By Chloe Kneer - In the fall of last year, the Town of Espanola announced that it is going with Vote-by-Mail in the upcoming municipal election. The Vote-by-Mail procedure eliminates polling stations, advance polls, and proxy voting. According to administration, eligible voters who appear on the Voters' List will receive a kit in the mail containing all the materials required to place their vote, including postage paid response envelopes.

The town cites a number of advantages for opting to use this method of voting, including that it is convenient and flexible and that it eliminates the obstacles which keep voters away from the ballot box, including accessibility challenges, bad weather, or family and work commitments.

Critics of Vote-by-Mail, however, feel that problems encountered during the 2010 election could resurface this time around as well. The difference is that in 2010, workers at polling places could rectify the issues. Vote-by-Mail depends on the individual to navigate their way through the voting process. There is

concern that residents haven't been educated, nor informed of how Vote-by-Mail works and what their responsibilities are to ensure a smooth process. It also unclear who will tabulate votes or how all eligible voters can be assured that they are on the list to receive Vote-by-Mail kits. To help, an information table with be set up at the Espanola Mall June 25 from 1:00 – 3:00 p.m.

One step that you can take now, no matter what municipality you live in, is to ensure that you are on the Voters' List. The website www.voterlookup.ca been set up for that purpose. By accessing this site, with your municipality, name and

address, you can find out if vou are included on the list. MPAC is responsible for the oversight of this database. If vou are a tenant, new to the area, or are just turning 18, however, it is very likely that you will not be on the list. In that case, you must take the appropriate steps to get added as a voter.

Sables-Spanish Rivers, Baldwin, and Nairn-Hyman Townships will continue with the traditional method of polling stations for voting. If you are planning to run for municipal election, most municipalities have a deadline register in September with information and forms available on their websites or at the municipal offices.

Recipe

Lemon lovers will fall in love with these muffins. They are perfect for breakfast, brunch, or snack time.

Lemon Poppy Seed Muffins For the Muffins:

- 2/3 cup sugar
- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- Grated zest and juice of 1 lemon 3/4 cup sour cream or plain Greek yogurt
 - 2 large eggs
 - 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
 - ½ cup of butter, melted and cooled
 - 2 tablespoons poppy seeds

Icing:

- 1 cup confectioners' sugar, sifted
- 2-3 tablespoons fresh lemon juice

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F. Spray or line a muffin tin. In a large bowl, rub the sugar and the lemon zest together with your fingertips until the sugar is moist and the fragrance of the lemon is strong. Whisk in the flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt. In a small bowl, whisk the sour cream or Greek yogurt, eggs, vanilla, lemon juice and melted butter together until well blended. Pour the liquid ingredients over the dry ingredients and gently stir to blend. Don't over mix. Stir in the poppy seeds. Divide the batter evenly among the muffin cups. Bake for 18 to 20 minutes, or until the tops are golden and a thin knife inserted into the center of the muffins comes out clean. Transfer the pan to a rack and cool for 5 minutes before carefully removing each muffin from its mold. Cool the muffins completely on the rack before icing them.

To Make the Icing: Put the confectioners' sugar in a small bowl and add about 1 1/2 tablespoons of the lemon juice. Stir with a spoon to moisten the sugar, then add enough additional lemon juice, a dribble at a time, to get an icing that is thin enough to drizzle from the tip of the spoon. Drizzle glaze over the muffins. Serve.

Message From Espanola Mayor Mike Lehoux

On behalf of Council for the Town of Espanola, I would like to thank the residents of Espanola for their patience and trust they have shown during my most challenging time on Council, which can be attributed to the ARB Decision regarding Domtar's Assessment Appeal. I am extremely proud of the way Council conducted themselves along with our staff and unions during these trying times. The Town of Espanola was spared of significant tax increases due to the attentiveness of both Council and staff. Some of the highlights of our accomplishments during this 4 year term include a decrease to the Residential tax rates from .02485474 in 2010 to .01900915 for 2014; a rate decrease of 23.52%. Increased reassessment and decreased residential ratios provided for tax increases to be less than 1% for the last 2 years and tax increases of less than 2% during our 4 year mandate. These increases have been much less than the annual cost of living index increases. In order to minimize our residential taxes, Council with the assistance of staff and unions reduced \$1.2 million of expenses in 2013 and a further cut of \$200,000

Capital projects undertaken during 2010 – 2014

in 2014.

- Water and Sewer upgrades to Tudhope, Barber, Station, Gray and Park Street East of Hwy 6/Centre St, as well as Hunter, Parchment, Appleford and Church;

- Equipment upgrades at Water Treatment Plant:
- Industrial park expansion;
- Mead culvert;
- New library roof;
- New roof at 91 Tudhope Street;
- New shed at cemetery;
- New LED lights at complex;
- Replace boiler and condenser at complex.

Items budgeted for 2014

- New operating software, which will update the current 1980's software;
- Replace 1984 rescue unit;
- Working with MTO to address the Hwy 6 culvert, will proceed with Al Secord Trail at the same time:
- Replace loader with plow;
- New Public Works vehicle, which will replace the old Care Van;
- Replace zamboni;
- Address sewage issue with Geotubes project;
- Upgrade blowers at sewage treatment plant to be more energy efficient;
- Convert to LED streetlights to address energy efficiency.

Also during this term the 2010 debt level decreased from \$10,360,884 to \$7,919,946 (projected yearend balance for 2014) a decrease of \$2,440,938. Although the Town of Espanola will always face challenges in the future, I believe the Town is in a much better financial position as a result of the actions taken by this Council.
