Sables-Spanish Residents To Council: We Want Vote On Massey Area Museum



By Chloe Kneer – More than 120 concerned Sables-Spanish Rivers Township taxpayers turned out for a meeting in Massey on November 23 to discuss whether or not the township should assume ownership and operation of the Massey Area Museum. Mayor Les Gamble did his best to maintain decorum at the meeting, but debate was heated over the fate of the museum, which is in dire financial shape.

Questions were asked about the true operating costs and annual revenue that the museum generates. The museum board was ill-prepared to answer the inquiries, despite the mandate that the museum undergo an independent audit every year. What is clear is that if the township decides to take over the museum, Sables-Spanish property owners will face at least a 1.5% tax increase, which amounts to roughly \$40/

Massey 4-H members ventured south to the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair in Toronto to compete in Go for the Gold and dance competitions over the past two weekends. Both groups were successful in competitions that attract participants and fans from across the province and country.

On November 7, members of the Go for the Gold Team represented Region 1 in the provincial finals, placing sixth. Team members Faith Emiry, Aric Emiry, Jay Preseau, Matthew Mailloux, and spare Josh Sedlezky all made their provincial Go for the Gold debut this year and did an excellent job representing their club and region. The Go for the Gold is a quiz-show team challenge. Ouestion material includes 4-H, politics, agriculture, current affairs and more. Massey members are hoping to earn the opportunity to compete again next year as the representative for Northern Ontario.

On November 15, members of the Square Dance club competed in the Junior Square Dance Competition, also at the Royal. They

placed third overall despite being the youngest set in the competition. With an age range of 12 to 17, the Massey group competed against university students from McGill and the University of Guelph. The dancers performed well during the compulsory portion, where a caller creates a call on the spot for the dancers to perform. Then, they performed their optional dance with great accuracy sealing their 3rd place finish.

year per household. Many expressed their disapproval (especially those residing outside of the town of Massey) of the prospect of having to pay for a building whose \$1.2 million price tag didn't benefit local retailers or contractors.

For those reasons and the feeling that the current council has many who were directly involved in or supported the process of bringing the museum to fruition, residents would like to see a plebiscite on the matter. They simply feel that the councillors who aided in the decision to build the museum have a conflict of interest and are not suited to make the decision on whether or not the township should take over. Mayor Gamble said that any decision would likely include a taxpayer vote on the matter.

From the numbers that were presented, the museum has approximate operating costs of \$55,000 per year. Those include property taxes of \$25,000 (40% of which is rebated), hydro costs of \$11,000, mortgage payments of \$8.000, an auditor's fee of \$2.200. elevator maintenance of \$1,000, insurance of \$4,900 and telephone and internet costs

of \$1,600. Only 524 people toured the museum on a paid admission last year, however over 2,000 had stopped in because the museum also houses the tourist information centre. LAMBAC holds the mortgage on the property, which currently stands at \$112,500.

Suggestions were made as to how the museum could generate more revenue. Business owner Laura Courtemanche put forth the idea of renting 1/3 of the floor space and having current board members step aside to make way for "younger legs" to take the museum into the future. To that end, the museum board began taking names and numbers of those who wish to form a committee to brainstorm further about the direction of the museum.

The museum will be hosting an open house on Friday, December 4 as part of Christmas celebrations in Massey. The public is invited to tour the museum, grab some refreshments and offer input. Before the meeting wrapped up, Sables councillor Harry Hobbs stated that a decision would likely have to be made by spring due to the ongoing financial struggles.
