





screamed the headline on the promotional sheet. And of course later, five thousand curlers burned it.

However this was before the curling community turned on me, so when the Welland Curling Club invited me to attend the first-ever William Thomas Bonspiel, I was naturally flattered and RSVP'ed "Yes!"

When the lights came up on the rink and a gentleman by the name of Gord Dandy was leading two waddling ducks to a large pen on the ice. I noticed the exact title of the event was the William Thomas Crapshoot Bonspiel. Instead of 32 participating curlers, the club had arranged 32 of my columns face-up in the pen where the ducks were now wandering around. Gord assured me that the ducks had eaten a lot lately. He also said he really liked my columns ... "highly absorbent" were the words he used.

I also noticed that the ducks were corked. Corks with strings attached had been utilized in such a way as to maximize the blast once they were removed in the pen and the ducks hovering over my columns.

I turned to the mayor of Welland who had experience in the dairy business.

"Could you actually do that?"

I asked incredulously. "Cork a duck!?!"

The voluntary tolls that took place at the corner of Highways 6 and 17 in McKerrow and in the town of Espanola are the precursor to the Ontario Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics.

The Ontario Law Enforcement Torch Run is a communitybased, province-wide event that sees the "Flame of Hope" carried across Ontario by members of law enforcement agencies from across the province. The Law Enforcement Torch Run has grown into the most important fund raising effort of Special Olympics programs around the world.

All funds raised through Ontario Law Enforcement Torch Run events are directed into program support that directly affects all community Olympic Special Ontario programs. Funds are then put into community programs and help pay for various expenses including: games travel, accommodations, meals, staff support to the field, grants to



Espanola Police Report

On May 9, 2013 at 12:30 p.m., the Espanola Police Service received a complaint from a local grocery store, regarding a shoplifting incident.

Upon arrival, police were advised that an employee of the grocery store had a female resident of Espanola in custody for Theft Under \$5000.00, for attempting to remove \$70.96 in merchandise from the store. The merchandise consisted of four boxes of Advil pain medication.

During the subsequent search of the female incident to arrest, five half tablets of prescription Oxycocet pills were also located in the female's possession.

As a result of the incident, 20-year old Cecile Trottier of Espanola was charged with a single count of Theft Under \$5000.00, contrary to Section 334(b) of the Criminal Code of Canada, and Possession of a Controlled Substance, contrary to Section 4(1) of the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act. She is to appear in Espanola Court on July 2, 2013, to answer to her charges.

Recipe

I'm always asked if I actually make the recipes I post in my column and the truth is 85% of the time I do. On occasion, I post recipes that have been highly recommended by friends or readers or I put in a recipe that looks delicious and I want to try.



In all honesty, I haven't made this dip yet but I plan on making it this upcoming weekend when I visit my sister and family. The reviews on it were great. Avocados are a favourite of mine. I love them made into guacamole, diced into salads or eaten fresh with a sprinkle of lemon juice and salt. With the avocados, and other traditional Mexican dip ingredients this recipe just has to be good! (I may add a splash of lemon juice to keep the avocado a nice colour)

Creamy Avocado Dip

- 2 avocados; halved, seeded and scooped
- 1 1/2 cups sour cream
- 1 teaspoon cumin
- 1/2 teaspoon hot sauce
- 3/4 cup chunky salsa
- 3/4 cup shredded mild cheddar cheese; divided use
- 3/4 cup chopped tomato; divided use
- salt and pepper to taste
- fresh cilantro for garnish

In a large bowl, mash avocados with a fork or potato masher. In a small bowl, stir together the sour cream, cumin and hot sauce. Fold sour cream mixture and salsa into the mashed avocados. Add in 1/2 cup cheese and 1/2 cup tomato, season with salt and pepper; mix well. Cover mixture; chill 1 hour. Before serving sprinkle remaining cheese and tomatoes over dip. Garnish with cilantro. Serve with chips.

Kids Korner

Robins are one of the first birds to arrive in spring and happily hop along on front lawns searching for a meal of worms. Here's a fun, easy craft to celebrate the arrival of these happy little birds and the nice weather.

Rockin Robin

- Blue cardstock or other stiff paper (cereal box)
- Blue paint and paint brush (if painting)
- Scissors
- Yellow cardstock or construction paper(for beak)
- Brown or your colour choice of cardstock or construction paper (for tail feathers)
- Red and orange tissue paper
- Googly eye
- Glue



Cut a circle out of blue cardstock or a cereal box and paint it blue. Fold your circle in half and press along the crease. Glue crumpled pieces of red or orange tissue paper onto the robin's tummy. Glue a googly eye, and a yellow triangle beak to the bird's face. Cut a few tail feathers from the cardstock or paper and glue onto the bird's behind (feathers can also be used). When you set your robin on a flat surface, and give it a little tap, it will "rock".

Over the course of the last few months we have been providing information to you, the taxpayers of Espanola, about how your tax dollars are used. Some of this information is taken directly from the Freedom of Information requests that have been filed for 2012 and January 2013 and has been placed on our website espanolacitizengroup.ca under TRANSPARENCY as well as published in Around & About.

When we requested the Cheque register for February 2013 we received the following reply, and I quote: "... the Town of Espanola's cheque registry for the period of February 1 to February 28, 2013, access is denied to these cheque registers under section 4(1) of the Act. This provision applies to the records as it is the head's opinion that the request for access is frivolous and vexatious".

The reason for the refusal is based

on an opinion that we argue is not valid. This is public information and the public have every right to it.

We are charged \$7.50 for every 15 min. of research/compilation time and \$0.20/page for xeroxing of the material.

Any information which has been disseminated by us is strictly factual and taken directly from the material received as a result of filing the FOI. We make no assumptions nor do we express any opinions...we simply provide a knowledge base for interested residents on how tax dollars are used.

We have appealed the decision by the Clerk Treasurer/Administrator to the Information and Privacy Commissioner/Ontario and are awaiting a response.

We will inform you of the response once it has been received.
