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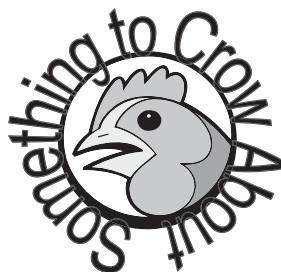

As love notes go, it wasn't exactly the words of Ludwig van Beethoven "Oh, go on loving me - never doubt the faithfulness of heart. Of your beloved. Ever thine. Ever mine. Ever ours." It wasn't even close to President Ronald Reagan's mushy missive to his beloved Nancy: "I more than love you, I'm not whole without you. You are life itself. When you're gone, I'm waiting for you to return so I can start living again." And it wasn't as well crafted as the first love letter kicked out by a computer: "My lust tempts your fond ardour. Sadly, "Cell phone not working" in today's world is a real tragedy. Unable to "selfie" herself, the useless cell phone could provoke suicide making Muffin every bit a tragic Shakespearean figure as Macbeth. The only difference is Muffin is apparently sleeping with Brad, not her mother.

"Come sleep over." The line drips of Frank Sinatra's erotic invitation to love. "Come fly with me, let's fly, let's fly away." But it's gotta be a real short flight because ...

"Kids with their Dad tonight." Okay so this is not the story of Ozzie & Harriet. It's more like Stud & Muffin which would make an excellent name for a Stag & Doe party. Yet, Muffin's separation sounds rather amiable unless the kids are real hell raisers and the night at Dad's is more like Night Of The Living Dead with the father preferring the company of zombies to his own offspring.

For the movie, I'm thinking Brad Pitt as Brad, Jennifer Lawrence as Muffin and Phil and Sal Fondacaro, Hollywood's most famous dwarf twins as the kids. Bill Murray would be Dad.

The film opens with Brad, a grinning, beer-swilling hunk watching an afternoon Jays game on TV while constantly looking at his cell phone for the booty call that will never come. Outside, next to his shiny Camero a stranger picks up a note that has been separated from the windshield wiper blade by a slight breeze. Upon further inspection, the audience learns that this is not just any stranger but one in desperate need of a column idea and three hours from deadline.

Meanwhile in a three-bedroom clapboard in nearby Humberstone where people still believe An Officer And A Gentleman

At the same time in an apartment above the City Hotel, wearing a helmet and hockey gear, Dad has locked himself in the bathroom where he alternates between stabbing pins into his Brad Pitt doll and speed-dialing Muffin who forgot to drop off the box of chocolates that are laced with Demerol to knock the little buggers out cold. But her cell phone is not working. And he can't drive to her apartment because the twins have jammed the fridge and stove against the bathroom door. As he screams for help from neighbours, the children proceed to drop potted plants and small appliances on people walking on the sidewalk below the living room window.

Phil laughs hysterically as Sal opens his mouth to reveal the tiny B-disc battery from their mother's cell phone, this while they're using skewers to spear fish for snowflake eels in Dad's aquarium. They stop long enough to sing the movie's theme song Brad Pitt Won't Get Lucky Tonight.

With the boys using his La-Z-Boy recliner as a trampoline and the cat imbedded in the living

room ceiling, Dad jumps out the bathroom window into the dumpster below. He's done this before when bad dates ended up staying the night. He drives his rusted-out beater to the house he still owns but can't live in, fully expecting to interrupt his ex-wife bench pressing a new boyfriend on the kitchen table but no, she's alone and crying. She's never been without her cell phone before.

He fixes her cell phone, she fixes him dinner and together, they sing: "If you like pina coladas and getting caught in the rain. If you're not into yoga, if you have half a brain." They take a selfie of themselves and while Muffin goes to get more chocolates, Dad sends the photo to Brad. No, Brad will most definitely not - "What about the boys?!" "It's alright, they'll be in custody by now." - get lucky tonight.

For the lack of a cell phone, the note was written. For the loss of the note, the boyfriend was abandoned. For the unruliness of the children, the parents were reconciled. For poor superstition, a school of fish died. Selfie Love - the movie - A Multi-Malfunctioning Thing.

Espanola Police Report

Paul McColeman, a 42-year old Espanola man, who is facing 41 charges in relation to a variety of sexually related offences involving Luring Children, had his bail hearing in Sudbury Court on Tuesday August 12. McColeman, who has been in custody since his arrest on July 10, 2014, was released on bail with strict conditions that he must abide by as terms of his release. His next court appearance is in Espanola Court on September 2, 2014.

In June 2014, the Espanola Police Service began investigating allegations involving Sexual acts against boys ages 12 to 17 years old, which involved the use of social media. As a result of the investigation, police have identified 12 victims whom McColeman was alleged to have lured or attempted to lure into performing sexual acts in return for alcohol, drugs or money.

It is alleged that since 2006, McColeman has used aliases to lure children on Facebook, and MSN Messenger, under the names Treber Boucher, Jennifer Johnston, and Hyperchick.

The investigation is ongoing, and police are asking anyone who may have information about this case, or whose children may have been contacted by "Treber Boucher," "Jennifer Johnston" or "Hyperchick," or may have come in contact with Paul McColeman, to call the Espanola Police Service at 705-869-3251.

OPP Police Beat

The Manitoulin Ontario Provincial Police (OPP), under the direction of the OPP Criminal Investigation Branch, Detective Inspector Colleen McCormick, continues to investigate a series of fires which have occurred in Little Current in recent months, with the latest being on Thursday, August 7, 2014. Shortly before 7:00 p.m., officers responded to a fire on Campbell Street West, in Little Current.

NEMI Fire Department was already on scene when police arrived. The building known as the Old Curling Club became fully engulfed by fire and spread to the adjacent building, Old Church. Residents in the surrounding area were evacuated and no injuries were sustained. Both buildings were completely destroyed by fire and as a result, investigators from the Ontario Fire Marshall's office were called in to assist NEMI Fire Department and OPP in their investigation.

On Sunday August 10, 2014, OPP arrested an adult male in connection with the recent arsons. Clinton Gordon Haggart, age 30, of Little Current, Ontario has been charged with seven counts of arson contrary to the Criminal Code. He appeared in bail court in Gore Bay on Monday, August 11, 2014.

Recipe

This dish is really easy to put together, and it is packed with flavor. This would make a great freezer meal or a meal to deliver to a friend or loved one. Instead of simmering and reducing the sauce, combined the cheese and fresh uncooked tortellini, and let the entire mixture bake in the oven. Just be sure to keep it tightly covered with foil so it stays moist. The foil keeps the moisture in and cooks the tortellini as it bakes.



Baked Tortellini Casserole

Yield: 8-10 servings

- 2 tablespoons of olive oil
- 1 pound of lean ground beef
- Small yellow onion, diced
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 28 oz can of crushed tomatoes, or whole peeled tomatoes crushed by hand
- 1 8 oz can of tomato sauce
- 1 teaspoon of kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper to taste
- 1 24 oz package of fresh cheese tortellini
- 3 cups of freshly grated mozzarella cheese

Sautee onions and garlic in olive oil, until soft. Add ground beef and season with salt and pepper. Once beef is cooked through, stir in tomatoes and tomato sauce. Stir in uncooked, fresh tortellini and 1 1/2 cups of mozzarella cheese. Transfer to casserole dish and sprinkle remaining cheese over the top. Cover tightly with foil and baked at 350 degrees for about 30 minutes.

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Espanola Girl Seeking Community's Generosity

Jolene Courtemanche was adopted by the Courtemanche family in Espanola when she was very young despite her prognosis for life expectancy not being very good. A good portion of her childhood was spent shuttling between home and Sick Kids Hospital in Toronto. Even though things often seemed grim for Jolene, her adoptive parents never gave up hope.

One can only imagine the medical and other costs the Courtemanche family has incurred over the years. Jolene's parents are retired, but are still paying off significant bills related to their daughter's care. They are hardly in a position to be able to afford a new wheelchair accessible van, even though the one they are currently using to transport

Jolene to medical appointments and on other outings is not repairable and in bad shape. Jolene has taken it upon herself to find a way to raise the over \$45,000 needed to replace the old van. "I have applied to the generous service groups in my community and surrounding area for assistance," she says. "I'm hoping other big-hearted generous people will help me raise the remaining money."

At press time, Jolene's website www.gofundme.com/help-jolene is just over \$4000 out of \$25,000 that remains to be raised. Cpl. Arnold bravely served his country for 14 years during which he deployed to Bosnia-Herzegovina, as a member of DART in Sri Lanka and one previous deployment to Afghanistan. In 1997 he trained as a medical technician at CFB Borden and was subsequently posted to 2 Field Ambulance at CFB Petawawa, where he began his career in the regular forces. That career took him overseas several times including tours in Bosnia Herzegovina as part of a NATO stabilization force (March-Sept. 2001), as a medical technician in Afghanistan's Operation Apollo (Oct. 2003-Feb. 2004) and in Sri Lanka following the Pacific tsunami of 2004 (Jan.-Feb. 2005) as part of the Canadian Forces Disaster Assistance Program. On August 12, 2006 Cpl. Arnold returned to Afghanistan as part of the NATO-led International Security Assistance Force. Less than five weeks later (Sept. 18), he and Espanola's Pte. David Byers were among four Canadian soldiers killed by a suicide bomber. Cpl. Arnold gained the trust of his unit as the "Unit Doc," and formed a bond with Pte. Byers too. He called him "the kid from next door in Espanola" in missives to his family. The mission Cpl. Arnold was on was a dangerous one. He spent most of his time "outside the wire," or beyond the protection of the NATO base,

as a platoon medic with an infantry division. In Afghanistan he was one of four soldiers killed, and several injured, when a man travelling on a bicycle detonated his bomb near Canadian troops on foot patrol in the Panjwayi district, Kandahar Province, Afghanistan. A number of civilians, including children, were also injured in the attack. In addition to being a dedicated soldier, Glen is remembered as a dedicated father and a loving husband. Cpl. Arnold was born in Sudbury on his parents' eighth wedding anniversary and raised in McKerrow. According to the family he loved the outdoors, and spent much of his youth rambling around the 320 acres of land his great-grandfather Joseph purchased in 1907.
