Town of Espanola And Domtar Settle Tax Issue Until 2016

In a press release issued Eventually, the province of Monday. September 15. Espanola Mayor Mike Lehoux said. "We are relieved to arrive at a resolution with Domtar Inc. This agreement will help to stabilize taxation and contribute to an economic, social and cultural climate conducive to growth."

"We are pleased to have reached this important agreement with the Town." said Scott Mosher, general manager of the Espanola pulp and paper mill. "We believe it is in our mutual interest to ensure a sustainable mill operation in Espanola and contribute to a sustainable community, and we believe this agreement accomplishes these objectives."

agreement The settles outstanding matters with respect to the mill's assessed value from 2009-2016 and industrial tax rates from 2013-2016.

It was just last year that the town was grappling with how to repay almost \$4 million in back taxes to the mill.

Ontario provided a one-time grant to the municipality and also allowed the heavy industrial tax rate to be adjusted to offset a portion of the amount owing. The Assessment Review Board's decision, which led to the repayment, covered the years 2009-2012. Speculation had been circulating as to whether or not Domtar would be looking for yet another property reassessment another four years, so the announcement of an agreement puts residents' minds at ease for a while longer.

Details of the resolution reached between the town and mill were not released because of other communities' on-going negotiations with Domtar Espanola Clerk Treasurer/Adminstrator Cvnthia Townsend "This is very good news for Espanola residents. We've been able to avoid costly litigation and are able to provide stability to taxpayers through to 2016 if not longer."

Recipe

- 1 can cream of mushroom soup
- 1/2 cup water

Brown meat in a small amount of oil on all sides. Sprinkle with pepper and place in a crock pot. Sprinkle the onion soup mix on top and then add the mushroom soup. Add the water to the pan you browned the meat in and use a whisk to get up all the drippings. Pour over the top of everything in the crock pot. Cook on High for 4-5 hours or Low for 8-10 hours. Serve with mashed potatoes.





Espanola Police Report

On July 18, 2014, the Espanola Police Service investigated the theft of "Buddy," a 7 ½ year old mix breed female dog that was taken from the bed of a truck in the Espanola Mall. Following the theft, Buddy's whereabouts were unknown, until August 24th, when her owner located her at a residence in the City of Greater Sudbury.

As a result of Buddy's recovery, a 42-year old female from Sudbury was charged with one count of Theft contrary to section 334 (b) of the Criminal Code. She will appear in Espanola Court on October 7, 2014, to answer to her charge.

On July 23, 2014, at 9:30 a.m., an officer responded to a complaint of a possible impaired driver traveling northbound on Highway 6 towards Espanola. The responding officer spotted the vehicle as it traveled on Highway 6 near Foster Drive, and began following the vehicle. The officer noted that in addition to driving approximately 30 km/h below the posted speed limit, the driver was also weaving within his lane. The officer stopped the vehicle, and the 48-year old male from Sudbury was found to be under the influence of alcohol; a subsequent breath test showed that his blood alcohol content was 239 mgs, or three times the legal limit. The driver was charged with Impaired Driving, and Impaired Driving Care or Control of a Motor Vehicle with Over 80 mgs. He will appear in Espanola Court on September 2, 2014 to answer to his charges.

Despite the risk of receiving heavy fines, and 7-day roadside licence suspensions, and vehicle impoundments, the Espanola Police Service continue to encounter driver's traveling well in excess of the posted speed limit.

On July 20, 2014 at 2:27 a.m., a 19-year old female from Azilda Ontario, was stopped on Centre Street near Queensway Street, traveling at 99 km/h in the posted 50 km/h Community Safety Zone. The female, who was one kilometer under being charged with Stunt Driving and having her licence suspended and vehicle impounded, was issued with a \$718.00 fine for Speeding.

On August 3, 2014 at 9:00 p.m., a 42-year old male from Etobicoke Ontario, was stopped on Highway 6 near Hopkins Hill Road for travelling at 141 km/h in the posted 80-km/h zone. The driver, although in excess of the limit required for Stunt Driving, received a break from the officer, and had his speeding charge reduced to 49 km/h over the posted limit. He received a \$359.00 fine.

On July 26, 2014 at 12:30 a.m., the Espanola Police Service were called to Read Street, to investigate mischief done to a vehicle. Within the preceding two hours, an unknown person had "tagged" the door of the vehicle in graffiti like fashion, with the letters "WHD." The letters appeared to have been written in black marker. Later at 11:30 a.m., police attended at a residence on John Street, and found that a second vehicle was "tagged" on the door with the letters "WHD."

At this time, there are no suspects in these two mischiefs, but police are asking anyone with information about the person(s) responsible, to call the Espanola Police Service at (705) 869-3251 or anonymously through Crime Stoppers at 1-800-461-4899.

Since July 25, 2014, the Espanola Police Service have charged 3 drivers with driving while under suspension, pursuant to the Highway Traffic Act.

On July 25, at 1:20 p.m., an Officer on routine patrol stopped a vehicle on Highway 6 for a speeding violation, and found the 40-year old male from North Bay was under suspension for unpaid fines. As a result, he was charged with Driving While under Suspension, and will appear in Espanola Court on September 11, 2014 to answer to his charges.

Later on July 25, at 5:14 p.m., the same officer stopped another vehicle on Centre Street for a speeding violation, and found the 51-year old male from Garson was a suspended driver, dating back to 2008. As a result, he was also charged with Driving While under Suspension, and will appear in Espanola Court on September 11, 2014 to answer to his charges

On August 7, at 8:50 a.m., an officer conducting traffic enforcement on Centre Street, observed a 25-year old resident of McKerrow operating a vehicle. The officer, knowing the male was a suspended driver, stopped the vehicle, and upon confirming that his licence was still suspended for unpaid fines, charged him with Driving While under Suspension. He will also appear in Espanola Court on September 11, 2014 to answer to his charges.
