

By Bob Rigby - The hot weather and massive bug population have kept us humans from venturing too far into the bush, but our feathered friends are out and if you can stand what Mother Nature dishes out, you will be rewarded with some great birding. For example, I was watching a pair of black throated green warblers when I heard some chattering above my head. I looked up to spot a pair of yellow bellied sapsuckers mating outside their nest hole, which was located about 20 feet up in a dead birch tree. The yellow bellied sapsucker spends its winters in South America, returning to Canada in the summer. The sapsucker family are closely related to the woodpecker and flicker families. They excavate a hole in live or dead trees to nest. Most Canadian woodpeckers permanent residents,

meaning they are here yearround, and survive quite well even with our severe winters. A very interesting note to fellow birders: a recent sighting of a pair of yellow headed blackbirds in the King City area, north of Toronto, has created a little excitement in the birder community. Although these relatives of the blackbird family have been seen before on rare occasions, the spotting of a pair may indicate breeding outside of its known range which is typically Manitoba west to British Columbia. Meanwhile, around our area. the return of the chimney swifts and the common nighthawk are the big news. Recipe

I'm keeping it simple this week with roasted potatoes smothered in olive oil, garlic, Italian seasonings and parmesan cheese. Usually when you think of roasted potatoes you think of them crispy and brown all over.



This recipe is a bit different. The potatoes are baked on top of each other in a casserole dish rather than spread out on a baking sheet. Some of the ends will brown up, with a little crunch but that's not the goal. The goal is to infuse them with flavor and bathe them in olive oil so they cook up soft and succulent. They make a great side for meatloaf, chicken, roasts, or anything grilled on the barbecue.

Italian Roasted Garlic & Parmesan Potatoes

- Butter, for greasing the pan
- 2 pounds russet potatoes
- ¼ cup olive oil (preferably extra virgin but it doesn't have to be), divided
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning, crushed between fingertips
- 4 minced cloves garlic
- Salt and pepper
- 1/4 cup grated parmesan cheese, divided
- Red pepper flakes, optional
- Fresh chopped parsley, for garnish

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F. Generously butter an 8x10 inch ■ casserole dish. Peel and cut the potatoes in half lengthwise then lay | each half flat and slice lengthwise into ½ inch wide half moons. Place the potatoes in a big mixing bowl and toss with 2 tablespoons of oil. Toss with the seasoning, garlic, 1 teaspoon salt, ½ teaspoon black pepper and half the parmesan (plus a few pinches of red pepper flakes if you like). Pour into the casserole dish being sure to scoop out and add any spices or garlic left in the bowl Sprinkle a tablespoon of parmesan over the top and drizzle with a tablespoon of oil. Bake 30 minutes then remove from the oven and toss well. Sprinkle the remaining parmesan on top and drizzle with the remaining oil. Bake 25 more minutes. Toss well and season to taste with more salt and pepper if needed. Place them in a serving dish and pour any remaining oil at the bottom of the pan over them and garnish with a little fresh parsley.
