Julia contacted local Espanola historian Tim Gallagher, who provided photographs and newspaper articles for her research.

## In The Loop

As promised we are publishing the suggestions offered by the Privacy Commissioner Adjudicator for both parties in order to make the Freedom of Information process in Espanola run more efficiently.

These are listed in the order in which they appeared in the adjudicator's decision letter:

• The town could publish its responses to freedom of information requests on its own website, particularly information it had published before, such as the cheque registry (less any personal or third party info.)

• The town could be more proactive in releasing information...making disclosure of government-held information an automatic process where possible.

• The town, where appropriate, could seek an extension of time to respond to a request.

• The appellant and her group should also consider whether they are able to advance a compromise solution which would reduce costs, both prior to and also after making their request.

• If the town is of the opinion that the group's website, or any other website or publication has published false information, the appropriate legal action could be taken by the town.

• If the appellant and her group want to benefit the town and its residents, then they should disseminate, and respond to, the information they receive from the town in a fulsome manner that encourages an environment of transparency, not in a selective manner that is distrustful and causes needless waste of town resources responding to queries about incomplete or inaccurate information.

The Espanola Citizen Group executive would be open to the adjudicator's recommendations

In closing, we received the decision letter from the town on June 18, 2014. We are finally able to obtain the cheque registry/credit card activity which we had requested and that the Privacy Commissioner's office agreed we had a right to. The Town is charging \$152.00 for this information.

### NOTICE OF THE PASSING OF ZONING BYLAW

(Planning Act-Section 34(18))

**TAKE NOTICE** that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers passed Bylaw 2014-25 on the 25th day of June, 2014.

The land to which the bylaw applies is described as Salter Township, Section 12, Parcel 19280, 66 West Lake Road.

The purpose for the amendment is to allow for driveway access over Crown Land from West Lake Road with a reduced lot frontage. This application is subject of a consent application under the Planning Act.

The last date for filing a notice of appeal is **July 21, 2014.** A Notice of Appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers, setting out the reasons for the appeal. This must also be accompanied by the fee required by the Ontario Municipal Board.

Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal a zoning bylaw to the Ontario Municipal Board. A Notice of Appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a Notice of Appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf.

No persons or public body shall be added as a party to the hearing of the appeal unless, before the bylaw was passed, the person or public body made oral submissions at a public meeting or written submissions to the Council or, in the opinion of the Ontario Municipal Board, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

This bylaw is available for inspection in the municipal office during regular office hours.

## Recipe

I love Greek salad and adding chick peas gives this salad extra texture and protein that makes it not only delicious but filling. It's crisp, refreshing and flavourful. This salad comes together quickly with a simple dressing and is vegan and gluten-free.



### Ultimate Greek Chopped Salad

- 1 hothouse cucumber, unpeeled
- 4-5 ripe roma tomatoes
- 1 large red bell pepper
- 1 small red onion
- 1/2 a can chick peas, rinsed and drained
- 1 can pitted, black olives
- Crumbled feta cheese (as much or little as you like)

### Dressing

- 3 Tbsp. red wine vinegar
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 2 tsp. oregano
- 1/4 tsp. salt

Make the dressing: in a small bowl, combine all ingredients and whisk to combine. Set aside. Dice the cucumber, onion, bell pepper and tomatoes (removing any excess liquid from tomatoes). Put vegetables and chick peas in a large bowl. Add dressing and toss to combine. Can eat immediately or refrigerate for at least an hour to let flavors combine. Some dressing will settle on the bottom, so stir before serving.

### Need Grows, Donations Down At Food Bank

By Chloe Kneer - Since the inception of the Espanola Helping Hand Food Bank (EHHFB) in November of 2006, many things have changed. For one, their location is different. When they first opened in the basement of St. Jude Parish, the food bank could collect and distribute food, not worrying about expenses such as rent, insurance, heat, and hydro. Once they outgrew the church basement, they had to rent their space at 87 Centre Street in Espanola. In addition to the rent, insurance and utilities take a huge chunk off of the bottom-line every month for the EHHFB, which sustains itself on the generosity of the community and those who volunteer to run it.

A second huge change for the food bank has been the number of individuals and families using From 2012-2013, the total it number of people being served by the food bank has increased by 8.2%. The number of areas being served have also grown. Nairn Centre used to have its own food bank, which has now closed. EHHFB has taken on those clients, and also serves McKerrow, Birch Island, Little Current, and Manitowaning. "Technically," says President Susan Kryzanowski, "most of these towns are not part of our catchment area, but we have a policy that no one is turned away.'

Another significant change at the EHHFB is the level of donations, both monetary and food. At present, the additional mouths being fed is out-pacing those giving on a regular basis. Treasurer George Brown says, "Quite a few people gave every month before, but now that's dried up. At the rate we are going, next year we could possibly be closed." He goes on to explain that the last several months the food bank has been forced to deplete reserves not only for expenses, but also to keep up with demand for food. "Even during what we call our 'feel good time' last fall and during the Christmas holidays, donations were down." says Brown. As a result, money from their bank account has been used to purchase food. The extra expense has resulted in over \$4000 of funds going out per month.

Both Kryzanowski and Brown hope the tide will soon turn and the food bank will see more being donated to stock the shelves. "Our goal is to feed people and that need is not going away, so we certainly hope that we see more in the way of steady, reliable donors," Kryzanowski says. The EHHFB recently obtained a charity number, giving them the ability to issue tax receipts to those making a contribution. Thev are exploring the idea of pay roll deductions and they encourage e-transfers and direct donations to their account at the Espanola RBC branch.

They would also like to see more help in the way of food drives. "Right now we don't have any food drives scheduled for the summer. We have a dedicated volunteer base, but the average age of our volunteers is 60, so while they are very ambitious, it is sometimes hard for them to do the work required for a successful food drive," says Kryzanowski.
