### REDUCED LOADS

Please note that pursuant to Bylaw 2013-22 the reduced load period on municipal roads is in effect from March 1st to June 15th of each year, while appropriate signage is erected.

Only satisfactory road conditions will decide if the load restriction shall be removed prior to June 15th, as determined by Public Works.

### **BUILDING PERMITS**

Please note that when applying for a building permit, the review time of an application can be up to 10 business days for a single-family dwelling. Be sure to include complete drawings and plans to avoid delays in having your permit issued. Residents are reminded that Sudbury & District Health Unit approval may be required, depending on the work, prior to your permit being issued.

Inspections do not happen automatically. It is **YOUR** responsibility to ensure that either you or your contractor requests the necessary inspections in a timely manner. Inspections are conducted within two business days after the request has been received. This two-day time period begins on the day after you request the inspection.

Most projects require a permit – if in doubt please contact the township office. Permit fees are doubled if work commences prior to a permit being issued.

### Cicilia – The Oldest Woman In Canada

world's oldest person celebrated her Bell Centre. Also she'd like Guinness 120th birthday last month in her home of Laval. Ouebec. At the small but festive party attended by dignitaries, friends and family, Haitian-born Cicilia laughed and sang and clapped her hands, then went for a really long nap. The birthday cake which could be seen from the Space Station, boasted 120 candles which quickly melted all the smoke detectors in the room and the party had to be moved.

In the newspaper photo, a smiling Cicilia in her elegant gold suit and white-brimmed hat appears to be the picture of good health. Born January 31, 1896, this slim and perky woman still keeps a bucket list. She wants to meet Prime Minister Justin Trudeau. She wants to see her great-grandsons from Haiti one last time. She wants to be recognized by the Guinness World Records as the oldest living person on the planet. And she wants to play one shift on defense with P.K. Subban of the Montreal Canadiens the next time

Cicilia Laurent, quite possibly the they meet the Boston Bruins at the to declare that the late Jeanne Louise Calment – who is recognized as the world's oldest-ever person – was a flatout lying bitch! Oh yeah, at 120 - she's still feisty!

> Just to put the timeline in perspective, in 1896, the year Cicilia Laurent was born, Henry Ford's automobile was still just a quadricycle. Utah became the 45th U.S. State with a population of 27,000 people including three men. The Sherlock Holmes' adventure Veiled Lodger had just been published that year and Sherlock Holmes was so young, he couldn't figure out who done it!

> Now the problem with Cicilia fulfilling her lifelong, really long life dream of getting into the record books is that the Guinness World Records people have impossibly high standards of verification and Haiti, with its high frequency of natural disasters and incompetent politicians hasn't been able to keep good records. 

### Recipe

This Slow Cooker Meatballs & Marinara recipe is a great one to prep in the morning and come home to after work, or to cook overnight and then reheat for dinner. The meatballs stay really



moist and tender, and the sauce soaks up a lot of the meaty flavour when cooking all day. The meatballs are delicious served over pasta, on rolls as meatball subs, or just on their own as a meaty, saucy main course.

### Slow Cooker Meatballs & Marinara

Yield: 8 servings (2 meatballs & 1/3 cup sauce)

- ½ cup plain bread crumbs
- 1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese
- 1 tablespoon Italian seasoning
- ½ teaspoon garlic powder
- 2 eggs
- ½ cup milk
- 1 lb lean ground beef
- 1 teaspoon olive oil 1 small onion, diced
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 28 oz can crushed tomatoes
- 8 oz can tomato sauce
- 6 oz can tomato paste
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh basil or 2 teaspoons of dried basil
- 2 teaspoons Italian seasoning
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1 bay leaf

In a large bowl, combine the bread crumbs, Parmesan, a tablespoon of the Italian seasoning, garlic powder, eggs and milk and stir until well combined. Add the ground beef, mix together with a spoon or your hands until thoroughly combined. Separate the meat mixture into 16 even pieces and roll each into a ball. Mist a large skillet with cooking spray and heat over medium heat. Place the prepared meatballs in the pan and brown the outsides (about 2 minutes on each side). Do not cook through. When the outsides are browned transfer the meatballs to your slow cooker. In the same skillet, bring the teaspoon of olive oil over medium heat. Add the diced onion and cook for 4-5 minutes until the onions are translucent and a bit golden. Add the minced garlic and cook for another minute until fragrant. Transfer the onion & garlic to a large mixing bowl. Add the crushed tomatoes, tomato sauce, tomato paste, basil, 2 teaspoons of Italian seasoning, salt, sugar and the bay leaf to the onions and garlic in the bowl. Stir to combine and then pour over the meatballs in your slow cooker. Stir to cover/coat the meatballs. Cook meatballs on low for around 6-8 hours. Don't overcook or meatballs will fall apart. Remove the bay leaf before
