Fidel Castro – El Gato With 638 Lives!

What the Central Intelligence Agency of the United States of America failed to accomplish in 50 years of trying, Father Time quietly took care of last month. Fidel Castro died in his sleep on November 25 in Santiago de Cuba at 90 years of age. Desperate, the CIA recruited Mafia boss Johnny Roselli, who was good at such tasks, but even his boys couldn't get close to Fidel. In half a century of cloak and dagger intrigue, Washington's "gang that couldn't shoot straight" tried to poison Fidel, gas him, blow him up, shoot him, denude him and drown him. Still the last TV footage I saw of Castro showed an agile man in a track suit doing light, upper body exercises.

When a dozen packs of poisoned cigars loaded with botulinum toxin went unsmoked by Fidel, they resorted to the ol' exploding cigar trick. (They may have consulted Groucho Marx on this one.) They packed enough TNT in Fidel's favourite Cohiba Esplendidos to blow his head off. He switched brands. (Fortunately for his aides, Fidel was not a 'regifter.')

About it all, Castro once joked: "If surviving assassination were an Olympic event, I'd win a gold medal." And then he'd refuse to accept it of course, knowing it would be polished with polonium-210.

"Birds I View"

By Bob Rigby - I have no doubt that some readers have already seen evening and pine grosbeaks at their feeders. I have seen small flocks of both species myself. As I mentioned last week I was going to take a long hike to see what birds may be wintering in the vicinity. I saw two small flocks of snow buntings consisting of about 50 birds per flock. The unmistakable black and white bird really contrasted well with the light dusting of snow that still remained on the ground. As I wandered into the forest near House Lake, I was beginning to think I may not see anything at all. After an hour of walking, I came across a pair of pileated woodpeckers who appeared unconcerned at my presence as they pecked away at the base of a decaying cedar. Then a group of chickadees

appeared, making quite a racket, which in turn set the pileated woodpeckers into a call frenzy. I am not quite sure what predator was present but it certainly stirred up the forest. Within minutes, I saw some tree sparrows and common redpolls, I must mention I also spotted two ruffed grouse, not the greatest of days in terms of bird watching, but thoroughly enjoyable nonetheless.







Recipe

You can't go wrong with a chocolate and peanut butter combination; it's always a favourite. These are a popular and delicious




addition to a Christmas cookie tray. The original recipe calls for plain, old shortening (which you can use) but using the butter flavoured shortening gives them a little richer taste. Butter can also be used, but you will have to chill the dough before rolling it into balls.

Peanut Blossoms

- 1 cup butter flavoured shortening or butter
- 1 cup peanut butter
- 1 cup packed brown sugar
- 1 cup white sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1/4 cup milk
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 3 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
 - 2 teaspoons baking soda
 - 1 teaspoon salt
 - 1/2 cup white sugar for decoration

• 2 (9 ounce) bags milk chocolate candy kisses, unwrapped

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C). Grease cookie sheets. In a large bowl, cream together the shortening, peanut butter, brown sugar, and 1 cup white sugar until smooth. Beat in the eggs one at a time, and stir in the milk and vanilla. Combine the flour, baking soda, and salt; stir into the peanut butter mixture until well blended. Shape tablespoonfuls of dough into balls, and roll in remaining white sugar. Place cookies 2 inches apart on the prepared cookie sheets. Bake for 10 to12 minutes in the preheated oven. Remove from oven, and immediately press a chocolate kiss into each cookie. Allow to cool completely; the kiss will harden as it cools.
