The Answers To All Our Postal Problems

North America's postal services are drowning in debt. They have never figured out how to adjust to the digital age. Half of the mail is now being delivered electronically and the post office still has us licking glue.

Canada Post just announced a slash and burn policy that cuts jobs, reduces delivery service and jumps the cost of stamps by 35%. For the third time in as many years the U.S. Postal Service just defaulted on its debt load of 5.6 billion that it can't pay the U.S. Treasury. (And still Americans want Saturday mail delivery?!?)

The CEO of Canada Post is a man named Deepak Chopra. I know what you're thinking ... where does a guy who's written 50 books about holistic medicine while sitting cross-legged in an Indian ashram find the time to run a national postal service?!? Well, that might be the problem right there.

After announcing the slashing of 8,000 jobs at Canada Post and the end of door-to-door delivery of mail in urban areas, Deepak "The Postie" Chopra took the sting out of it all with some comic relief. Everybody slammed the price hike of stamps. The postal union went ... well, postal over the loss of 8,000 jobs. City dwellers railed against the idea of walking to a neighbourhood box to retrieve their mail. And Chopra, who gave himself a bonus last year worth 33% of his salary delivered his punch-line defense with a straight face.

"The seniors are telling me," he said, "I

want to be healthy, I want to be active in my life."

Yeah, Canadian seniors are really looking forward to the all-new Canada Post fitness program in which they'll walk to a centralized mailbox and back each day. Except of course, those who can't walk. Ah Deepak, the seniors are telling me they'd really like to get their monthly \$551.54 pension cheques delivered to their door instead of paying cab fare to go and pick them up. Also, they say they wouldn't turn down a sweet 33% increase in that monthly subsistence allowance they worked for their whole lives.

How to fix our postal systems and have some fun?


First, nobody needs mail delivery more than three times a week. Monday, Wednesday and Friday are adequate and that way, your bills will arrive less frequently.

In my case, if I received my junk mail on Monday which is also recycle day. I could just toss it in the blue box next to the mailbox and I won't have to haul it up to the house.

But the real solution to our postal problems is donuts. Donuts, coffee and the daily addiction Canadians and a growing number of Americans have to Tim Hortons. There are 4,000 Tim Hortons franchises in Canada, 200 in the United States with more on the way.

downtown locations in every village, town and city from coast to coast. Tim Hortons is the fastest growing coffee shop franchise on the continent. Down by almost half in business, post offices have nothing but vacant space. Tim Hortons is searching for ideal spaces to lease in downtown areas. Bingo! Swim Club Proposed For Espanola and Area

A local group of swim enthusiasts hope to rally enough community interest and support to bring an Espanola-based Regional Swim Club back to the community for the 2014-2015 swim season. The club intends to operate from the Espanola Regional Recreation Complex and hopes to facilitate an after-school schedule to run parallel with the school year pending the availability of pool time and coaching support.

"We feel that this is an opportunity for a win-win-win for parents, kids and taxpayers alike." stated Greg Gilbert who is amongst the volunteers participating in the drive, himself having been involved in competitive swimming in his youth. "The biggest positive for parents is the encouragement of a regular active lifestyle, while working

within already busy schedules. The afternoon time-slot would allow children to head straight to swim practice after school and not interfere with other activities that usually take place in the evenings. A club lets kids get to experience the thrill of regional swim meets, which are often more about the excitement of an experience away from home than they are about the competition itself."

Gilbert was at the complex during swim registrations to garner support and volunteers for the proposed club. If you missed him, information brochures will be available at the complex front desk and a survey will be posted on the Town's Facebook site to gauge support. In The Loop

The Executive would like to begin 2014 by wishing each and every one a joyous and prosperous New Year. 2014 is an election year for Espanola, so we will continue publishing information on decisions both provincially and municipally that affect Espanola's taxpayers in order to give a clearer understanding of the issues we face as we move forward.

The January 7 Corporate Services meeting saw council members re-visit the fire service review which was defeated by a 4-3 vote by Council as a whole on December 10, 2013. It was mentioned that this would be a different type of review...one focused solely on fire suppression (equipment, buildings, and training). This review would cost \$9,500.00.

The Corporate Services Committee voted unanimously to bring this new recommendation to Council on January 14. Councillor MacMillan suggested that if the review is implemented it may reduce home insurance rates for residents. This begs the question: Would tax rates then be increased to offset the cost of new vehicles/equipment/buildings?

In 2013 the Province reduced our Provincial Gas Tax refund and this in turn had a negative effect on Espanola's Care Van operation. The Corporate Service Committee was informed that for 2014 the format has changed. It is now based on a six month time period and the amount allocated for Espanola has increased. This begs a second question: Will seniors benefit from this by seeing an increase in Care Van operation? The 2014 Budget deliberations are scheduled for February 4 and 11. The Final Budget is to be brought before Council on March 25. With the financial hurdles facing the municipality, we wish them success in this endeavour.

Finally, Mr. Bill Foster spent approximately 5 months researching Policing Costs and another month preparing his slide presentation. On January 14 at 7:30 p.m., he has been allotted a 10 minute time slot to explain these findings to Council. This presentation will contain very important information for all taxpayers. You are encouraged to attend.

Recipe

I had some sirloin steak in the freezer that needed to be used and it's not exactly barbecuing weather out there right now. So I did some searching and found this recipe. I made it and served it over buttered noodles that I

added a couple shakes of red pepper flakes and a good sprinkle of garlic powder to. The broth is slightly sweet and tangy and delicious with the beef. I added some fresh mushrooms during simmering time because I love mushrooms. This is a good way to use round steak but any type of steak sliced thin will work.

Round Steak Sauerbraten

- 1 1/2 pounds top round steak, trimmed and sliced thin
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 1 (.75 ounce) packet dry brown gravy mix
- 2 cups water
- 1 tablespoon onion powder
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 4 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1 bay leaf
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- Ground black pepper to taste

Heat the oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add the sliced meat and brown well. Remove meat. Add the gravy mix and water and bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Stir in the onion powder, brown sugar, vinegar, Worcestershire sauce, ginger, bay leaf and salt, and ground black pepper to taste. Return the meat to the pan, reduce heat to low, cover and simmer for one hour, or until meat is tender. Remove bay leaf. Serve over buttered noodles.

Note: You could also transfer to a casserole dish and bake covered at 350 degrees F (175 degrees C) for 1 1/2 hours.

Kids Korner

Marshmallow Igloos

- Mini marshmallows
- Small foam bowl
- Foam plate
- Icing sugar
- Water



In a bowl, combine one cup of icing sugar and one cup of water. Add the water in slowly until it becomes a thick paste (you may not need a full cup). Cut a small half circle out of the bowl to make a "door". Place the bowl upside down on the foam plate. Dip each marshmallow into the sugar "glue" and line them up around the bottom of the bowl. Once the first row is complete, make a second row and so forth. When all the rows are done lay marshmallows across the top to make the roof.




