



#### Palliative Care Fundraiser: Comfort At The End Of Life

By Chloe Kneer — It can be both emotionally and physically demanding when a loved one is facing a life-threatening health situation. Family and friends prefer to stay close to offer support to the patient and to one another during these times, often spending long hours and overnights at the hospital. This is where palliative care becomes very important. "This type of care helps patients to achieve the best possible quality of life right up until the end of life," says Espanola Regional Hospital and Health Centre Foundation Chair Terri Noble.

The palliative care room in acute care at ERHHC was furnished in 1998. Over the last nearly two decades, the room has served families, patients and friends well, offering a comfortable place to rest.

However, the room is in need of a refresh. "We want to make this room as comfortable as possible for both the patient and family," Noble says, "We are hoping to raise \$5,000 by September for the purchase of an Oasis sleep chair, which is essentially a chair that pulls out into a bed to enable family to spend the night or just rest, two high back chairs, a flat screen TV and a small stereo.

The room will also be painted and new blinds added to the windows."

The fundraiser itself is a small one, compared to the others that the hospital foundation has been involved in. A donation will go a long way in helping to keep families comfortable during a very difficult time. Joining the Express family for the 2016-2017 season is defenceman Jamison Westaby. The Sioux Falls, South Dakota, native played the last two seasons with the Iowa Stars U18 AAA program.

"Jamison is an offensive defenceman who will add a lot to our blue line this season," stated Director of Hockey Operations Randy Blake. "Not only does Jamison like to join the attack, he will also add some sand paper to our back end."

When asked about his new venture to play hockey in Canada, the 19 year-old defender replied, "I'm very excited to start a new chapter in my life, in a new league and country. My expectations are high for myself



and the team to have a strong season. I'm excited to meet all the staff members, teammates and fans.'

Also joining the Express family for the upcoming season is towering 6'4" 210-pound goaltender Logan Sawka. Sawka hails from Calgary, Alberta, and played last season in British Columbia with the Castlegar Rebels, posting a 2.99 GAA and a .912 save percentage in 28 games. The 19 year-old managed a 16-8-2 record while notching 2 shutouts in the 2015-2016 KIJHL season.

"Logan is a large goaltender who fills the net well, he is very mobile for his size and he has the ability to steal games for our team," said Co-coach Jason Rapcewicz. "We are excited to have Logan join the team and the stability he will add to our net."

#### "Birds I View"

By Bob Rigby - It was nice to get out and do some relaxing bird watching these past few days. One of my outings took me to the marshy area of Black Creek adjacent to Mead Street in Espanola, where I was hoping to see ring-necked ducks with their offspring. I was disappointed at this location, given the fact that last year we had several pairs of ring-necked ducks that nested in the area successfully. A short drive later, however, and I was rewarded by seeing a ringnecked duck with 10 ducklings at Black Creek off of Panache Lake Road. These babies were no more than a week old, strange indeed this late in summer, but nice to see nonetheless.

Back at the marshy area, I noticed a male northern harrier, formerly a marsh hawk, hovering above me. He was quite excited about something as he let out his warning screams and swooped several times at a grassy area at the side of the road. At first I thought the bird was hunting, but soon he was joined by his mate who

was also making the warning screams. Several minutes later, a fox sheepishly emerged, being attacked by both parents, indicating that they had their nest close by, and this fox was the one doing the hunting. This medium-sized hawk is often seen flying low over meadows and marsh lands. The male is slate blue in colour, with an unmistakable white rump patch. The female is a drab brown, often larger than the male, but still has the white rump patch. Its disc-like face resembles that of an owl and its long legs and tail make it easy to identify. A northern harriers' main diet is snakes, small rodents and occasionally small birds. I remember several years ago finding a nest at Black Creek in the area of the Independent grocery store. Unlike other species of hawks, this one likes to nest on the ground amongst red dogwood bushes or in long grass, usually in marshy areas. It is nice to see this bird nesting in such close proximity to a residential area.



#### Recipe

In attempt to cut back on pasta and potatoes this summer, I've been trying new salads. I love this one. It's a refreshing, flavourful, salad full of bold flavours



of the Mediterranean. Fresh, seasonal, cucumber, tomato, parsley, red onion, feta, and baby arugula are tossed with an oregano lemon vinaigrette that can be served as a light, healthy, meatless main dish or a great side salad.

#### **Greek Cucumber and Arugula Salad**

- 2 medium-sized cucumbers, sliced thin OR spiralized then roughly chopped
- 2 cups chopped tomatoes
- 2 cups baby arugula
- 1/2 red onion, cut in half then into thin slices
- 1/2 cup pitted kalamata olives, halved
- 1/3 cup crumbled feta cheese
- 1/3 cup chopped fresh parsley

#### For the Oregano Lemon Vinaigrette:

- 1/4 cup extra virgin olive oil
- 3 Tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1/2 teaspoon honey
- 1 garlic clove, pressed or minced
- salt and pepper

Combine all salad ingredients in a large bowl. Add oregano lemon vinaigrette ingredients to a bowl or mason jar then whisk or shake to combine. Pour over salad then toss to combine and serve.
