# Twenty Years Of Hosting Reduced To A "Top Ten List"

Almost a quarter of a century ago, I raised my hand at a meeting to offer my services as a volunteer. The meeting of Port Colborne citizens was so contentious, it had to be moved from city hall to a larger venue at the Canadian Legion.

I was part of a core group of culturalists determined to turn the flagging Port Colborne Club into a theatre for the arts. Against us were naysayers and business people who opposed the use of tax dollars to compete with their private entertainment establishments.

The guy who spoke before me - Joe of Joe's Bar got so worked up he ended his pitch by saying that he was "not going to kiss Shirley Coppen's ass!" Shirley was the local provincial government rep. I began my pitch by stating that Joe was playing dirty pool because the mental image of kissing Shirley Coppen's has sent 15 guys running for the Belmont Hotel and ... they were my supporters!!!

Having just come off the book tour with Hey! Is That Guy Dead Or Is He Skip!?! I was only too anxious to see the club's curling rinks ripped up. So I raised my hand and offered to start an author series in Port Colborne if the club became an arts theatre.

We won the day, government money arrived and the ol' boys club was converted into a beautiful 300-seat theatre, with the bar and salons of the circa 1860 stately homestead nicely preserved.

Last Tuesday evening I raised my hand again but this time it was to wave goodbye to the theatre and almost 300 patrons who had come to my last author evening to hear the amazing story of Olympic sensation

Silken Laumann.

But what a wonderful, 20-year literary ride it was! I did the first reading of Malcolm And Me - Life In The Litterbox and the next author I brought to the stage was Stephen Reid with Jackrabbit Parole. Stephen had just been released from prison for robbing banks, a lot of banks and all but one successfully.

When Maeve Railton could not find a sponsor for the evening, I suggested she try the four banks in town.

"No, really," I persisted, "it would be educational for the employees to hear how the mind of a robber works."

Maeve retuned a few days later and began her sponsorship report with "You A\$\$!%#\*. They all said "no" and one of them escorted me to the door. And they all want you to call them!"

"Whv?"

"They want to know exactly when Stephen Reid is arriving and when he's leaving

Mike Bullard did an unforgettable twohour, stand-up comedy routine, Sandra Shamas broke the record by using the "F-word" twelve times and Joe Pistone, the original "Donny Brasco" almost got us both arrested at the Buffalo border when, as a former FBI agent he tried to pull rank on a customs official. Our first lady Margaret Trudeau tore a strip of skin off me and Roger Abbott of Air Farce showed me it's possible to be the funniest man in Canada and also the nicest man in the world.

Twenty years and 189 author evenings later, here then is the laugh track and

# Espanola Police Report

On May 27, 2014, the Espanola Police Service received a complaint from a female residence of Espanola, that while she was walking her dog in the area of the Black Creek fishing pier on Penage Lake Road, she was bitten by a German Shepherd on her upper leg.

Upon arrival, the female told police that when she was walking back to her vehicle, she recognized a truck parked in the same area, and knew the owner of the truck had two German Shepherds whom she knew were aggressive. The female quickly called her own dog over to her side, but in doing so, also caught the attention of one of the German Shepherds, who ran towards her and bit her twice on her upper leg, causing a puncture mark and a bruise.

As a result of the incident, a 59-year old male resident of Espanola was charged with Owner of Dog - Fail to Prevent Biting or Attacking a Person or Domestic Animal, contrary to section 5.1 of the Dog Owner's Liability Act, and Fail to Prohibit Dog from Running at Large under the Town of Espanola Animal Control By-Law 2485/12. He is to appear in Espanola Court on July 10, 2014, at 10:00 a.m., to answer to his charge, which upon conviction can carry a monetary penalty of up to \$10,000 or 6 months in jail, or both.

The same dog owner was charged on May 6, 2014, under the Municipal By-law for Fail to Prohibit Dog from Running at Large, when his German Shepherd attacked a small dog. At that time, the owner received a \$120.00 fine.

On May 30, 2014 at 4:43 a.m., the Espanola Police Service was called to the Tim Hortons restaurant at 701 Centre Street, Espanola, regarding a motor vehicle collision.

Upon arrival, police found that a Mazda pickup truck being operated by the 57 year old registered owner from Webbwood, had jumped the curb on the north side of the restaurant, and struck the building. The impact broke a large window and caused substantial structural damage to the wall. The driver of the vehicle told police that he'd pulled into the parking lot to buy a coffee, but when he attempted to stop in front of the building, his truck would not stop, and it jumped the curb and struck the building.

The accident is still under investigation; however, no charges are expected against the driver.

A 33-year old male arrested on May 24, 2014 for a serious domestic assault, was re-arrested on June 3, 2014 for a Breach of the Recognizance he entered into following his release from Sudbury Bail Court.

At 9:00 p.m. on June 3, the victim in the Domestic Assault attended the police station to report that her ex-common law spouse spoke to her in violation of his recognizance, and while doing so, attempted to get her to recant her statement to police, and lie while testifying at his criminal trial. As a result of the complaint, the 33-year old from Espanola turned himself into the Espanola Police Service, and was arrested and charged with 3 counts of Breach of Recognizance contrary to section 145(3) of the Criminal Code, and one count of Obstruct Justice, contrary to section 139(2) of the Criminal Code. He was held in custody, and will appear for a Bail Hearing in Sudbury on June 4, 2014 to answer to his newest charges.

You must be on this voter list. A notice is posted at the complex reading that the pool will be closed from June 27 to August 5 for maintenance. # Recipe

It's barbeque season! This is a healthy and delicious dinner for hot summer days. Chicken does not need to be marinated to soften, but when marinated it soaks up all the delicious



flavours and enhances the taste of the chicken. But, if you are in a hurry, don't worry; use the marinade to baste the chicken kebabs while grilling. Keep in mind that sweetish marinades or basting sauces burn easily, therefore grill over medium/low heat or on an upper rack.

### Pineapple Lime Chicken Kebabs (makes 6 large kebabs)

- 3 large boneless, skinless chicken breasts, cubed
- 3 tbsp soya sauce
- 2 tbsp honey
- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1/4 cup fresh lime juice
- 2 tsp garlic, crushed
- 2 tbsp parsley, chopped
- 1/2 tsp each salt and black pepper
- 1 1/2 cups pineapple, cubed

Mix all the ingredients, except the pineapple, in a marinating bowl and marinade for 1 hour. Use long water-soaked wooden or steel kebab sticks and thread the chicken and pineapple alternatively onto the sticks. Place on a medium hot barbecue and cook until done - turning and basting with the leftover marinade, regularly.
