A few years after I moved here to Sunset Bay in Wainfleet, Kelly Beck was seven years old with long, blonde hair and shy, hazel eyes. This kid could sell exercise bikes to dead people.

It's not so much what she was selling, because quite often Kelly wasn't really sure. In fact, for a while Kelly had an older girl working with her door-to-door. This was before Kelly could talk. When Kelly was old enough to talk she told me the older girl's name was District Sales Manager and she had had her fired.

Kelly affectionately referred to her house as The Home Office, her brothers and sisters as Account Executives and the yellow school bus as the Company Car. Kelly was so smooth she didn't even bring the product around with her anymore. She carried an order form headed "Ja Want Sum?" and a pen. That was it. A great sales person as Kelly used to say, doesn't need product – "Thell the Thizzle, not the thsteak!"

I know I was her best customer. Even if I had been her only customer, Kelly Beck would have made more in commissions

back then than the guy with exclusive sales rights to cell phones in Mississauga. Kelly's key to success was not the product, but the pitch. Her weak, almost inaudible knock at the door said: "I'm embarrassed to be here and I'm sorry to bother you, but two slathering rottweilers and a hailstorm aren't going to move me away from this door so get out here, I don't have all day."

Once the door was opened, you were done. Kelly would shift from one foot to the other, lock those pretty-please eyes on you, thrust the pen and paper toward you and without mentioning what she was selling she would say: "Ja want sum?"

The cloth for all intents and purposes, had been cut. The choice was clear: sign or be guilty of cruelty to second graders working their way through Wainfleet South Elementary School.

It was easier to say "no" to Revenue Canada than to Kelly Beck, the Mary Kay of Sunset Bay. You sign.

I had jars full of Girl Guide cookies, a fridge full of cheese, enough tickets of chance to warrant a gaming licence and so many magnetic note pads on my fridge, my lawnmower kept trying to get into the house.

I sponsored Kelly Beck in so many Walk-A-Thons, Swim-A-Thons, Bowl-A-Thons, Bike-A-Thons, Stand-A-Thons, Sleep-Over-A-Thons and Whistle-While-You-Work-A-Thons that she should have legally had her name



Espanola and Area Family Health Team: Helping You Manage Chronic Pain

The workshop is part of the Chronic Disease Management series. In 2011, the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care began to fund self-management programs in the province of Ontario as part of the Ontario Diabetes Strategy. With an aging population in Ontario, many individuals in the province have at least one chronic illness (i.e. an illness that has no cure, such as diabetes, heart disease, or obesity).

Two main programs have been rolled out in the region: the Chronic Disease Selfmanagement Program (CDSMP) and the Chronic Pain Self-management Program Your Espanola (CPSMP). and Area Family Health Team runs both. Each of these is a six-week workshop designed to provide participants with disease and wellness education, personal goal setting and action planning, problem solving and decision making skills, as well as how to effectively available community resources. The workshops are interactive with weekly goal setting and modules following standardized topics example, exercise, working with your health provider, and fatigue). They are led by trained peer leaders. Peer leaders can either be health care professionals from the community community, or volunteers that have been affected by illness themselves. Workshops are free and are open to those with a chronic illness, their family members or those at risk of developing an illness due to family history. 
Espanola Rivermen Junior A Hockey Update

Rainbow Concerts Presents Andy Lowe

By Heather Wilson - What kind of guitar do you use to round up a herd of cattle in Northern Scotland? Acoustic (insert Scottish accent here.) This was the kind of fun the small but lively audience was treated to on Tuesday, October 1 at the Royal Canadian Legion when North Sea Gas visited from Edinburgh, Scotland. trio delivered an eclectic mix of traditional Celtic songs and contemporary tunes to the delight of the toe-tapping audience.

The evening started off with the music of Andy Lowe, a Sudbury based folk singer who was the perfect fit as an opening act as his music has definite Celtic influences based in the tradition of storytelling. Although the musical style was not the same, his songs told tales not unlike Stompin' Tom Connors and Gordan Lightfoot. But Lowe's music

is particular to Northern Ontario with one song about the Lively truck explosion of 1998, and coming to live in the region for the love of a "Northern Ontario Girl." Lowe's voice is so smooth that it's possible just to enjoy the sound of the voice but then listeners can get caught up in the tales that are being told as well. He performs regularly in the region and if you missed this concert, plan to come out to the Espanola Curling Club on October 18 to see him again.

Following Lowe's performance, the three members of North Sea Gas took to the stage. The band is headed by Dave Gilfillan who founded the band thirty vears ago and he is joined by Ronnie McDonald and Grant Simpson. These men are truly talented musicians as Gilfillan expertly laid down one instrument and picked up another numerous times during one song to the delight of all in attendance. While all members could play the guitar, banjo, mandolin, bouzouki only Simpson was quite at home and in his element playing the fiddle. This young man moved from reel to jig to love song with ease. McDonald moves his hands over his mandolin so fast at times it seems a chore but the man never stops smiling as he enjoys the music so much.

The songs told stories about Scottish history and as Gilfillan said, "this one is about gathering the clans to go and fight the English, it's what a lot of our songs are about," to which McDonald chipped in "it's a good day out." Calling Doon the Line tells the true story of how pipers were used during the First World War to send messages down the lines of the trenches. When they said the next song was about the

proud tradition of the Black Watch in Scotland, Espanola resident, Peter Hunter (a.k.a Scotty) reminded that this particular regiment also has a proud tradition in Canada. The evening finished off with Tak a Dram Afore Ye Go as this is the traditional Scottish way of ending a night This was the fourth out. Canadian stop for the band on this trip and the band was heading to North Hampton, Massachusetts. When asked what a highlight is of their long career, Simpson said that recently one of their concerts was filmed in Scotland, then shown to 800 million people on Chinese state television. He said that if he had known it would be seen by so many people, he would have made more of an effort. Make no mistake, this is a professional trio and Espanola was lucky to have them visit, one can only hope that they promised to return again.



In The Loop

The Service Delivery Review was one of the main items discussed at the Oct. 8 Council meeting. The attention centered on which departments should be reviewed and costs. Council was informed that they do not have the authority to include Police Services in a Service Delivery Review without the consent of the Espanola Police Service Therefore Police Board. Services will not be included unless Council requests that this is included and the Police Services Espanola Board agrees.

The same holds true for the Library Board, but permission has been granted by them to be included in such a review.

Tenders for a Fire Department Service Review will be issued to separate firms which would have more expertise in this area. Council was advised by the Clerk Treasurer/ Administrator that the Office of the Fire Marshall no longer supports the Master Fire Plan process for Espanola.

Discussion then focused on the cost and the necessity for these reviews. Tenders will be issued and once they are received, Council will decide on whether or not to proceed with a service delivery review.

In closing, the Espanola Police Services Official Plan was approved by Council during this meeting .The Budget forecast shows an increase in planned expenditures of \$149,703. Forecasted revenues see a decrease of \$124,072 and Capital Operations are forecasted to cost \$150,000 over the 2013-2015 period.

Recipe

Wondering what to do with all the leftover turkey from Thanksgiving? If you are tired of sandwiches and soup, here is another solution; A lazy, but tasty version of the classic turkey pot pie.



Leftover Turkey Pot Pie Casserole

- 1 can of cream of mushroom soup, undiluted
- 5 oz of evaporated milk (half and half cream or milk can also be used)
- 1 tbsp dried parsley or ½ cup of fresh parsley
- $1/4 \frac{1}{2}$ tsp dried thyme
- 3 cups of cooked turkey- cubed
- 10 oz frozen mixed vegetables
- ½ tsp salt and pepper
- 1 package of Stove Top Stuffing

Combine soup, milk, parsley and thyme. Stir in turkey, vegetables, salt and pepper. Spoon into a small greased casserole dish. Prepare stuffing as per instructions on box and put on top of casserole. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Bake uncovered for crunchy stuffing or covered for moist.

Halloween Mason Jar Lanterns

- Mason jar
- Tissue paper in desired colour
- Black construction paper
- Modge Podge or make your own $(1/2 \text{ white glue}, \frac{1}{2} \text{ water and mix well})$
- Glue
- Paintbrush
- Scissors
- Tea light
- Halloween-themed ribbon (optional)

Cut tissue paper into strips. Paint Modge Podge on in small sections to the outside of the jar using the paintbrush. Apply strips of tissue paper. Seal tissue paper on by covering it with more Modge Podge. Continue covering the whole jar. Let dry. Draw and cut out a 'monster face" out of the black construction paper. Glue face onto the outside of the tissue-papered jar. Glue a Halloween themed ribbon around the jar ring and screw onto jar (optional). Do not use the lid if using as a lantern. Drop a tea light into the jar and you have a Halloween Lantern. You can also fill up the jar with treats, seal the top and give as a Halloween gift.
