## Old-Fashion Decorating

#### **Pomanders**

Pomanders have been used to decorate at Christmas since the Middle Ages. To make a pomander you can use an orange, apple, lemon or lime, along with cloves. You will also need some traditional holiday spices like nutmeg, cinnamon and ginger. Mix the spices together in a bowl. Push the cloves in the fruit; covering it completely. Roll it in the spices, leave it in the spice bowl and place it in a dark, cool place to dry out. Check it every day to see if it has dried. Re-roll it in the spices each day to maximize the amount of fragrance it absorbs. Once it has dried, place them in a bowl as decor and tie holiday ribbon on each one for an added festive touch.



#### Popcorn and Cranberry Garland

Few things conjure up an image of an old-fashion Christmas like a popcorn and cranberry garland. It is easy to make. All you have to do is make plain, unbuttered popcorn and whole cranberries. Use a sewing needle and thread to string the popcorn and cranberries. You can string more popcorn than cranberries because is more economical; for example, you can string six popcorns, then use a red cranberry and repeat the pattern.

# Traditional Christmas Craft



This recipe is meant to be used to make ornaments on wreaths, gifts or to hang on Christmas trees. If fragrance starts to fade, drop a little cinnamon oil on ornament.

#### Scented Applesauce-Cinnamon Ornaments

- 3 cups applesauce
- 3 cups ground cinnamon

Mix applesauce and cinnamon together until it is thick enough to hold a form when cut into cookie cutter shapes. Flatten the mixture on a flat surface and cut into cookie cutter shapes. Place cookie shapes on a cookie sheet to dry for 3 to 4 days depending on the size and thickness of the cookies. If using as a hanging ornament, make hole with toothpick or a straw before drying.


## Traditional Christmas Craft



#### Salt Dough for Ornaments (decorative, not edible)

- 4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 cup salt
- 1 1/2 cups warm water

Preheat oven to 300 degrees F (165 degrees C). Mix flour and salt well. Gradually add water, stirring with a large spoon. Finish mixing with hands. Knead until soft and pliable. Roll out on floured surface about 1/8 inch  $-\frac{1}{4}$  inch thick. Cut shapes out with cookie cutters. Place on cookie sheets. With a straw make a hole in the top of the ornament for hanging. Bake at 300 degrees F (165 degrees C) until hard, about 1 hour. Decorate with paint and varnish to preserve.

- <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> cup butter, softened
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 ½ cups flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- ½ tsp salt

Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs and vanilla. Beat until light and fluffy. Combine flour, baking powder and salt. Gradually add to creamed mixture. Mix well. Chill 1 hour until firm. On a lightly floured surface, roll out dough ¼ inch thick. Cut out shapes with cookie cutters. Place on a greased baking sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 8 minutes or until edges are lightly browned.

#### **Royal Icing**

- 4 egg whites (fresh, properly refrigerated, clean, grade A or AA eggs with intact shells)
- 4 cups sifted confectioners' sugar
- 1 teaspoon lemon extract or vanilla extract

#### **Directions**

Beat egg whites in clean, large bowl with mixer at high speed until foamy. Gradually add sugar and extract. Beat at high speed until thickened. NOTE: When dry, Royal Icing is very hard, so keep icing that you are not working with covered in a bowl or in an icing bag.







# Top 10 Classic Christmas Songs Countdown

#10: "Winter Wonderland" (1934)

Written by Felix Bernard and Richard B. Smith in 1934, "Winter Wonderland" counts as a Christmas tune due to its seasonal theme. Surprisingly, its original bridge about two lovers' spontaneous decision to get married was considered unsuitable for children. This led to the development of an alternate bridge describing the couple building a snowman the Cass County Boy. Though only to see other kids destroy it. However, times have changed, and the original bridge found its way back into modern recordings of the classic.

#### #9: "Frosty the Snowman" (1950)

This song was composed by Walter "Jack" Rollins and Steve Nelson during the mid-20th century. It was then recorded by singing cowboy Gene Autry and it's been covered by many artists, "Frosty the Snowman" is probably most fondly remembered by the Jimmy Durante version as it appears in the 30-minute 1969 TV special of the same name.

#### #8: "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer" (1949)

This jolly song, based on the 1939 story of the same name, was written by famed holiday songwriter Johnny Its most famous version was recorded by Gene Autry in 1949, and it became the first number 1 song of the 1950s. "Rudolph the Red-Nose Reindeer" has sold over 150 million copies worldwide, making it the second-best selling Christmas single of all time behind "White Christmas".

#7: "It's Beginning to Look a Lot Like Christmas" (1951)

Meredith Willson took the

classic image of Christmas, with its candy canes and holly, and turned it into a Christmas classic in 1951. Many believe that Willson wrote the song while staying at the Grand Hotel in Yarmouth, Nova Scotia, because of the reference to a "tree in the Grand Hotel, one in the park as well...", with the park being Frost Park, located across from the hotel. But it's Bing Crosby who recorded what's arguably the song's most famous version, also in 1951, and this one is still played today.

#### #6: "The Little Drummer Boy" (1941)

Originally titled "Carol of the Drum", this popular Christmas song was written by Katherine Kennicott Davis in 1941. The song tells the story of a poor young boy who is sent to the nativity where he plays his drum for the newborn Jesus. Despite being a song with religious themes rather than commercial



## #5: "Santa Claus Is Coming to Town" (1934)

Although it may seem like just a silly kid's song, "Santa Claus Is Coming to Town" has become a holiday staple and is one of the most popular Christmas songs ever. Composed by Haven Gillespie and John Frederick Coots, the tune was first sung on Eddie Cantor's radio show in November 1934. It quickly became a smash and sold over 30,000 records in one day.

#### #4: "Jingle Bells" (1857)

Believe it or not, this famous Christmas song was actually meant to be for American Thanksgiving. Written by church organist James Lord Pierpont and published in 1857 under the title "The One Horse Open Sleigh," it was republished with the name we know and love today two years later. Since then, "Jingle Bells" has become one of the best-known Christmas songs

in the world. It was also the first song to be broadcast from space after the crew of Gemini 6 serenaded Mission control with it in 1965.

## #3: "Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas" (1943)

Is there such thing as a sad Christmas song? The original lyrics for this holiday classic, written by Hugh Martin in the early '40s, were re-written before its inclusion in "Meet Me in St. Louis" as the film's star Judy Garland found it to be too depressing. Garland's version, which she sings to console her younger sister at the end of the musical, combines joyous lyrics with a somber tone that paints a picture of fragile hope and optimism.

#### #2: "Silent Night" (1818)

One of the most famous Christmas carols in the world comes from Austria, and made its debut at one of the country's parish churches on Christmas Eve of 1818. This iconic carol focuses on the religious aspect of the holiday, with lines about the Virgin Mary and the infant Jesus. Soldiers from England, France and Germany actually began the Christmas Truce of World War One by singing "Silent Night" in the legendary ceasefire of December 1914 – which is a testament to its power and endurance. Attend any Christmas Eve mass and there's a great chance you will hear this hauntingly beautiful

#### **#1:** "White Christmas" (1942)

Who doesn't love a white Christmas? Guinness World Records indicates that Bing Crosby's iconic rendition of this tune is the best-selling single of all time, with over 50 million copies sold around the globe.
