The most recent Boring Conference just wrapped up in London and by all accounts it was a huge success that is to say, a massive Eleanor Herring had them snorefest. nodding off in the aisles while she employed excruciating detail to discuss the history of lamp posts. Some in the audience were visually gripped by Tim Steiner's keynote address on the electric hand dryer – especially his killer finale which focused entirely on the Mitsubishi Jet Towel.

If there had been an MVP award that year, Peter Fletcher would have been the runaway winner by sharing his year long record of sneezes with his audience. Details like time, place, date and estimated strength of his sneezes were presented. 

Conference evaluations later revealed that those in attendance were particularly captured by Fletcher's sneeze #42.

The banner headline of The Boring Conference that promised: "Nothing Interesting, Worthwhile Or Important" did not disappoint. I know what you're thinking, that sounds a lot like the theme of Thomas Muclair's federal election campaign!

So far the organizers have fought the urge to make the convention even more boring should that prove humanly possible ... by letting the presenters talk for as long as they like.

Simply put, while she was momentarily distracted, the speaker wired up for sound, went down the hall and into the washroom ... and into a stall. That's right, into a stall.

The first sound that blared into the ballroom shocked the audience into an eerie silence. No tinkling of glasses necessary. After that, chaos erupted in the room as loud, rude noises were met with the collective groans of five hundred people caught between what they thought was a bad joke or a very weird Monty Python routine. The flush was the coup de grace.

This poor woman was still in shock one year later. Of all the ways to open a stage presentation that I have tried, marrying a live microphone to a bowel movement never once crossed my mind. I used that story when I got to the podium. I acknowledged that they were probably a fun-loving group of people and yes, I was there to entertain them but sadly no, I would not go that extra mile for laughter. The Boring Conference? They could use that other guy, now and forever known as the party pooper.

"Birds I View"

By Bob Rigby - This past week abounded with bird songs throughout the area, and when time permits I can listen to them sing for hours. New sightings are the return of the common nighthawk, blackbilled cuckoos, mourning warbler, clay colored sparrow the yellow-bellied sapsucker. My featured bird this week is the rose-breasted Grosbeak, not to be mistaken for our permanent residents the pine grosbeak and evening grosbeak. The rose-breasted grosbeak is a migratory bird that returns every year from its wintering home in South and Central America to its nesting grounds here in Canada. An uncommon bird to the south of us, but now a regular visitor and breeder in northern Ontario. I am currently observing a nesting pair near Loon Lake. There is no mistaking this beautiful black and white bird, about 8 inches in length with a startling

crimson red breast. They are marvelous songsters as well. students always come first. She was nominated for this award by the Webbwood staff when she was viceprincipal. As a vice-principal, Cori organized the breakfast club and monthly community breakfasts, planned awards ceremonies, led literacy circles, led community art projects, and worked tirelessly to promote diversity. She is committed to providing athletic opportunities to all students. She encouraged involvement in the SPARK program and organized lunch hour volleyball, along with many staff-student volleyball games. The Webbwood junior and intermediate volleyball

teams competed and were successful in a variety of tournaments and championships. System-wide, she shares her commitment to diversity as an active voice on the Equity and Inclusive Education Committee.

The entire school community conserves energy regularly with lights out. Apple trees shade the schoolyard, and cedar log garden beds are used to grow vegetables for the school's annual fall harvest feast. Pitre and teacher Justin Spencer, a member of the school's Eco Team, were commended at the awards ceremony.

A.B. Ellis Public School lunchroom supervisor Linda Houle won an Award for Excellence for the impact she brings to students that goes

far beyond nutritional breaks. Houle has been a dedicated volunteer for over ten years, demonstrating a genuine concern for student wellbeing, and enriching the school experience by decorating the holidays, helping at school events and providing extra support with reading and math. In return, she insists that students demonstrate respect and perseverance, qualities that will contribute to their success at school and beyond. She learns the names of students and takes time to talk to them about what is happening in their life. Congratulations to all of our local award winners.

NOTICE OF A PUBLIC MEETING **Concerning Application for Consent**

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers will hold a public meeting on Wednesday, June 22, 2016 at 7:00 p.m., at the Township Office, 11 Birch Lake Road, Massey in order to consider a proposed application for Consent under Section 53 of the Planning Act, RSO 1990 as amended.

File No. C-16-06 The purpose of this consent application is to provide for a new lot in the Rural zone. The property is described as Victoria Township, Section 31, Parcel 31-2-1 and 32-1-5, #2 and #20 Highway 17. The land subject of this application is not subject of any other application under the Planning Act.

If you wish to be notified of the decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers in respect of the proposed consent, you must make a written request to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers. This will also entitle you to be advised of a possible Ontario Municipal Board Hearing. Even if you are the successful party, you should request a copy of the decision since the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers decision may be appealed to the Ontario Municipal Board by the applicant or another member of the public.

To appeal the decision to the Ontario Municipal Board, send an appeal form to the Clerk of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers outlining the reasons for the appeal. You must enclose the appeal fee of \$125.00 for each application appealed, paid by cheque, made payable to the Ontario Minister of Finance.

If a person or public body that files an appeal of a decision of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers in respect of the proposed consent does not make written submission to the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers before it gives or refuses to give a provisional consent, the Ontario Municipal Board may dismiss the appeal.

BUILDING PERMITS

This is a reminder that building permits are required for most projects – if in doubt please contact the Township office. Permit fees are doubled if work commences prior to a permit being issued.

When applying for a building permit, the review time of an application can be up to 10 business days for a single-family dwelling. Be sure to include complete drawings and plans to avoid delays in having your permit issued. Residents are reminded that Sudbury & District Health Unit approval may be required, depending on the work, prior to your permit being issued.

Inspections do not happen automatically. It is YOUR responsibility to ensure that either you or your contractor requests the necessary inspections in a timely manner. Inspections are conducted within two business days after the request has been received. This two-day time period begins on the day after you request the inspection.

ATTENTION MASSEY RESIDENTS WATERING BYLAW

This is a reminder that Bylaw 2003-10 regulates the use of municipal water for lawn and garden care.

- Even numbered houses may water on even-numbered days
- Odd numbered houses may water on odd-numbered days Watering is only to take place between the hours of 7:00 am and 10:00 am and from 7:00 pm and 10:00pm. Failure to comply can result in fines.

- 1/2 cup bite-size broccoli florets
- 1 cup of cherry tomatoes, halved
