special budget Administration - 14%; May Health & Social Services -7th. Two councillors voted 13%; Environment – 6%; and the General Inspections -2%.
