I'm not sold on 'nakationing.' About



Espanola Service Review: Interim Report

By Chloe Kneer - Chas Anselmo from **KPMG** presented the preliminary of findings Espanola's service delivery review last Tuesday before council and interested members of the public. Anselmo said the report is about 80% complete shows an average increase in taxation of 9% over the last five years, most of that money being spent increasing policing on costs and other protective services. During the same time period (2010-2014), the budgets for planning and development and health and social services have seen the greatest decreases, by 11% and 9% respectively.

The report highlights a few ways that the Town of Espanola can further decrease costs, including sharing building inspection and fire services with other municipalities. Anselmo said there is no limit to what municipalities can share services for, and that it is suggested that everything. including administrative support land

planning also be considered. He stated that 92% of municipalities participate in one form or another of sharing services.

The report also suggests that increasing user fees for the recreation complex (pool in particular) for non-residents would help recover taxation subsidies. Statistics show that 75% of the users of the pool are from out of town; the largest group being First Nations.

Espanola residents are invited to attend one of two public consultation sessions being held on Wednesday, July 8. The first session is 2:00 - 4:00 p.m. and then again from 7.00 - 9:00 p.m. at the Espanola complex bar side auditorium. The sessions will allow residents the opportunity to discuss municipal services with KPMG. If you are unable to attend, but wish to provide comments writing, check the Around&About Facebook page for contact information for KPMG. The final report delivery date is vet to be scheduled.

Work is progressing on the revitalization of the Espanola High School site to accommodate two distinct schools - A.B. Ellis Public School (K to Grade 8) and Espanola High School (Grades 9 to 12). Trustees received a construction update at the Strategic Planning Committee meeting on June 9.

"We received Ministry of Education approval to maintain the existing footprint for the building. which means there will be more space for both schools," said Director of Education Norm Blaseg. He added, "This has provided greater flexibility in the design to accommodate students Kindergarten Grade 8 and Grades 9 to 12. Our goal is to maximize the use of space while ensuring that all students continue to have access to the best of 2016-2017.

programming possible in quality school facilities." Grade 9 to 12 students will move into newly renovated facilities when classes resume this fall. The secondary portion of the revitalization project includes four science labs, a welding shop, six new classrooms and an upgraded library. main entrance. lobby. gym and parking area will be completed over the summer in time for school start up.

Renovations to accommodate A.B. Ellis Public School within the Espanola High School site will begin this summer, including work on the play area, and continue throughout the 2015-2016 school year.
