Menezes da Luz Junior had an interest in American politics. (Junior?) It wouldn't take Sherlock Holmes da Silva (Honest, you can't make this stuff up) to figure that one out.

In a town near Sao Paulo the parents of seven kids names them Elvis, Elvisnei, Elvismara, Elvislei, Elviscentina, Elvislaine and Elvislene. Not happy about it, each of the children has developed a curled upper lip. In case of a fire, the father yells "Elvis!" and immediately, they all leave the building.

Rivermen's Clayden Locks Horns With NOJHL; New V.P. of Operations Appointed

By Chloe Kneer - Espanola Rivermen Governor Tim Clayden has been suspended and fined for comments he made criticizing the NOJHL. In the wake of his suspension, the Rivermen have appointed Scott Ginson as V.P. of Operations for the team. Ginson has been working behind the scenes for the Rivermen this season and takes the reigns as V.P. in the off-season.

Clayden's remarks and general feelings about the direction of the NOJHL has led him to the decision of abandoning the NOJHL and taking the fledgling Rivermen team to a different league altogether for the 2014-15 season. Essentially, Clayden disagrees with several decisions by the NOJHL, one of which will significantly impact the team's travel costs. According to Clayden, the team's road expenses are expected to increase by about \$40,000 next year due to the Elliot Lake Bobcats being relocated to Cochrane and the North Bay Trappers relocating as well. Also at issue is the recruiting of players due to the possibility that Americans will not be allowed to play in Canada under Hockey Canada in the future.

Clayden says, "Hockey is a global sport. To not allow USA kids to play is archaic thinking and is a decision that will hurt all junior hockey teams at this level."

One of Clayden's other chief concerns is the NCAA exposure that his players get. "The lack of NCAA exposure for our players [under the NOJHL] is becoming an even more glaring issue for us. The NCAA is the basis of our recruiting each year. We want to give all of our players the best possible chance to succeed on and off the ice," he says.

The Rivermen will play in Espanola again next season under the sanctioning of the AAU (the American Athletic Union) in a league tentatively called the International Junior Hockey League.

Clayden wants his team in a league that is open to Canadians, Americans, and other international players. He explains, "The idea of an International Junior Hockey League started out as a summer hockey league concept that has now grabbed the attention of many in the game today that could possibly evolve into a winter junior hockey league that would see international junior players having an opportunity to play here in North America." The Rivermen just wrapped up their regular season over the weekend and playoff action starts this Friday at home against Sudbury.

NOJHL Commissioner Robert Mazzucca could not be reached for comment on the departure of the Rivermen from the Northern Ontario Junior Hockey League.

Split Pea Shamrock

- Split Peas
- Cardboard
- Mod Podge or White Glue
- Paint brush
- Scissors



Draw a shamrock shape onto the cardboard. If you cut out a large heart from paper, you can then use it to make a shamrock by tracing it four times around with a stem; it is easier than trying to draw a shamrock free hand. Cut out the shamrock. Paint a small section of the shamrock with Mod Podge or glue and then sprinkle on some split peas. Repeat the process until the whole thing is covered. You will still see the cardboard through the peas, but the natural earthy colour is complementary. Let dry for a couple hours before hanging up.

Recipe

I have a favourite meatloaf recipe that I have used for years but every once in a while I like to try a different recipe. There are many, MANY different versions of the classic meatloaf out there; some with cheese, some with real bread crumbs, some with or without a glaze. I tried this one last night and I think I may like it more than my old standby recipe. It has a lot of flavour and is moist with a sweet glaze topping



Classic Meatloaf

- 1- 1 1/2 pounds ground beef
- 1 small onion or half of a larger onion, chopped
- 1/2 cup bread crumbs (Italian adds a nice flavour)
- 1/4 cup Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 cup parsley, chopped
- 1/4 cup milk
- 1 tablespoon garlic, minced
- 2 eggs, beaten
- Salt and pepper

For the Glaze:

- 1/2 cup Ketchup
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon mustard
- Dash of Worcestershire sauce

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Place all of the meatloaf ingredients into a bowl, and using your (very clean) hands, combine all of the ingredients. Then, in a separate bowl, mix together all of the ingredients for the glaze. Remove the meat mixture from the bowl and form into a loaf, place in a baking dish. Spread about 1/2 of the glaze over the loaf. Place the loaf in the oven and bake for 45 minutes. I take it out of the oven and drain off any fat that has accumulated and then spread the loaf with the last half of the glaze and cook for an additional 15 minutes. Once the loaf is done (internal temp of the meat should be 155 degrees and/or no longer pink), remove from the oven and serve.

A New Local Industrial Opportunity

By Bob Gordon - I just want to clarify why I am writing the occasional article for the Around and About. The article titled "So You Want to Run for Municipal Election?!" was the result of a request from Chloe [Kneer] and Nicky [Lamothe]. I was, of course, pleased after almost two decades to be asked for permission to publish the article that appeared recently on my robertgordonca.com website and Facebook. It was not crafted for newspaper publication so was longer than necessary. I've had a lot of response on the article and agreed to write the occasionally topical article for the Around and About on subjects deemed of interest to readers. A news report featured in a recent regional edition of a Sun Media newspaper refers to an announcement that will have a

major effect on the local mining sector. Sudbury based mining giant Vale is in the process of opening the technically advanced Totten Mine development in Worthington. According to the article the new mine expected to be in full operation within the next two years or less and will eventually employ 275 workers in above and below ground operations. Vale also announced part of the workforce will be solicited from the Anishnawbek First Nation Reserve near Massey.

The major mining project, reportedly the first new mine in over forty years for the Sudbury mining region, is, according to the mining firm, as environmentally and workplace safety-oriented as any current or future mining operation. It is expected to produce 2,220 tons of ore each day according to estimates, resulting in 25 million pounds of copper and 20 million pounds of nickel along with large quantities of precious metals annually.

With a giant mining development like Totten Mine so near to the Espanola North Shore region communities such as Nairn-Hyman, McKerrow's Baldwin and Township of the North Shore together with the Town of Espanola are all potential sites for new development associated with, and required by, the

new Vale project. There are probably firms prepared or even presently contracted to service the new mine and planning new or expanded facilities. That is especially interesting considering Espanola has a serviced industrial park that should be able to compete with the burgeoning Walden Industrial complex near Lively for drawing in new business. Since a new upgraded and realigned highway is already a reality between the Sudbury/Whitefish 4-lane section to

the Totten mine site an inter-municipal committee to lobby all levels of government for an extension of the new highway to at least the Highway 17/Highway 6 intersection should probably become a top local priority.

The Vale project offers an unexpected and stellar opportunity to use as a platform for anyone interested in filling the Espanola mayor's position that Mayor Lehoux has indicated will be vacant for the 2014 election.

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In The Loop

Contained in the agenda of the Council meeting of March 4 were the following recommendations from Administration: replace the duty blowers at the sewage treatment plant with APG-NeuroBlowers. Estimated cost \$217,000 (includes approved OPA funding incentive-\$43,000-\$64,000); accept Ontario Clean Water Association's proposal for financing of GeoTubes from the water and sewer rates. Estimated cost \$386,000; enter into an agreement with Real Term Energy and LAS (Local Authority Services) for a design, upgrade, and transfer contract to convert the municipality's streetlight to the LED as proposed. The estimated commitment is \$384,000(gas tax + reserves). There was discussion on each of these recommendations and the future energy savings that are projected to be realized. The Mayor and Councillors voted unanimously in favour of the GeoTube and NeuroBlower purchases.

The money for the water metering study, GeoTube financing, and duty blower purchases will come from water/sewer rates and reserves. These costs will not be included in the 2014 budget figures that come out next month because the tubes and blowers will show up under "environmental". More information was requested for costs and savings for the conversion of Espanola's streetlights to LED's. Officials from Local Authority Services will be invited to the March 25 meeting to answer questions. This retrofit would be paid from reserves and gas tax monies from the federal government. In closing, our Espanola Citizen Group Town Hall meeting has been re-scheduled to Wednesday, April 23. Details will follow next week.

Espanola Police Report

On February 11, 14, a member of the Espanola Police Service was stopped at the intersection of Centre St. and Second St., Espanola, when the driver of a northbound motor vehicle was spotted driving with one hand to his ear, indicating to the officer that the driver was using a cellular device, thus violating the Hands Free Device law. The officer initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle, and upon identifying the driver, it was found that he was the subject two drivers licence suspensions.

As a result of the traffic stop, 37-year old Tobias Blais of Espanola, was charged with two counts of Driving While Under Suspension contrary to section 53 of the Highway Traffic Act. Further, the vehicle that Blais was operating at the time of the offence was impounded for 7-days subject to the provisions of section 55.2 of the Highway Traffic Act. He is to appear in Traffic court on March 13, 2014 to answer to his charges.

Drug Offences - On the February 5, 2014 at 5:11 pm, a member of the Espanola Police Service was conducting routine patrol in the area of Centre St. and Park St., Espanola, when the officer observed a northbound motor vehicle that appeared to be speeding. The officer activated the patrol vehicle's onboard Radar unit, and obtained a reading of 62 km/h in a posted 40 km/h Community Safety Zone. The officer stopped the motor vehicle, and upon speaking to the female driver, the officer observed drug paraphernalia in plain view. The driver then opened the center console, and three different packages containing approximately 14 grams of Marijuana was observed.

As a result of the incident, 30-year old Melissa Lively of Naim Centre was charged with one count of Possession of a Controlled Substance, contrary to section 4(1) of the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act.

Drug Offence - On the February 1, 2014, the Espanola Police Service executed a Controlled Drugs and Substances Act Search Warrant at a residence located on Hayward St. in Espanola.

Upon entry, officers located a male inside the residence, along with 693 grams of Marijuana packaged, a small quantity of Codeine, \$585.00 in Canadian currency, and indicia that suggested the trafficking in these Substances.

As a result of the warrant, 29-year old Thomas Renner of Espanola, was charged with:

- Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking, contrary to section 5(2) of the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act;
- Possession of a Controlled Substance, contrary to section 4(1) of the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act; and
- Possession of Property Obtained by Crime, contrary to section 354(1)(a) of the Criminal Code

The street value of the drugs seized is estimated to be \$10,395.00.
