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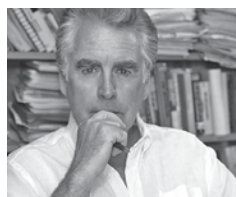

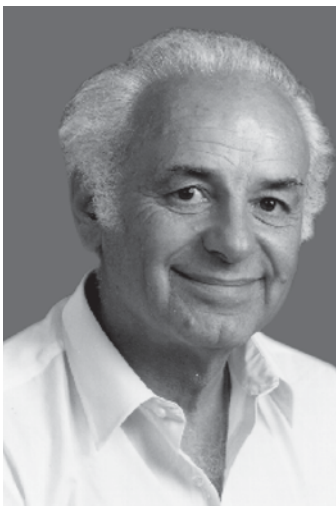
On Thursday afternoon October 9, in the back parking lot at Espanola High School, there was a presentation called the "Quick Connect Challenge." This presentation was to show students how to put on a seatbelt properly, but in a fun way. Students and teachers would get in a car, put their seatbelts on and raise their hands up until the instructor said "go," then they would unbuckle their seatbelts, get out of the car and run to the next seat and repeat. They were also timed to emphasize that clicking your seatbelt hardly takes any time. You should always wear your

seatbelt whenever a vehicle is in motion even if you're only traveling for a short distance because: 1) it can save your life, 2) it prevents injury, and 3) you can get charged for failure to wear a seatbelt.

After the Quick Click Challenge, Mr. Henry Girard a teacher at E.H.S. and Deputy Fire Chief, demonstrated what happens when you don't wear a seatbelt and if your feet are on the dashboard when you get in an accident and the air bags deploy. The whole presentation took about half an hour.

Rainbow District School Board Mourns Loss Of Long-Time Trustee Ernie Checkeris



trustee in 1945 in the days of one-room schoolhouses. He was a member of the Public School Section of the Unorganized Township of Dryden, in the Village of Wahnapiatae. He was elected to the Sudbury Board of Education when it was formed in 1969 through the amalgamation of 36 smaller school boards from across the region.

When the Espanola, Manitoulin Island and Sudbury Boards combined to become Rainbow District School Board in 1998, Ernie Checkeris was the first Chair of the new Board. He held the position of Chair many times throughout his tenure as a trustee.

Rainbow District School Board is mourning the loss of long-time trustee Ernie Checkeris. Ernie Checkeris, who passed away on October 6, 2014, was a trustee with Rainbow District School Board, the former Sudbury Board of Education and its predecessor boards for 55 years. He has the distinction of being one of the longest-serving trustees in Ontario.

"Ernie Checkeris was a pillar in the educational community, not only locally and provincially, but across Canada," said Rainbow District School Board Chair Doreen Dewar. On behalf of the Board, Chair Dewar extends her deepest sympathy to wife Muiriel MacLeod, also a long-time trustee, and the entire Checkeris family.

He served on the Hall-Dennis Commission that created the document "Living and Learning" which called for broad educational reforms. In recognition of his outstanding contribution as a trustee, the Sudbury Board of Education renamed a school in his honour in 1989. Ernie Checkeris Public School is located in New Sudbury.

Over the years, Ernie Checkeris was an important part of the evolution of education from the advent of computers and co-operative education, to the introduction of French Immersion and School Councils. He retired as a trustee in 2000.

Recipe

I had left over roast beef from supper the other night and wanted to use it up before it ended up green and hidden in the back of the fridge. It happens, and it was a good quality cut of beef so that would be a shame!

After some quick research I found a 5 star recipe for beef stroganoff using left over roast beef. If you don't have left over roast beef, the same recipe can be made with fresh strips of beef that you sauté first. I made it and allowed it to simmer on low for a while to combine the flavours and tenderize the beef. It's not the prettiest looking dish but the taste makes up for it and it's very easy to make. I had fresh parsley from the garden that I chopped and stirred in to add some colour and freshness. I served it over egg noodles with a side of buttered peas.



Leftover Roast Beef Stroganoff

- 2-3 cups cooked beef, julienned
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 cup of mushrooms, sliced
- 1 teaspoon vegetable oil
- 1 (10 ounce) can of mushroom soup
- ½ cup of milk (can add a bit more while cooking if you think it's too thick)
- 2 tablespoons of ketchup
- 1 tsp beef bouillon
- Pepper
- 2 tbsp sour cream (this was my addition for extra creaminess but it's optional)
- Fresh parsley, chopped fine (optional)

In a deep skillet or a saucepan, heat oil and sauté onions for 5 minutes. Add garlic and cook for 2 minutes longer, add the mushrooms and cook until tender. Add roast beef and cook until heated through. (If you are using uncooked beef, sauté it first and set aside. Then add it after the mushrooms are cooked). In a small bowl, mix soup, milk, ketchup and beef bouillon. Add this to the pan and bring it to just a boil, then reduce heat to a simmer. Add a sprinkle of pepper. If using sour cream, stir it in. Cook uncovered for 8 - 10 minutes or until flavours are blended. Serve over noodles or mashed potatoes.
