By *Chloe Kneer* – Autism Awareness Day was April 2 and ASD and EPS students from AB Ellis Public School attended the Espanola Municipal Office to help Mayor Mike Lehoux raise the Autism Ontario flag. The flag will fly the entire month of April in order to create awareness about Autism Spectrum Disorder, which is now reported to affect 1 in 48 children. Autism affects the way the brain functions, resulting in the difficulties with communication and social interaction, and unusual patterns of behaviour, activities, and interests. The term “spectrum” refers to the severity or developmental impairment.

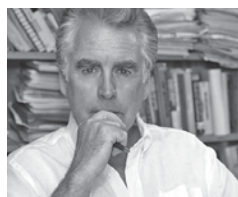

The Great Comeback Quip - Leave It To The Pros

Every time a late night talk show makes the headlines - "Leno Gone! Letterman To Follow!" - the inevitable comparison to the late Johnny Carson crops up. And there is no comparison because Carson was the master of the late night microphone, better than Steve Allen and Jack Parr before him, much better than all the pretenders since.

Whereas the others trip over their tongues and interrupt their guests in the rush to deliver a funny line, Carson was a good listener. When the comic opportunity arose he'd process it and wait before launching the laugh missile. He rarely missed.

Carson's most famous quip came when actor Ed Ames did miss while giving the host a tomahawk-throwing lesson. "This is how you take care of an enemy," boasted Ames as he flung his weapon at the human figure outlined in chalk on a wooden board. Instead of the heart, Ames imbedded the tomahawk in the man's crotch. Embarrassed the actor went to retrieve the small axe from the man's wedding tackle when Carson grabbed him and held him back. And they waited, first to allow the audience to laugh themselves silly and then to settle down. That's when Johnny Carson delivered the line that resulted in one of the largest laughs in television history: "Gee, Ed, I didn't even know you were Jewish." Once that wave of hysterics finally died down, the flustered tomahawk teacher asked the host if he wanted to give it a try. Said Carson a little sadly, "No. I can't hurt him anymore than you did."

Delivering that one great line has become comedy's highlight art form. Quick,

ruthless and on the money. Jay Leno asking a chastened Hugh Grant: "What the hell were you thinking?!?"

Jack Parr's greatest line came courtesy of Dick Cavett, an NBC writer dying to join the Tonight Show team. As the story goes, they were in the elevator when Parr mentioned he was stumped as to how to introduce that night's guest the overwhelmingly voluptuous Jane Mansfield. Cavett said he had a pretty good idea. Jack Parr introduced Jane Mansfield with the now famous five words: "Here they are, Jane Mansfield!" And Dick Cavett got a new job.

Normally drunkenness dulls a sharp mind, landing the comeback line with a thud. Usually, but not always. American humorist Robert Benchley was leaving New York's Algonquin Hotel after a liquid lunch, still carousing with friends and not paying much attention to anything else. Spotting what he thought was the uniformed doorman he said: "My good man, would you please call me a taxi?" Hugely offended, the man shot back: "I am not a doorman. I happen to be a rear admiral in the United States Navy!" To which Benchley immediately replied: "Alright then, get me a battleship."

Fellow member of the Algonquin Round Table, Marc Connelly was as quick as Benchley, Dorothy Parker, Harpo Marx and the other well-known wits. Going for a cheap laugh, a man came up behind Connelly at a dinner party, patted the playwright's bald head and said: "Marc, your head feels as smooth as my wife's ass." When the laughter subsided, Connelly

Espanola Rivermen Join Newly Formed Canadian International Hockey League

The Canadian International Hockey League (CIHL) wishes to officially announce the formation of a new independent Tier II Junior 'A' Hockey League.

The CIHL will begin operations effective the upcoming 2014-2015 season as an independent junior hockey league while making its application to be officially sanctioned this June by the Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) to play for an International Championship each season under the USA-United Hockey Union (UHU) umbrella.

The announcement was made by Tim Clayden, who is the Canadian International Amateur Hockey Federation President and Chairman of the Board.

Clayden is also President and Director of Operations of the Espanola Rivermen, formerly of the Northern Ontario Junior Hockey League, now of the CIHL.

Effective the 2014-2015 campaign, the CIHL will feature 8 -10 teams located along Trans-Canada Highway 17 and Highway 400 corridors.

The CIHL will place an emphasis on student-athlete, junior hockey player advancement, to the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) and Canadian Intercollegiate Sport university levels of play, that combines hockey and education as well as also providing the development of 16-17 year old junior hockey players to the higher levels of play within the Canadian Hockey League and U.S. hockey leagues.

"We plan to implement much of the NCAA rule book and instill standards that the NCAA abides by," said Clayden. "By ensuring our players are playing under NCAA rules and regulations and holding them to the same standard that the NCAA does, we will better set up all CIHL student-athlete players for success in their future university level of play."

Under the CIHL draft constitution, the league will include unlimited Canadians, with as many as 15 American and or European import players.

"The CIHL will be a Tier II junior hockey league that is made up of

global student-athlete junior hockey players," added Clayden.

Clayden continued, "Some are making arm-chair comments about the level of play within the CIHL next year, well, we have been doing this a long time and do not expect our team or others to be any less competitive than we have been this season or any other for that matter."

"Frankly, I believe the CIHL will provide much-needed and better student-athlete player development and exposure to the NCAA, and that includes all players, globally and especially Canadian and Ontario kids as NCAA, CIS, CHL and USA development and promotion forms the entire premise of the CIHL-on-ice business model.

"We want Americans and Europeans to feel comfortable coming to the CIHL," added Clayden. "Our member clubs will look also to play interlocking games with leagues south of the border and a trip to Europe is already being planned. In the works is a pre-season College Showcase Weekend held mid-September in the Upper Michigan Peninsula to help ensure that our student-athlete players get on the NCAA radar at the very beginning of each season with a second College Showcase held in Canada mid-season each year."

Franchise ownerships from the Ontario towns of Bracebridge, Collingwood, Espanola, Colborne, Milton, Toronto and Sudbury have confirmed intent to become inaugural members of the CIHL for the 2014-2015 season, beginning in September.

To be sure, the CIHL plans to kick off their 2014-2015 season with a College Showcase Tournament held mid-September in Traverse City, Michigan, in order to help ensure CIHL student-athlete players get on the NCAA radar early and prior to the commencement of the 2014 - 2015 CIHL season.

Raising the Flag on Autism Awareness



Some of the characteristics of autism include: Difficulty with social skills – some people with ASD show no interest in people, while others might be interested but do not know how to talk, play with or relate to them; Problems with communication – speech and language skills may develop, but then be lost or develop slowly. They also may not be able to interpret non-verbal communication; Repeated behaviours and restricted interests – they may have repeated ritualistic actions such as spinning, rocking, staring, finger flapping, or hitting themselves; Unusual response s to sensations – sensory input may be scrambled and overwhelming

for those with ASD; Some co-occurring conditions – anxiety and depression, neurological disorders such as epilepsy and others.

ASD is diagnosed through a series of different measures, including observation and testing by a team of doctors and other professionals. Most often, parents and caregivers are the first to notice symptoms. There are many treatment options available and contacting organizations such as the Autism Society of Canada or Autism Ontario (www.autismontario.com).

If you suspect your young child may be on the Autism Spectrum, early intervention is most helpful.

Recipe

Easter is tied with Thanksgiving as my favourite holiday. I love that its spring and time for new beginnings and that we get to come together and feast on delicious food. There is little stress with Easter preparation as compared to Christmas. Also, all the chocolate, I can't forget the chocolate! The following is a fun recipe to make with the kids or not with the kids. I'm going to make a batch to have for Easter weekend all by myself! These are much less messier and a lot less work than making chocolate pretzels and by adding the pastel coloured M&M's that are available right now for Easter, it makes them festive for the holiday. Enjoy your Easter weekend everyone.



Chocolate Pretzel Bites

- Waffle-shaped pretzels
 - Milk chocolate Hershey's Kisses or Rolos
 - M&M's candy in your preferred variety.
- Milk chocolate with peanuts are a favorite combination.



Heat the oven to 175° F. Set a number of bite-size, waffle-shaped pretzels (one for each treat) in a single layer on a cookie sheet, then top each pretzel with an unwrapped Hershey's Kiss or a Rolo. Bake for 5 minutes, until the chocolates are soft when touched with a wooden spoon. Remove the cookie sheet from the oven and quickly press an M&M's candy into the center of each Kiss. Allow the treats to cool thoroughly before storing.

Kids Korner

Bunny Mask

- 2 paper plates
- pink construction paper
- cotton-balls
- scissors
- elastic
- glue
- stapler



Cut a hole out of the center of one plate the size of your child's face. Cut the other plate in half and then cut out 2 bunny-ears. Cut 2 smaller ear shapes out of the pink paper and glue them to the center of the larger ears. Then staple the ears and the elastic band onto the front of the plate, with the smooth part of the staple on the back of the mask and the sharp side on the front of the mask (you don't want the sharp side against your child's face). Put glue around the outside border of the plate and glue cotton balls around (being sure to cover up the staples). Once the glue dries it is ready to be worn.

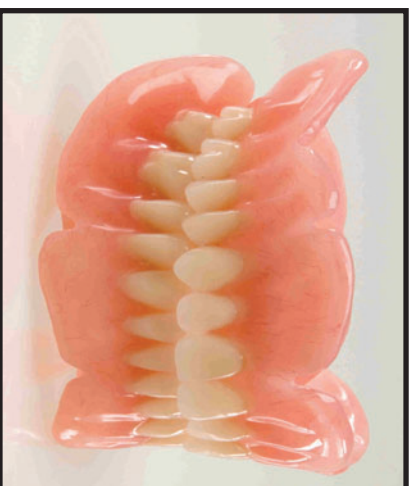
