Seven years ago, Espanola High School teacher Dean Riggs sent a letter to Manitoulin-Algoma-Kapuskasing NDP MP Carol Hughes detailing a request for a Canada flag in every classroom.

"The idea was to instill a sense of honour and pride in our country especially at a time when we have lost so many young Canadian lives in the war in Afghanistan," Riggs says. "When I wrote Mrs.Hughes and asked her about displaying a Canadian flag in every EHS classroom, she said it would be difficult and would take many years, but it was possible."

# Recipe

This is a scrumptious taco dip perfect for New Year's Eve celebrations or any other party or celebration. You can use all low-fat ingredients and it will still be delicious. As far as I'm concerned the toppings listed are a



suggestion. You can add or omit any toppings that you normally enjoy with tacos. Chopped green onions, red peppers and green olives would also be delicious. Serve with baked tortilla chips for dipping.

## Taco Dip

- 1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup cottage cheese
- 1 (16 ounce) container sour cream
- 1 (1.25 ounce) package taco seasoning mix
- 1/4 head iceberg lettuce rinsed, dried, and shredded or chopped fine • 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese
- 3 chopped tomatoes (omit the juicy, seedy part to keep dip from being runny)
- 1 green bell pepper, chopped
- 1 (2.25 ounce) can black olives, drained

Bring cream cheese to room temperature. With a mixer, combine cream cheese, sour cream, cottage cheese and taco seasoning. (If you can do this at least 4 hours ahead or the day before serving; it allows the seasoning to blend and marinate well). Spread this mixture in a 9-inch (or a little larger) round serving dish. Top the mixture with lettuce, Cheddar cheese,

tomatoes, bell pepper and black olives.


