The drill was called "bring it home" in which I'd hit to an infielder and she would throw to home plate to stop a run from scoring. The first one I hit to Brenda went between her legs and into left field. The second grounder hit her in the shin and the third popped out of her glove. In a real game we'd be behind by three runs, all on errors by the third baseman. That's when I lost it. I walked out to third, relieved Brenda of her glove and told her to sit on the bench nearby. "Watch and learn," I said, as sternly as a fifteen-year-old with acne and clam diggers could. "Penny!" I yelled. "Come!" No not a girl but my super dog Penny, a medium-sized reddish mutt with buck teeth, the result of a collision with a motorcycle. In a flash, Penny was sitting beside the third base bag, panting and smiling and watching my every move.

"Stay!" I ordered returning to home plate where my catcher had her mask up on her head, squinting toward third base.

I hit a sharp grounder toward third that took three hops before it reached the base. Penny jumped straight up in the air, rising twice as high as he was tall and cleanly caught the ball in his mouth. "Bring!" I yelled, and in front of ten disbelieving teenage girls, Penny articulated the routine. He brought it home.

"Now Brenda," I said, using the bat as a pointer, "when you can play that position as well as my dog can, I'll give you your glove back." There was a fair bit of gigging and stifled laughter and not all of it was from the dog. I realize now it was the wrong thing to do and I understand how Brenda must have felt humiliated. I just didn't realize she'd be still bitter about it 50 years later.

Much more mature and wiser now, I'm not saying you shouldn't use household pets to show humans how to perform rudimentary tasks in life. I'm saying do not attend reunions where you can be confronted by these kinds of embarrassing stories. Reunions - no place for old men with a bit of a checkered past.

#### Recipe

I made this cake last week and we ate every last bite. It is moist and delicious. I was tempted to not make the frosting out of laziness but decided to make it and I'm so happy I did. You have to make the icing! It really isn't hard to do, just follow the directions and you



will have a fudgy icing that melts in your mouth and compliments the apples perfectly. I accidentally left the pecans out which I was upset about because I love pecans, but it was still delicious. It was even better as the week went on. Just a heads up, the batter will be thick more like a cookie dough than cake batter.

#### Fresh Apple Cake

- 1 c vegetable oil
- 2 c sugar
- 3 eggs
- 3 c flour
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 c chopped pecans
- 3 c peeled and chopped apples

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease a 9 x 13" pan. Combine oil, sugar, and eggs. Stir in flour and baking soda. Add vanilla, pecans, and apples. Spread in prepared pan and bake for 45-50 minutes. (In my oven it was done in 35 minutes, so please check and not overcook). Cool for 2 hours. Then prepare frosting.

#### **Frosting**

- 1/2 c butter
- 1 c brown sugar, packed
- 1/4 c evaporated milk
- 1/2 tsp vanilla

Boil all ingredients in a small saucepan for 2 minutes, stirring to prevent burning. Set pot in bowl filled with ice water. Beat icing with a wooden spoon until it starts to thicken and is of spreading consistency (the consistency of frosting). Spread over top of cake.

#### Bingo Dabber Poppy

- Black (or any colour) construction paper
- White paper
- Red & green bingo dabber
- Scissors
- Glue



Draw a large poppy shape on the white paper. Using the green bingo dabber, make a circle in the middle to be the center of the poppy. Using the red bingo dabber fill in the rest of the poppy. Cut out the flower. If the child has gone outside the lines, you can cut along the original lines to keep the poppy shape. Allow to dry. Glue the poppy to the background piece of paper. Hang proudly as a gesture and in honour of all our veterans and Canadian soldiers.

#### In The Loop

There were no Council or Committee meetings held last week so The Espanola Citizen Group will take this opportunity to update you on several fronts:

- The Service Delivery Review was budgeted for last spring and became an integral part of Espanola's Strategic Plan but has still not been approved by Council.
- A Code of Conduct for Councillors distributed in August 2012 for Council to read and then vote on never was brought back for discussion.
- At the time of writing this, no news whether the Province will assist with the funding for the Hwy 6 culvert.
- To the best of our knowledge, the Domtar appeal has not yet been resolved.

- The Rivermen have been a welcome addition to Espanola.... attendance has been excellent.
- Espanola Ski Hill members have raised enough funds to operate independently this winter.

Looks as if we may have to get the shovels out early this year.
