The OPP conducted its annual Distracted Driving campaign last week hoping to reverse the trend after three consecutive years where driver distraction as a causal factor exceeded all other categories of road deaths on OPP-patrolled roads.

Last year, 69 people died in road crashes in which driver distraction was a factor, compared to 61 speed-related, 51 seat belt-related and 45 alcohol/drug-related deaths.

Numerous studies have been conducted on the risks associated with distracted driving – in particular, texting or talking on a cell phone while driving. Many of these studies have confirmed that this form of distracted driving is as dangerous as driving while impaired by alcohol or drugs.

Heading into spring and summer, road users need to be aware of how serious a threat distracted drivers are to their safety. Each year for the past three years

### Don't Text And Drive; It Can Wait!

(2013-2015), OPP officers have laid approximately 20,000 distracted driving charges throughout the province, which is more than double the number of impaired driving charges they laid over the same threevear period.

Over and above cell phone use, the OPP continues to lay numerous charges every year against motorists whose driving ability is compromised by other distractions such as eating, self-grooming, tending to kids in the back seat to name a few.

"If you are texting, talking on your cell phone or pre-occupied with other activities while behind the wheel, you are not driving safely. It does not suffice to keep your eyes on the road. Driving involves sharing space with drivers, their passengers, motorcyclists, cyclists and pedestrians and it is impossible to do so safely unless your eyes and mind are solely focused on driving," says J.V.N. (Vince) Hawkes, Ontario Provincial Police Commissioner. "Distracted driving is just not worth it. It has been shown to be just as dangerous as drinking and driving – something we all know is wrong. Our government has worked hard to make our roads some of the safest in North America. including taking strong action against individuals who put themselves and others at risk by talking, texting and using electronic devices while driving. We all have a role to play in keeping our roads safe and I want to remind everyone to go hands-free and put your

By adding numbers and differentiating shapes, colours and textures, Alex may have come closer to exhibiting human intelligence than any other animal on earth including and especially Ted Cruz. Alex was a real rascal who enjoyed dancing and needling his handler.

If Pepperberg happened to greet another parrot in the laboratory first, Alex would sulk all day, refuse to cooperate and become very demanding. Instead of answering questions, he'd ask for food, toys, showers and a transfer to his gym. On one such day, Alex demanded

a nut, but Pepperberg was ignoring him. Even after decades of interplay with the parrot, she was stunned to hear him say: "Want a nut. Nnn ... uh ... tuh." Like, 'do I have to spell this out for you, Science Lady'? The Guardian newspaper described Alex as "smarter than the average U.S. President." (In fairness, that was during Dubya's reign.)

Winston Churchill's parrot was not nearly as smart as Alex, but compensated by being twice as surly. Although disputed by the prime minister's relatives, Peter Oram claims he inherited the 104-year-old bird from his fatherin-law, who first sold the parrot to Churchill and then took him back when the British legend died in 1965. Old and cranky, 'Charlie' was the resident celebrity at Oram's garden centre in Surrey, England. Claiming Churchill taught the bird the words, Oram says that when Charlie was startled out of his sleep, he immediately screamed: "Screw Hitler! Screw the Nazis!" Whether or not 'Charlie' once belonged to him, Churchill would be heartily amused. (And for the record, I cleaned up Charlie's language a lot.)

I have had my own awkward encounter with a beak that speaks. Except this one whistled. Several summers ago I was sitting at an outside café on Bestor Square in Chautauqua, New York enjoying a coffee, a muffin and that town's daily newspaper. I had just finished teaching my morning writing class. Kirsten, the artist in residence, was behind me working on a clay sculpture with her macaw

perched in a cage beside her. An unusually large American parrot, the bird was brightly coloured with a long feathered tail and a booming voice as well.

I could hear the woman padding down the sidewalk before I saw her. She was middle-aged, large and lugging a heavy bag of groceries in each hand. As she came into my view, Kirsten's parrot let loose with a very sharp, extremely loud wolf-whistle. The woman stopped, turned and stared straight at me. I buried my head in my newspaper. I could feel the heat of her glare. Time passed slowly and then finally, I heard her steps continue. Two steps, actually - that's all it took for Kirsten's macaw to unleash another wolfwhistle, the kind that would make a construction worker proud. The woman stopped dead in her tracks, turned and, laser-like, honed those piercing eyes on me again.

I hid behind the newspaper for what seemed like whole minutes, hoping the parrot would give himself away. No such luck.

himself away. No such luck. "Look," I said peaking over the top of the paper, "that was not me that whistled."

"Oh, I know it wasn't you," she said. "It was that damn bird again."

"Just once," she said, turning to leave, "just once why couldn't it be a man?"

Much like El Chapo, I too am not that fond of parrots.




