*By Chloe Kneer* – The local Sudbury chapter of Habitat For Humanity was established in 1995. Since then, the organization has built five homes in the region. Going into its twentieth year, plans are in the final stages for the first Habitat home to be built in Espanola on a donated lot on Adelaide Street. Ellen Frood, CEO of the newly amalgamated Ontario Gateway North Habitat For Humanity says, “Going forward, we hope to begin building one or two homes a year, many of them in smaller communities, like Espanola.” Frood went on to explain all of the benefits of home ownership for underprivileged families, “CMHC (Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation) did surveys



in 2006 and 2013 and what they've found is that children's grades in school go up after moving into their own homes. They participated more in extra-curricular activities, parents volunteered more. Families were happier and healthier."

There are three basic criteria for qualifying to purchase a Habitat home (yes, purchase, the homes are not given to

families): 1) need – health needs, children with special needs, currently living in substandard housing, etc.; 2) ability to pay – income must be verified and deemed to be sustainable for at least the next three years going forward; 3) willingness to partner – families must put in 500 hours of "sweat equity" on the project and will be educated on home ownership and

how it differs from renting, among other things. There is an income threshold when applicants are considered. For example, a single parent with one child cannot earn more than \$26,000/year. A two parent family with four children cannot have more than \$60,000 in annual income.

Habitat For Humanity's goal is to end the cycle of generational poverty by putting families into decent, safe, affordable homes. As Frood puts it, "It is not a hand out, it is a hand up. Unfortunately, though, many times people who would qualify for a home are nervous, or embarrassed, about coming forward to apply because they are afraid of how the community will perceive them. However, if you're a single parent making \$26,000 a year or less, a bank will not lend to you. Since we hold the interest-free mortgages for our clients, we can do things the banks can't."

Speaking of mortgages, an applicant's mortgage payment is determined by how much they earn and will be capped at 25% of their income. Habitat homes are around 1000 square feet and exceed Ontario Building Code regulations

and are Tarion warrantied. Frood says that materials are purchased and all labour is volunteer, so a home can be constructed for approximately \$50,000. Lise Rheault, Executive Director of the Sudbury District Chapter says, "There's nothing better than handing over those keys to a family so that they can move into their new home."

The hope is that the Espanola lot can be rezoned to accommodate a duplex. That way, two local families will benefit. Once that detail is squared away and volunteers are secured, breaking ground can begin (anticipated for this spring). Habitat homes are considered "slow builds," meaning they take about six months to complete. The organization has several committees for which residents can volunteer, including fundraising, marketing, Adopt-A-Day, build, and family selection. Students are welcome, but if they would like to be on the build committee, they must be at least 16 years old. ## Recipe

I almost feel silly putting this recipe in my column yet using this method; it's some of the best asparagus I've ever made. I'm lucky enough to have an old crop of asparagus in my vegetable garden that produces an abundance of asparagus every spring. I thank the previous homeowners because if you are a gardener you know that it takes years for planted asparagus to produce enough stalks of asparagus for a meal. I have cooked it many ways; steaming it in my steamer, baking it, pureed in soup but the following recipe has been my favourite so far because it turns out perfectly; not mushy or overcooked, buttery and delicious. It's ridiculously easy and some of you may be saying, "duh, that's how I always make it", but this is for those who haven't had it this way. I can't wait to try this with my fresh asparagus in the spring!

### The Best Asparagus in Under 10 Minutes

- |   |                                     |
|---|-------------------------------------|
| • 1 lb. asparagus, washed               | • 1/4 tsp garlic salt               |
| • 1 cup water                           | • 1/4 tsp fresh ground black pepper |
| • 1/2 to 1 tbsp butter                  | • 2 tbsp grated parmesan cheese     |
| • A handful of shredded parmesan cheese |                                     |

Chop the woody bottoms off of your asparagus. Put asparagus in a pan wide enough to hold them without bending their heads. They can overlap each other if they need to. Add 1 cup of water and place on high heat on the stove. Cook, covered, on high for 4-6 minutes, depending on the thickness, until asparagus is tender, yet still nice and firm. Carefully shake your spears back and forth halfway through your cook time. You will have steam whistling out of the lid. When the asparagus is finished cooking, discard remaining liquid. (You will be sautéing the asparagus a bit more in the next step, so in this step, err on the side of under cooking so you don't end up with mushy asparagus). Place butter, garlic salt, pepper, and grated Parmesan over your spears, and sauté them over medium high heat until butter is melted and the Parmesan begins to get gooey and lightly browned, but not burned. Remove from heat and place on serving dish. Sprinkle with a handful of shredded Parmesan.

### Espanola High School Student Wins at I.C.E. Challenge

McKerrow resident and Grade 12 Espanola High School student Jimmy Stata recently took part in and won the award for Most Creative Product at the I.C.E. (Innovative, Creative, and Entrepreneurial) Challenge. Stata, along with about fifty other Rainbow Schools students, attended the event on January 9 in Sudbury. The challenge was sponsored by The Centre for Excellence in Mining Innovation.

Stata calls his winning invention the “Able Controller.” Essentially, it is a device to assist physically disabled gamers. Stata himself is an avid gamer, and says he was watching YouTube videos one day when he came across a video about physically disabled gamers. “I realized that something could happen to anyone and that they may not be able to do all the things they used to do,” he says. “That is in addition to the people

who are born with difficulties.” Based on that, Stata decided to do more research into existing devices that help gamers with physical challenges. “I found a few, but my invention helps in a different way,” he explains.

The details surrounding the Able Controller are closely guarded, as Stata hopes to move forward with producing a prototype of the controller and securing a patent. “At the I.C.E. Challenge, I was approached by one of the visitors, who asked me if I would like to pursue the production of a prototype,” he says. Stata plans to spend the next year saving money and applying for funding through programs to help get his idea off the ground. He is also busy filming “behind the scenes” at the movie set for the locally produced Aboriginal film The Darkest Dawn. Down the road, he hopes to attend acting school in Toronto.
