to help fund the Emergency Deer Feeding Program this winter. Deer are seldom fed during the winter by any conservation group unless it's a very bad winter, such as this one. With this year's huge amount of snow on the ground, remaining on the ground for so long a time, the deer can't fend for themselves. We were able as a club to find in our budget one thousand dollars. This will help with the costs of fuel and gas for snowmobiles, pickups and grooming equipment that are out packing trails and cutting cedar. This is needed to give the deer better access to food in their winter yards.

Also this year, SCI North Eastern Ontario Chapter will be introducing NASP, National Archery in the Schools Program into a local school. This program is huge, having over 12.5 million students from 12,000 schools in 10 countries taking part last year. Now for the first time in the Province of Ontario, NASP will be offered. This program is taught in the school's gymnasium and becomes part

of that school's curriculum. It will link youth to the world of competitive shooting and then into hunting and the outdoors. Each school program costs approximately \$4000 to set up, and this cost includes all equipment, maintenance and training. Providing all of the same standardized equipment and training in the controlled environment of a gymnasium levels the field for all student participants. It also doesn't matter if a student has a disability or is extremely fit; the program is appropriate for all.

It is very exciting, after three years of planning, to bring this program to northern Ontario. If you know of a school that would be interested in NASP please contact your local SCI North Eastern Ontario Chapter for more information.

Recipe

Different cashew chicken recipes have been going around on the internet and I wanted to try and make it. I found this recipe that seemed easy enough. I didn't have any hoisin sauce on hand but after some research I found I could substitute with some teriyaki sauce and a bit of ketchup and I used a teaspoon of ground ginger instead of real ginger. I also doubled the sauce. It turned out delicious and I have added it to my recipe collection.



Cashew Chicken

- 1 1/2 lbs boneless skinless chicken breasts, diced into 1-inch pieces
- 1 1/2 tbsp cornstarch, divided
- 1 1/2 tbsp + 1 tsp vegetable oil
- Salt and pepper
- 1/3 cup chicken broth
- 3 tbsp hoisin sauce
- 1 tbsp soya sauce
- 1 tbsp rice vinegar
- 1 tbsp honey
- 3 green onions, chopped, whites and greens divided
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tsp finely grated, peeled fresh ginger
- 2/3 cup lightly salted cashews
- Red pepper flakes, to taste (optional)

In a mixing bowl, toss chicken with 1 tbsp cornstarch to evenly coat. In a large skillet, heat 1 tbsp vegetable oil over medium-high heat. Once oil is hot, add half of the chicken, and cook stirring frequently, until chicken is golden brown and has cooked through, about 4 minutes. Transfer chicken to a plate (leaving the remaining oil in skillet - it should be about 1 tsp) and add another 1/2 tbsp vegetable oil to skillet. Cook remaining chicken until golden brown and cooked through, then transfer to plate with first batch of chicken. In a mixing bowl (or liquid measuring cup used to measure chicken broth), whisk together chicken broth, hoisin sauce, soy sauce, rice vinegar, honey and remaining 1/2 tbsp cornstarch until well blended. Heat remaining 1 tsp vegetable oil in skillet over medium heat. Add green onion whites, garlic, ginger and cashews and sauté until cashews are golden brown, about 1 minute. Pour in hoisin sauce mixture, season with salt and pepper to taste, and cook, stirring constantly, until sauce thickens. Remove from heat, add chicken to sauce and toss to evenly coat. Serve warm with white or brown rice or quinoa and top with greens of green onions and sprinkle with red pepper flakes if desired.

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Cadet Naval Training on the High Seas

By Danika Gravelle - With the back of winter broken and warmer days ahead, the Royal Canadian Sea Cadet Corps, #357 Hero, Espanola, has sent two cadets to British Columbia. Each year, the Canadian Cadet Organization sends qualified cadets to the Canadian Forces Base, Esquimalt, for naval training aboard an Orca-class vessel; a thirty-three metre, steel-hulled Royal Canadian Navy Training Tender. The Orca-class are designated as "Patrol Craft Training," and are vessels used for surveillance and search and rescue.

#357 Hero is fortunate enough to send two cadets this year: Chief Petty Officer Second Class Pascal Gravelle, and Master Seaman Jake Goodchild. CPO2 Gravelle completed his Marine Engineering course last summer in B.C., earning his Sea Cadet Marine Engineering ticket, which qualifies him to return as a staff cadet on this deployment. He will now put to good use his marine engineering skills in assisting others to have an educational
