Policing & Public Works **Costs Discussed at Town Hall Meeting**



By Chloe Kneer - The Espanola Citizen Group (ECG) held a "town hall" style meeting last week, with long-time resident Bill Foster presenting updated findings regarding contracting with the OPP versus maintaining the Espanola Police Service. Last year, Foster conducted his own five-month study on policing costs and detailed how a switch to the OPP could save the town millions over the next several years. the ECG meeting last Wednesday evening, Foster explained that a new OPP costing model for 2015, which will likely be unveiled this summer, along with changes to the amount that municipal police services receive in grants, will almost certainly lead to even bigger cost savings.

Me And The Belmont Hotel - We Have History Together

It's been exactly 25 years since I mark up mysteriously showed up at published my first book: The Tabloid Zone - Dancing With The Four-Armed Man, a badly-titled collection of columns that had appeared in the Hamilton Spectator.

The day after the books rolled off the printing press, my publisher called. "We're going on the book tour," announced Gordon Green with the confidence of a general going into battle. I thought - Vancouver in the fall! Great! Actually Gordon's brilliant marketing idea was to do a couple of book signings at two of my favourite haunts, namely the Dain City Hotel in the village of my youth and Port Colborne's Belmont Hotel in the town of my ill spent adulthood. As the press releases and posters promised, I showed up at "The Dainer" for my late afternoon book signing on a Saturday in May and there were a lot of people there. Many I remembered from the days I lived in the hamlet on the Welland Canal.

Once the table was set up and nobody approached it, I realized that those people were not there for the signing. Those people were always at "The Dainer" late on a Saturday afternoon.

Wayne the bartender, seizing a business opportunity agreed to buy 60 books at half price which I dutifully autographed on the spot. These two boxes of books which he was suppose to resell at 100%

Gordon's office in Hamilton two weeks later with an unpaid invoice and one copy missing.

"Things 'll be better tonight at The Belmont," Gordon assured. "That's the big one!"

He was right in the sense that when we arrived at Port Colborne's infamous watering hole, the place was packed ... for "Bob The D.J." Gordon set up the signing table in the next room and briefed Bob on how to introduce me. Bob, coming from an afternoon DJ gig at another hotel was dead drunk. Bob who I have said hello to for about ten years or more could not remember my name.

With two other guys at the bar named Bob, I suggested that we just get another Bob. Gordon talked to the boys but they declined declaring "Bob The DJ" as the one with "the gift of gab."

Gordon presented Bob with a copy of The Tabloid Zone and told him all he had to do was read the title, say "Here he is!" and read the name at the bottom. Mine. Unfortunately Bob didn't have reading glasses and when Gordon asked if he'd forgotten them, maybe in his coat pocket the man says no, he does need reading glasses but he also doesn't own a pair.

Policing & Public Works: Foster Says Espanola Could Save Well Over \$2 Million Per Year

Foster projects the new formula will probably result in OPP costs of close to \$400 per household with no reduction in the number of uniformed officers. The cost for Espanola Police Service (EPS) is projected to be \$1076 per household. The huge savings with the OPP, he says, are the lower administrative fees, not officers' salaries. Foster concluded Espanola could save over \$1.6 million per year with an OPP contract.

Current Espanola Council promised residents an external service delivery review after last year's announcement that the town was on the hook for repaying Domtar \$4 million when the mill was reassessed at a significantly reduced value. Despite the cost of such a review being included in the budget for

this year, council voted down the measure and no review has been carried out. external service review looks at each department's budget and services to determine if taxpayers are getting good Many value for money. suspect that good value for money is not something that is on the minds of the current Espanola council. Foster is one, so he conducted his own review of the Espanola Public Works Department (PW) and presented those at the town hall meeting as well. findings raised more than a few eyebrows.

During his presentation, Foster noted that he targeted two areas specifically that fall under PW: transportation or paved road maintenance and winter control costs. Foster then compared Espanola's costs per km in both of those

categories to sixteen other communities. For paved road maintenance, Espanola is spending a staggering \$19,898 per km. The average of the communities was \$11,384 per km. Foster concluded that over \$1 million stands to be saved on paved road maintenance if efficiencies were found. "These communities are doing something that really improves the cost effectiveness of their operations," says Foster. "Espanola can likely learn a lot from them."

As far as winter costs, Espanola fares well compared to the other sixteen municipalities with a \$1389 per km cost versus the group average of \$1574 per km.

In his summary, Foster pointed out that between these two departments alone (policing and public works), well over \$2 million could be saved by Espanola taxpayers. The lower costs could translate into a 20% property tax decrease for residents, rather than the increase of 1% that's currently a result of the 2014 budget.

In The Loop

Since my April 1st In the Loop article originally appeared in the Around & About, I choose to respond here to certain statements Cynthia Townsend, clerk treasurer/administrator took issue with in her letter to the editor of another publication. Ms. Townsend implied that I made three (3) false statements. That definitely was not my intent.

In the first paragraph on April 1st I wrote, "The Regular Meeting of Council held no surprises for those who attend regularly. The 2014 budget was approved with virtually no discussion. The tax increase for this year will be minimal." This comment specifically related to the March 25, 2014, Regular Meeting of Council. Ms. Townsend, however, did not include the first sentence of this paragraph in her letter. In doing so she attempted to change what I was trying to say.

The second item that she identifies as false is my statement that, "The 2013 Federal Gas Tax Funding is now being used in the 2014 budget to help decrease the impact of the Hwy 6 culvert."

Her reason for calling this false is, "These gas tax funds were identified in the 2013 budget for this project, as the project did not proceed as originally planned, these funds were placed in a reserve fund as required through our funding agreement. These funds will be held until they are required for this project or another project is identified that meets the funding parameters of this agreement." Ms. Townsend may explain it differently, but our message is the same.

Finally, Ms. Townsend states my saying, "It should be noted residents have also unknowingly been paying higher residential taxes for some years to help offset the Domtar repayment. Council should have been aware of this and if so deemed it unnecessary to inform Espanola taxpayers" is false.

She indicates that these amounts have been included as budgetary items since 2010. I must be the only one in town who didn't realize that I had been paying higher taxes for years in order to offset a Domtar re-payment. I guess one must examine the budget line-by-line to find these things out. Budgets are available for residents to purchase for \$5.00.

In closing, since Ms. Townsend mentioned that I attended all four of the 2014 Special Budget Meetings of Council, I will provide a summary in next week's In The Loop.

Recipe

Apple Pie Smoothie Recipe

Serves 2

- 1 cup unsweetened almond milk
- 1 cup unsweetened applesauce
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 2 Tbsp maple syrup
- 1 cup ice cubes

Place all ingredients in a blender and purée until smooth, 30 to 60 seconds.

Espanola Mill Odour Reduction Efforts

Spring is finally here and we thought this would be a good opportunity to provide an update about our on-going efforts to reduce odour.

Recently we have been focused on reducing odour coming from our effluent treatment system. The effluent treatment system organically treats the mill's waste water or effluent before it is returned to the river. The effluent discharged to the river is non-toxic and is significantly below both federal and provincial discharge requirements. The effluent, however does emit odour which typically worsens during the summer months due to higher temperatures.

We have been working diligently to reduce odour coming from the mill's effluent treatment system. Some of the steps we have taken include:

- improving the reliability of the mill overall which reduces the variation in the effluent introduced to the treatment system
- installing 6 additional aerators in the effluent treatment system over the winter which will help improve performance
- completing a promising trial of odour reducing agents. Over the upcoming warmer months we will be adding the agent to the effluent treatment system.

In addition, as part of our regular maintenance work, dredging activities are currently underway at the effluent treatment system remove accumulated material. During the dredging process odour may escape and we are using odour-reducing agents to minimize this.

Over the summer, we plan to assess the odour reduction improvements made over the past year to determine their success, and identify further opportunities for improvement.
