ornament receives a special treat and is said to have good fortune in the coming year. (Pickle ornaments can be found at many stores as the tradition is becoming popular again)


- Sit around the tree with your family and read the Christmas Story before bed to remember the reason for the celebration.

Christmas Morning Breakfast

HAM AND EGG BREAKFAST CUPS WITH HASH BROWNS

- 8 slices of deli ham
- 4 tbsps shredded cheddar cheese
- 3 green onions, finely chopped
- 8 eggs
- 1/8 tsp pepper

HASH BROWNS

- 1 pound Idaho potatoes
- 2 green onions, thinly sliced
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil

Ham and Egg Cups:

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F. Coat 8 muffin cups with cooking spray. Set aside. Position 1 slice of ham in each of the muffin cups, doubling each slice over to insure that there are no holes in the bottom of the ham "cups." Sprinkle 1/2 tablespoon of the cheese and about 1/2 tablespoon green onions in the bottom of each cup. Place one raw egg in each ham cup. Sprinkle each egg lightly with pepper. Bake about 15 minutes or to desired degree of doneness. Carefully remove the egg cups using the ham to lift onto serving plates.

Hash Browns:

Peel potatoes. Grate them using the coarse side of the grater and squeeze out water. Place grated potatoes in a small bowl and toss with green onions, salt and pepper. Heat 1/2 tablespoon vegetable oil in a nonstick 10-inch skillet over medium-high heat until very hot. Place potato mixture in pan and flatten to cover bottom with a spatula. Cook for 7 minutes or until deep, golden brown. Place a dinner plate over skillet and flip them both over, so browned side of hash browns is facing up. Place remaining oil in skillet and reduce heat to medium. Carefully slide hash browns back into skillet and cook for an additional 6 minutes, or until deep golden brown. Remove from pan and cut into wedges.



Christmas Cookie Bark

- 14 whole Oreos, broken up (there's Christmas ones if you can find them)
- 1 1/2 cups pretzels, broken (long skinny ones work great)
- 1 cup Christmas coloured M&M's
- 1 lb white chocolate or almond bark
- Christmas colored sprinkles

First, line a baking sheet with waxed paper. Mix on the sheet the Oreos, pretzels and 3/4 cup of the M&M's. Melt the chocolate or bark in a microwave safe bowl for 1 1/2 minutes (melt 30 seconds at a time to avoid burning), stir, and continue melting in microwave for 30 seconds at a time until melted and smooth. Drizzle over the candy mixture and top with extra M&M's and sprinkles. Allow to dry at room temperature or in the refrigerator until hardened. Break into chunks. Can be wrapped up in decorative bags and given as gifts.

Holiday Ribbon Plates

This is a fun and simple way to dress up a paper plate when you share your Holiday treats.

- Paper plates, any colour or size (you can use plastic plates, but they're harder to punch)
- Hole punch
- Ribbon, craft ribbon or curling ribbon
- Treats

Punch holes about every inch all the way around the edge of the plate. Then pick a spot to start and thread the ribbon through each hole. There are a few ways you can thread the ribbon. It can be up and down or around and around. Both look pretty. Once the ribbon has been through each hole, make sure both ends are even to tie it together in a bow. Now fill the plates with some of your favourite treats and they're ready for family and friends!

4 For The Core Before You Hit The Door

The holiday season is full of food, fun, friends, and family. It can also feel like a time of failure ... mostly due to overindulgence. This Christmas and New Year, don't let your less-than-diligent holiday dietary habits ruin your party. Before you dress up to go out, take 20 minutes to do yourself and your body a favour by engaging in these simple 4 For The Core exercises:

1) Body weight squats – keeping your back as straight as you can and putting your weight on your heels, pretend to sit in a chair. When you've achieve a 90 degree angle, come back up and repeat. Do 10 reps and 3 sets.


2) Plank – get down on the floor on your belly. Extend your legs and come up on to

your toes, then either extend your arms as if to do a push up or bend your arms with your forearms flat on the floor. Push your whole body up from the floor, back flat, for 30 seconds to a minute, or longer if you are able.

3) Crunches or sit ups – either do these straight legged or with knees bent. Do 25-30 reps and 3 sets.

4) Push ups – arms a little more than shoulder-width apart, legs straight or on your knees, depending on your fitness level. Do 10-15 reps and 3 sets.

Doing just these four exercises before heading out the door will tighten you up and make you feel like a million bucks. Enjoy!

Cookies for Santa Plate

- White plate (ceramic or oven ware)
- Sharpie markers

Wash the plate. Using a pencil draw out your design. It's easy to wipe off if you make a mistake. Go over your design with sharpie markers. If you do make a mistake while using the sharpie, you can use soap and water and scrub it off. Write the date on the back of the plate if you want to keep it as a keepsake from year to year. Once you are done your masterpiece, bake in a preheated oven at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Plate will be hot to handle so be careful removing from the oven. Plate can be hand washed but do not scrub or put through the dishwasher.

Drive Sober, Drive Safe This Holiday Season

The Ontario Provincial Police will be out in force during the 2014 holiday season to prevent unnecessary deaths and injuries by encouraging all motorists to drive responsibly. The Festive R.I.D.E. (Reduce Impaired Driving Everywhere) campaign will run until January 2, 2015. While the number of irresponsible motorists who continue to drive while impaired by drugs and/or alcohol is small, the carnage and harm they can cause is impossible to calculate. The OPP is calling on everyone to never drive impaired and to discourage others from doing so. If someone you encounter insists on driving impaired, call 911 so the police service of jurisdiction can take the driver off the road before someone is harmed.

"The OPP goal is to get through the holiday season without losing a single life to impaired driving. We will use a combination of public education and focussed enforcement to drive home the message that impaired

driving on Ontario roads is never acceptable," said OPP Commissioner Vince Hawkes. The OPP is also reminding drivers that there is no safe amount of alcohol consumption when driving. This is evident every year in the number of Warn Range Suspensions the OPP issues to drivers whose Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) falls within the 0.05 to 0.08 range. Those who are issued a Warn Range Suspension immediately lose their licence at the roadside and are not allowed to drive from that point on for a minimum of three days.

The OPP is asking the public to join in on the conversation on Facebook during the campaign. Share your thoughts, stories and personal experiences with impaired drivers/driving, as well as any positive stories about people you encounter over the holidays whose actions and decisions about drinking and driving contribute to a safe holiday season on our roads.

Festive Cranberry Fizz

Makes about 18 servings

For the Cranberry Rosemary Syrup:

- 2 1/2 cups fresh cranberries (12-ounce bag)
- 2 ounces fresh ginger, skin on and sliced (about 1/2 cup)
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 3 cups cranberry juice cocktail, no sugar added
- 2 large sprigs fresh rosemary



For the Cranberry Punch Mix:

- 1/4 ounce black tea leaves (decaffeinated if desired)
- 4 cups boiling water
- 3 cups Cranberry Rosemary Syrup
- 1/4 cup pomegranate molasses, without any added sweeteners
- 1/4 cup non-alcoholic orange bitters, such as Fee Brothers

To serve:

- 4 to 7 cups tonic water
- 2 cups gin, optional

To make the Cranberry Rosemary Syrup: Blitz the cranberries and ginger in a food processor until roughly chopped, then mix with the sugar and cranberry juice cocktail in a 3-quart saucepan. Bring to a boil, then add the rosemary. Lower the heat and simmer for 5 minutes. Let cool, ideally overnight in the refrigerator. Strain through a fine mesh strainer and discard the solids. You should have about 3 cups of thin syrup. Syrup can be refrigerated for up to 1 week or frozen.

To prepare Cranberry Punch Mix: Place the tea leaves in a large heatproof bowl. Pour the boiling water over them and steep for 3 minutes. Strain out the leaves, and whisk in the Cranberry Rosemary Syrup, pomegranate molasses, and orange bitters. Refrigerate the punch mix for at least 4 hours, or overnight.

Non-Alcoholic Cranberry Fizz

To serve a non-alcoholic drink, stir the punch mix together with 6 to 7 cups tonic water. Serve over ice. Makes about 18 6-ounce servings.

Gin Cranberry Fizz

To serve an alcoholic drink, stir the punch mix together with 2 cups gin and 4 to 5 cups tonic water. Serve over ice. Makes about 18 6-ounce servings.

Holiday Cocktails

Cranberry Vodka Punch

- 1 qt. cranberry juice
- 2 c. pineapple juice
- 1 can defrosted limeade concentrate
- 2 c. vodka
- 3 12 oz cans of ginger ale
- Fresh cranberries for garnish
- Combine all ingredients in a punch bowl or pitcher and serve cold.



Christmas Tree Cocktail:

- 3 oz pomegranate juice (or cranberry)
- 2 oz gin
- 1 oz simple syrup
- (Simple Syrup- 1 cup of water and 1 cup of sugar. Brought to a boil until sugar has dissolved. (Allow to cool.)
- Lime juice (juice from 1-2 wedges will do)
- A few fresh mint leaves
- Pomegranate seeds & lime wheel for garnish
- Muddle mint leaves with simple syrup at the bottom of your glass. Add ice, then add gin, juice, and lime juice. Stir, and garnish with lime wheels and pomegranate seeds.
