



# **Espanola Town Council Report**

By Chloe Kneer - Espanola Town council declared May 2 – 8 as Mental Health Awareness week in Espanola at their regular meeting on April 12. Deputy Mayor Bill Foster addressed the pending OPP costing having had an introductory meeting the first week of April. Foster said that, at the earliest, the process will be engaged this July. From there, it takes 5-6 months for the costing to be completed, then, if approved, another 18-24 months before a switch to OPP policing would take effect.

Espanola Police Chief Steve Edwards and Police Services Board Chair Mary Lou Mick presented the policing annual report at the meeting. Edwards gave an overview for 2015 and informed council of the Generation 911 upgrade with text service for the hard of hearing or deaf. He also spoke of the reciprocal agreement that EPS has with the OPP for back up services should either detachment ever have to evacuate their buildings. Edwards also discussed the newly instituted use of tazers at EPS, touting some of the

benefits of using tazers over traditional methods of restraint. He said that tazers will, most times, incapacitate a possible suspect making them easier to arrest and that the devices do not cause long-term harmful The chief discussed effects. firearms and other training and said that he is happy to have an in-house constable (Shawn Sullivan) who has taken the role of providing training to all of the officers, saving time and money on transportation out of town for training courses. Edwards was asked by Councillor Stewart Meikleham how he felt about the possibility of the decriminalization of marijuana. Edwards' major concern, he said, was impaired driving. Before pot becomes legal, he would like to see a way to measure citizens for impairment. These standards and technologies do not yet exist.

Councillor Ron **Duplessis** reported that Public Works employees (member of Local 534) have ratified their new contract with the town. next meeting of council will be Tuesday, April 26 at 7:30 p.m.
