**Jumping Into 2015:** Caroline Ehrhardt Sets Goal To Compete At Pan Am Games In Toronto This Summer



Chloe Kneer -Twenty-four centimetres (or just under 9 ½ inches)... it doesn't seem like a very long distance, but when you are a world-class athlete like Espanola's Caroline Ehrhardt, it could mean the difference, and distance, between making the Pan Am Games this summer or not.

Ehrhardt has big goals set for 2015 and will be training up to four hours a day in addition to competing nearly every weekend, and attending university. Her ultimate goal is to be the first female to represent Canada in triple jump at the Olympics. In order to attain this goal, Ehrhardt is working hard towards adding at least 24 centimetres to her best-ever jump. She must jump the team standard

of 13.30 metres in order to compete in the Pan Am Games. Ehrhardt's interest in track and field began at an early age. She says, "When I was in the second grade, my class was going on a field trip to the science center on the same day as our school's track and field day. When I learned of the conflict, I was not happy. This is odd, because before this I had never even done track and field before. It could very well be that I absolutely hated science, but either way, I really wanted to stay behind from the trip and participate in track and field day. When I explained my predicament to my parents, they assured me they would sort something out with my teacher. Sure enough, the next day as my classmates were happily learning about gravity at the science centre, I was about to test it out myself as I stood on the runway about to jump for the first time in my life. 'Jump as far as you can into the sand, explained a teacher. I sprinted down the runway and catapulted myself into the air. I haven't looked back, or down, since."

Her dedication to her sport has won her many accolades, including winning the Canadian National Track and Field Championships in triple jump the past four consecutive years. As one can imagine, training,

competing, and attending school is a huge commitment, both time-wise and financially. Ehrhardt has been fortunate enough to train in warm weather climates in order to maximize her training season and lower the risk of injury, but attending training camps comes at a cost. It is nearly impossible for her to work, given her hectic schedule, so she is asking for support in the continuation of her dreams. If a person or public body that files an appeal of a decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers in respect of the proposed consent does not make written submission to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before it gives or refuses to give a provisional consent, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss the appeal.

If a person or public body does not make oral submissions at a public meeting or make written submissions to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before the zoning bylaw is passed, the person or public body is not entitled to appeal the decision of the Council of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers to the Ontario Municipal Board, and may not be added as a part to the hearing of an appeal before the Ontario Municipal Board unless, in the opinion of the board, there are reasonable grounds to do so.

#### **Espanola Police Report**

On December 6, 2014, a member of the Espanola Police Service observed a male he knew to be a suspended driver, operating a motor vehicle on Centre Street in Espanola. The officer stopped the driver, and after confirming that he was the subject of two separate Highway Traffic Act suspensions, the male was arrested. During a search of the vehicle, the officer recovered a small quantity of Marihuana, 16 Percocet pills, and Canadian currency. As a result of the traffic stop, a 35-year old Espanola resident was charged

- Driving Under Suspension, section 53 of the Highway Traffic Act (2 counts)
- Possession of a Controlled Substance, section 4(1) of the Controlled Drugs

Substances Act;

- Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking, section 5(2) of the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act; and
- Possession of Property Obtained by Crime, section 354(1) of the Criminal

In addition to facing provincial and criminal charges, his vehicle was impounded for a period of 7 days.

He appeared in Espanola court on January 6 to answer to his charge.

On December 14, 2014 at 7:00 a.m., Emergency Services, including EMS and the Espanola Police Service, responded to a complaint of an injured female walking on Centre Street. Upon arrival, a female, in the accompaniment of a male, was found to be suffering from a contusion on her forehead. Police spoke to the injured female, who alleged that earlier in the morning, she and her estranged boyfriend left a friend's house, and while walking, began to argue. During the argument, she alleged that her estranged boyfriend kicked her, and head-butted her, then held her against her will in a motel room for a period of two hours. During the time she was held in the motel room, she alleged that she was threatened and choked. As a result of the incident, a 23-year old male from Espanola was arrested and charged with:

- Domestic Assault, section 266 of the Criminal Code;
- Forcible Confinement, section 279(2) of the Criminal Code;
- Utter Threats, section 264.1(1)(a) of the Criminal Code;
- Choking, section 246(a) of the Criminal Code; and Fail to Comply with Probation Order, section 733.1(1)(1) of the Criminal

The accused appeared in Sudbury Bail Court on December 15, 2014, to answer to his charges.

The Espanola Police Service are investigating a theft from a shed that occurred between November 1 and December 5, 2014, in the Elizabeth Street area, and are asking for the public's assistance in identifying the culprit(s), or locating the blue furniture dolly, and/or 16 foot aluminum ladder that were stolen. At this time, there are no suspects in this theft.

On December 16, 2014 at 12:45 a.m., a member of the Espanola Police Service stopped a motor vehicle on Mead Blvd, Espanola, and found that the female driving the vehicle was the subject of a Highway Traffic Act licence suspension for unpaid fines. The female readily admitted to the officer that she knew she was a suspended driver.

As a result of the traffic stop, the 43-year old from Espanola, was charged with Driving Under Suspension contrary to section 53 of the Highway Traffic Act. She will appear in Espanola court on March 12, 2015, to answer to her

Upon conviction, she could be subject to the following fines, as set out in the Highway Traffic Act:

- For a first offence, to a fine of not less than \$1000 and not more than \$5000;
- For each subsequent offence, to a fine of not less than \$2000 and not more than \$5000;
- Or to imprisonment for a term of not more than six months, or to both.

On December 19, 2014 at 10:00 p.m., the Espanola Police Service received a call about a pickup truck that had slid into the ditch on Queensway Street, near Barber Street, Espanola.

Upon police arrival, the pickup truck had already been pulled from the ditch by another vehicle, but while investigating the driver of the truck, the officer found that the male driver was never issued a driver's licence, permitting him to operate the vehicle on the roadway.

As a result, a 20-year old from Espanola was charged with Driving a Motor Vehicle with No Licence, contrary to section 32(1) of the Highway Traffic Act. The offence carries a fine of \$325.00.

#### Recipe

# Easy Homemade Spaghetti Sauce

- 1 pound of ground beef
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 2 cans (15 ounces each) tomato sauce
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 teaspoon dried basil
- <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> teaspoon dried oregano
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- ½ to 1 teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon pepper
- ½ cup parmesan cheese
- \* Chopped peppers, celery and mushrooms can also be added if desired

In a heavy pot, cook the ground beef until meat is browned. Drain off fat. Add the onion and cook for a couple of minutes. Add the rest of the ingredients, bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 1 hour, stirring occasionally. Remove bay leaf and serve over hot spaghetti.

#### Kids Korner

Make these colourful sculptures in the house and place outside in your snowy back yard.

#### **Sculpture: Rainbow Ice Creations**

- Food colouring in colours of your choice
- Water
- Plastic containers in different shapes (such as yogurt)
- Small plastic or paper cups (one for each color)
- Cookie sheet
- Old towel(s)



Fill cups about 3/4 full with tap water. Add a few drops of food colour to each cup and mix (red in one, blue in another, etc.) Place plastic containers on counter. Pour one colour into each container, filling about 1/3 full. You may choose yellow for one container and red in another, for example. Place containers on a level surface in the freezer for about an hour or so, long enough for the liquid to harden. Next, take the containers out of the freezer and pour on another layer with a contrasting color. Freeze again and repeat this process until containers are full and frozen solid. Remove containers from the freezer and allow to sit at room temperature just long enough to loosen them so your sculptures can be removed. Layer a cookie sheet with an old towel or two. Remove ice sculptures from their containers and place onto towel(s). Place your sculptures outside in the cold to admire daily!

## **Domtar And Local Air Quality**

By Chloe Kneer - Domtar Espanola recently filed an application with the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change (MOECC) with respect to the mill's impact on air quality. The MOECC oversees the regulation of air quality in Ontario. There is a general air standard as it applies to industry, but if a certain sector cannot meet the general air standards, they may apply sector-based technical standard, if it is available.

Domtar has requested to register for Total Reduced Sulphur (TRS) compounds and Acrolein. Registration to the Technical Standards Registry is a compliance approach that requires that the company demonstrate compliance on an ongoing basis through applicable technical standard requirements set out in the Pulp and Paper - Industry Standard. It may require modifications such as process changes or

additions of new equipment. Technical standards ensure that facilities are reducing impacts on an airshed by installing best available technology. This means that this facility is doing its share to reduce impacts on the airshed.

In Domtar's case, they are proposing to register the Espanola Mill to the Pulp and Paper - Air Pollution (Industry Standard). Domtar's application is now posted on the Environmental Registry. The public may go online to view and comment on the application. The comment period closes on January 21. All comments received by the public will be considered as part of the decisionmaking process.
