Project Zero Aims To Reduce Fire And Carbon Monoxide Deaths


Union Gas is partnering with the Fire Marshal's Public Fire Safety Council just in time for winter to provide 15 Ontario fire departments with a total of 500 combination smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, to be distributed to residents. The Espanola Fire Department recently took delivery of 33 of the detectors to give away. Project Zero is the name of the initiative, which is an education program to remind the public of the importance of having a smoke detector outside of every bedroom and carbon monoxide detectors in homes that use fuel burning

heating systems. Fuel burning heating systems include natural gas, propane, oil, wood or pellet stoves.

The beauty of the combination units that the Espanola Fire Department is giving away is that they come with a 10 year lithium ion battery. Fire Chief Mike Pichor reminds the public that the department conducts free home inspections of smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. To schedule, call 705-869-3888. because of Grant Eccleston, no senior has ever paid for this meal. It includes a full turkey supper with all the trimmings, dessert, coffee and tea. I estimate that over the years he has generously given us close to 4,000 meals free.

Paul Zahorec was my kitchen crew chief when the idea surfaced. We decided to contact local businesses to see if they would contribute to this cause to help the club keep the cost down to a minimum. When we approached Grant we could not believe what he wanted to donate. Basically he donated all the food! This was to feed 230 seniors plus about 20-30 helpers at the supper. All the turkey, stuffing, potatoes, gravy, and vegetables would be given to us! Not only that, but the meat was all cut up for us as it had been prepared in his kitchen. In January of each year I would call him and he would

say, "Just fax me what you need Dario and it will be taken care of." Grant did this gesture for 15 years before his recent untimely passing. The generosity of this man was incredible.

The Lions were unable to thank Grant as he did not want recognition of any sort. He was never a member of our club, but we decided to give him an honour guard at his funeral for all of the assistance he gave us over the years.

The supper has been a huge success due to the contributions of many people, including Lions members and businesses, however it could not have occurred without the generosity of this wonderful man. The Espanola Lions Club would like to extend our heartfelt condolences to Louise and his family and wish them thoughts and prayers into the future. Best wishes.

The ones they left behind faced additional hardships, such as working in factories and volunteering long hours to the services and organizations that supported their troops.



Recipe

Shepherd's Pie is a classic dish and everyone makes their own version. It's one of those versatile recipes where you can use different types of beef, vary the vegetables used, and add or not add cheese. My version is quick and simple, and



another great way to use ground beef. One of my son's friends, who often stayed with us when the kids were younger, always requested I add cream corn. So now it's part of the recipe, and I think of him every time I make it. It does keep it from being too dry, but can be omitted if desired. This dish is also a great way to use up left overs if you happen to have gravy and mashed potatoes in your fridge from a previous meal, just omit the packaged gravy.

Mother May I's Simple Shepherd's Pie

- ✤ 1 lb of ground beef
- ✤ ½ onion, chopped
- 1/2 cup frozen peas
- ✤ ½ tsp Garlic powder
- 1 package of brown gravy mix, plus water
- Freshly ground pepper.
- ✤ 1 large can of cream corn
- ✤ 4 large potatoes, peeled and cut into chunks
- 1/4 cup-1/2 cup milk
- ✤ 1 heaping tbsp. of butter
- ✤ Grated cheddar cheese to cover

Boil potatoes in water until cooked and fork tender. Drain and mash. Add butter and milk (adding ¹/₄- ¹/₂ cup, depending on the consistency of the potato). Mash them and stir them with your masher or spoon to make them fluffy .Meanwhile brown ground beef in a skillet with the onion. Drain off the fat. Add the garlic powder. Stir in the brown gravy mix plus the amount of water stated on the package. Add the peas. Stir well and allow to boil. Add some freshly ground pepper. Turn down heat and let simmer until thickened. Spray a medium sized casserole dish with non- stick spray. First add the ground beef mixture to the dish. Pour a can of cream corn across the top of the ground beef. Spread the mashed potatoes across to cover the top of the casserole. Top with desired amount of grated cheese. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes or until bubbly around the edges.
