We've had so much rain the Pan Am rowing events in St. Catharines have been moved from the overflowing Royal Canadian Henley Course to Highway 406.

Recipe

A hot, creamy, cheesy, crab dip, served in little, crunchy, tortilla bowls that are delicious and sure to impress guests. If you have a hard time cutting the circles out with a cookie cutter, kitchen scissors make the task easier. I love the filling and think that if time is limited you could also make it in a small dish, cook it in the oven, and serve with crackers.



Hot Crab Dip in a Cup

- ❖ 1 package of 10 inch tortillas
- ❖ 1 package cream cheese, softened
- ❖ 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- ❖ 1/2 cup cheddar cheese, shredded
- ❖ 1/2 small onion, grated or 1 green onion, chopped
- ❖ 1 tsp mustard powder
- ❖ The juice of 1/4 a lemon
- ❖ 1/4 tsp salt
- ❖ 2 cans of crab meat, drained
- ❖ 2 green onions, thinly sliced

Preheat oven to 350°F. Stamp circles out of the tortillas with a 4 inch cookie cutter. (Approx 20 – 24 circles). If you are having trouble cutting through with a cookie cutter, you can use kitchen scissors to cut them out. Combine cream cheese, mayonnaise, cheddar, onion, mustard, lemon, and salt in a bowl. Stir until incorporated. Add crab meat, and gently fold. One by one, line each cup of a muffin tin with a tortilla round and fill with two tablespoons of crab mixture. Bake for 12 minutes until bubbly, and slightly brown on top. Garnish with sliced green onions.

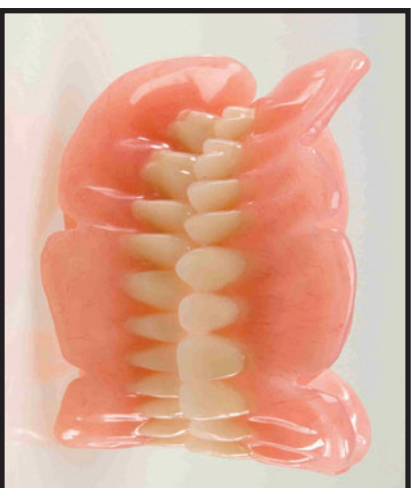
