Espanola Rivermen Officially Moving to Newly Sanctioned CIHL



The sanctioned United Hockey Union, under the umbrella of the Amateur Athletic Union, has officially approved the new Canadian International Hockey League as a member.

The UHU executive gave its unanimous endorsement to the CIHL and its founder, Espanola Rivermen owner, Tim Clayden at a meeting last week in Detroit.

The CIHL will begin play effective the upcoming 2014-2015 season.

Ron White, who serves as president of the UHU, national junior hockey director for the AAU and commissioner of the Western States Hockey League, issued the following statement in accepting the CIHL as a member.

"After months of anticipation and planning, the United Hockey Union, which is the junior hockey council affiliated with the Amateur Athletic Union, has as the first order of business at its 2014 annual

The "Selfie" - The Answer To World Peace?

A coup or more accurately a coup d'etat key government and media buildings. (French for "we are trés pissed off!") is a sudden and usually violent overthrow of a country's existing government by forces within the state itself.

Coups are rarely 'bloodless.' The 1973 Chilean coup d'etat in which General Augusto Pinochet overthrew President Salvador Allende and set up a 17-year dictatorship was described as "political genocide where thousands of leftist disappeared." At the outset of Argentina's 1955 uprising to depose Juan Peron, the military bombed Buenos Aires' main square killing thousands of civilians.

So the purpose behind a traditional violent military coup is to first secure control of the country and in doing so show its citizens that you mean business. Protesters must know that they could be

Last week the military in the country of Thailand staged a military coup d'etat. They mounted a massive show of force with heavily-armed troops in jeeps and tanks swarming the capital of Bangkok as loud speakers declared the establishment of martial law. They were loaded for bear, determined to bury democracy and prepared to kill their own people in order to bring down the government. They were not however prepared for the "selfie."

My morning paper carried five photographs taken on the streets of Bangkok just as Thailand's army was setting up barricades and positioning their gun-mounted vehicles in front of

The centerpiece photo shows two welldressed women in front of a jeep with three army officers wielding automatic weapons. The woman on the left is smiling. The woman on the right is holding her smartphone at arm's length in front of her. They are taking a "selfie" of themselves using the military coup as a backdrop. Instead of fleeing for their lives or racing home to warn their families of an impending civil war, these two women in summer dresses are posing in front of three soldiers who look terminally confused by their sudden celebrity status.

The other photos show two teenage girls with their arms around a young and embarrassed marine, a woman examining her screen to see if a second "selfie" is necessary, yet three more women taking pictures of themselves with automatic weapons and a goofy looking guy who has borrowed a helmet and is sitting behind the wheel of soldier's jeep. The young man is smiling with both hands on the wheel like he's just crossed the finish line first at the Soapbox Derby.

Thitinan Pongsudhirak, an authority on Thai politics is quoted in the article as saying: "It's technically martial law but it doesn't feel like it." He's right. The coup looked a lot like a "Take Your Family To Work Day" at Royal Thai Army Headquarters.

As a bit of a history buff and someone who never ceases to be amazed by how

history keeps repeating itself in the form of colossal blunders, I wanted to scream.

"Hey! Those guys in uniform you're cuddling up next to, they're here to kill your freedom and imprison your brothers and put you under house arrest!"

Has it really come to this? So powerful is the fame game that it can bring a halt to the war game. Is the Kardashian factor so strong in today's society that narcissism could really end fascism?!? meek might very well inherit the earth as long as they keep snapping "selfies" and smiling for the camera as democracy disappears into thin air.

In The Loop

The Asset Management Plan was introduced to Council at the May 27th meeting by the Clerk Treasurer/Administrator. This Plan will be posted on the Town website May31st. It is necessary to have such a plan in order to obtain provincial infrastructure funds.

The plan lists Espanola's worth in terms of roads, bridges, water, wastewater and buildings. It then gives estimates of the useful lifespan for each asset before repairs and/ or replacements are required. It must be updated on a yearly basis. Phase 2 will be developed to also include Espanola's vehicles and equipment.

Council was informed that 19.55% of the Town's assets are considered excellent and 40.47% good. However, 11% are at a critical stage, 20% poor and 8% fair. It is estimated that it will cost a minimum of \$3,364,901 per year to address these issues. Money for this will come from taxation, reserves, grants and debt financing.

The offer for expanding Espanola Police Services to cover Nairn-Hyman and Baldwin Townships has been put on hold. Council was told Baldwin has decided to wait for the new OPP proposal before making any decisions. Therefore at this point in time Espanola will not be going ahead with the hiring and training of new recruits.

general meeting, approved the membership of the Canadian International Hockey League. We are extremely excited about our new partner and the excitement that it will bring to the UHU," stated White.

Clayden will be moving the Rivermen to the new CIHL from the Northern Ontario Jr. Hockey League.

As a first-year entry in 2013-2014, Espanola finished third in the standings of the eight-team NOJHL and led the league in attendance with a per-game average of 546, regular-season and playoffs included.

A determined Clayden, who has worked tirelessly over the past three months to get the CIHL started after announcing that he and his Espanola team were leaving the NOJHL, had plenty to say about moving forward under the UHU-AAU banner.

"We are incredibly honoured and humbled that our American neighbours and friends in junior hockey of the UHU have accepted the CIHL as an equal partner under the sanctioned AAU. This creates tremendous excitement and opportunity for not only our junior hockey fans, sponsors and CIHL franchise operators but most importantly, provides options to all junior hockey players between the ages of 15-20 in Northern Ontario and beyond. Our junior hockey players from Northern Ontario will now be able to compete with and against student-athletes from all over, be it Canada, the United States and Europe. Together with the UHU, we have a chance of a lifetime here to do something really special in the game of junior hockey.

The UHU is now made up of four junior leagues -- the WSHL, NSHL, MWJHL and the CIHL.

Clayden, in learning of the CIHL's official acceptance into the UHU, said he will begin to announce his league's teams "in the days and weeks ahead. This is now a reality and there are documents and agreements to sign."

Meanwhile, MWJHL commissioner Gardiner, in welcoming the arrival of the CIHL as the newest member of the UHU, said, "We welcome the challenge to cross borders to compete with our Canadian neighbours. This is a great day for junior hockey."

The MWJHL and CIHL are expected to begin the 2014-2015 season with a joint Showcase Tournament to be held in Traverse City, Michigan. Of note, the UHU has changed its import rule and will now classify all Canadian and American players as North Americans or non-imports.

All teams in all four UHU leagues -- WSHL, NSHL, MWJHL and the CIHL -- can have unlimited non-imports as well as up to 10 imports and two grand-fathered imports from the prior season.

Recipe

Here's another one of my daughter's healthy recipes that she has made three times already in the last week. These are not only healthy, but moist and delicious and an easy 'grab and go' breakfast if you



don't have time to make something. I personally think the added chocolate chips are what make these muffins so good but you can also make them with chopped apples and cinnamon or walnuts as well.

Breakfast Banana Oatmeal Muffins

- 2.5 cups old fashioned oats
- 1 cup plain greek yogurt
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup honey
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 2 Tbsp ground flax seed
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 2 ripe bananas
- ³/₄ cup chocolate chips (optional)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray tin with non-stick cooking spray or line 12 muffin tins with silicone or foil liners. Place the oats in the food processor and pulse for about 10 seconds. Add remaining ingredients to the food processor. Process until everything is mixed together and oats are smooth. At this point in the process, I decided to actually separate my batter into two different bowls. I added dark chocolate chips to one and walnuts to the other. Basically, kid muffins and mommy muffins. Divide batter among cupcake liners, and bake for 18-20 minutes, or until toothpick comes out clean.

Kids Korner

Seed Mosaics

- Shallow lid from a plastic container (margarine)
- White glue
- Seeds (larger ones work best like beans)
- Paintbrush
- Paint (liquid tempera)



Give each child a shallow lid saved from a plastic container. Have them fill the lid with a big puddle of glue. Then tilt the lid back and forth a bit to spread the glue so it covers the entire bottom of the lid. Have them add the seeds to the lid in any pattern they desire. Paint over the top of the seeds in any colour they wish. Once they have completed painting the beans; set the mosaics aside to dry for about a week. When the mosaics are dry, peel them out of the lid. Make a hole in the top and use some yarn to hang them up.
