### **Espanola Police Reports**

On February 29 at 11:33 p.m., a member of the Espanola Police Service stopped a pickup truck on Centre Street for driving in excess of the posted speed limit. Upon stopping the vehicle, the officer noted an empty beer case in the back seat, and detected alcohol coming from the male driver. A sample of the driver's breath into an approved screening device registered a "Fail," and subsequent breath tests at the police station provided readings of 109 mgs and 99 mgs of alcohol per 100 milliliters of blood. Further, it was discovered that the driver was also suspended by the MTO for unpaid fines. As a result, the 29-year old resident of Espanola was charged criminally with impaired operation with over 80 mgs of alcohol, and was further charged under the Highway Traffic Act with speeding, and driving while under suspension. He will appear in Espanola Court on April 5, 2016, to answer to his charges. Pursuant to statute. his licence was suspended for a period of 90 days.

On March 3, a 16-year old female who had made threats at Espanola High School that she was going to cause death to another student, was rearrested by the Espanola Police Service for sending a threatening text to the same student. On February 18, the female was arrested, charged, and released on an undertaking into the custody of her parents; however, on February 27, she sent a text to the student she'd previously threatened through a third party, this time communicating the threat directly to the student, which was also a violation of her undertaking. As a result of the complaint, the female was charged with one count of uttering a death threat, and one count of failing to comply with an undertaking. She appeared in bail court in Sudbury on March 3, to answer to her charges.

On March 3, a female complainant attended the Espanola Police Service to report that her estranged husband, who was bound by conditions of a peace bond, had repeatedly texted her for reasons outside of those specified in the order. The complainant produced 9 pages of text messages received that day, which confirmed the breach. As a result of the complaint, a 44-year old male from Espanola was arrested and charged with one count of breach of recognizance. He was released on a promise to appear in Espanola Court on April 5 to answer to his charge.

### **Espanola Corporate Services Committee News**

By Chloe Kneer - The Corporate Services Committee met on Tuesday, April 5 to discuss a few items that may come before council in the near future. The first of which was the town's purchasing policy. Currently, acquisitions between \$10,000 and \$25,000 require three quotes before a decision can be made. (Under \$10,000 doesn't have the same requirement.) It was brought up that department heads should not divide large purchases to avoid the policy. Also on the table was the use of corporate credit cards. Staff confirmed that at least eight credit cards are in use by departments. CAO Cynthia Townsend said that the cards are primarily used for travel and training. but that if any member of the public is curious about expenses that are charged, they are more than welcome to visit the town hall and examine the files. "Anyone can come, sit in our boardroom and go through the file," she says, "There is nothing to hide."

At a prior council meeting, Councillor Ray Dufour questioned why meeting agendas are not archived on the town's website. The committee discussed making this possible. Deputy Mayor Bill Foster said, "For ease of public use and transparency, I think [prior council agendas] should be available in some format." The same debate applied to posting the cheque register online. CAO Townsend remarked that for \$5 anyone can get a copy of the cheque register emailed to them or obtain a hard copy for \$7.

The last item on the agenda was the exploration of reintroducing a taxi by-law in the town. Mayor Ron Piche said that having unregulated services could become a matter of citizen safety. Some staff and council disagreed, saying that if the town were to institute a taxi by-law it would open the town up to liability. Councillor Bob Yocom cited his frequent taxi use and commended the companies who provide the service in Espanola, saying that he has only been in clean responsible vehicles with drivers.

Espanola Council will have its next regular meeting Tuesday, April 12 at 7:30 p.m. and Corporate Services will meet again on Tuesday, May 3 at 4:00 p.m. The agendas for the meetings are posted at www.espanola.ca, the town's website

### **MPAC To Reassess All Properties In 2016**

This year, the Municipal **Property** Assessment Corporation (MPAC) updating the assessed values of every property in Ontario. All properties will have a legislated valuation date of January 1, 2016. Residential property owners can expect to receive their property assessment notice in late April. Non-residential notices will be mailed in the fall. These values will be used by municipalities to calculate your property taxes for the 2017-2020 property tax years. For more information on how assessment works,

### Recipe

Who doesn't love a warm apple crisp with a crunchy topping and vanilla ice cream melting overtop? But if you are



trying to watch your calories and stick to a better way of eating you may avoid this kind of dessert. Typically fruit crisps are made with a lot of white, processed sugar but this recipe uses maple syrup which adds a delicious deep flavour to the dish. The coconut oil in the topping replaces the butter that you would typically find in a crisp recipe, and is a healthier alternative. Add a small amount of low fat, whipped topping for a little treat. This not only makes a healthier dessert option, but also a delicious breakfast.

### **Healthy Apple Crisp**

Yield: serves 4

- 4 cups apples, thinly sliced (peeled or unpeeled if you want extra fibre)
- 2 Tbsp maple syrup (if you prefer it sweeter, you can add more to your taste)
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon



### For the Topping

- 1/2 cup old fashioned rolled oats
- 2 Tbsp whole wheat flour or Nutri flour blend
- 2 Tbsp coconut oil, melted
- 1 Tbsp maple syrup
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon

Preheat oven to 375F. Combine apples, maple syrup, and cinnamon in a pie plate or square baking dish. Mix well and set aside. In a bowl, combine oats, flour, coconut oil, maple syrup, and cinnamon. Top apple mixture with oat mixture. Bake for 25 - 30 minutes, or until apples are soft.
