

Irony – A Sad Sign Of Our Times

Back in the fifth century when Greece was the intellectual and cultural centre of Western civilization instead of a debtor nation and an escape route for Syrian refugees, they were making up words. One particular wordsmith took the word eiron meaning dissembler and stretched it into the word eironeia meaning simulated ignorance. From that melding of words came the Latin term irony. Today irony is a common and often-used word meaning an expression of double meaning brought about by opposite thoughts or tendencies which result in humour. A few obvious examples of irony would be an outspoken vegan spotted eating a pepperoni pizza or a traffic cop being arrested for a slew of unpaid parking tickets.

Many humourists around the world thought the greatest ironic event of the last century was when Henry Kissinger, Nixon's strategist in Vietnam and the architect of America's illegal bombings of Laos and Cambodia was awarded the 1973 Noble Prize for Peace. It was as if Mahatma Gandhi, the greatest pacifist of our time had been awarded the rank of Field Marshal in the Indian Army.

Irony would be like former Premier of Ontario Dalton McGuinty being rewarded with a sweetheart job as a lobbyist for Pricewaterhouse Coopers instead of facing charges of fraud in the gas plants scandals. Or former U.S. President Bill Clinton's name being associated with a foundation with the word "trust" in the name. Or Donald Trump insisting he is still part of a group known as genus hominid or human beings.

President Barack Obama, America's best opportunity to make America great, having been shackled by right-wing Republicans will likely go down in history as one of that nation's worst presidents. Sad irony,

that.

As I'm watching American news last night, a nice blend of political destruction, natural disasters and celebrity gossip, Ben Stiller comes on to tell his story about dodging prostate cancer by catching the disease early with a PSA test.

This was hardly breaking news. I can name at least three friends who have gone through exactly the same procedure and not been profiled on international news. But there was a great irony swirling around Ben Stiller's announcement because the medical procedure involves the rectum and he chose to break the news on The Howard Stern Show. How utterly fitting and funny is that?

In France, a country still suffering post traumatic stress showed they should not be allowed to make big decisions until clear thinking and common sense returns to this brave and beleaguered nation.

Bizarrely, on several French beaches, Muslim women wearing wet suit style burkinis were hassled, jeered and arrested. On a beach in Nice, France where it's quite alright to wear string bikinis or go topless, police forced a burkini-wearing Muslim woman to disrobe in front of onlookers. French authorities who considered the Muslim choice of garments "a threat to public order" also fined a Muslim woman in Cannes for wearing leggings, a tunic and a head scarf to the beach. (The French word for 'panic' is 'panique'.)

But that's okay because the French, equal opportunity clothes enforcers, that they are, will ... please sit down before you continue reading this ... will create a section in the city of Paris where people can walk around naked next summer. That's correct. A special section of France's capital will soon be specially

"Birds I View"

By Bob Rigby - As the cold weather fast approaches, it is a good time to start thinking about putting up the bird feeder. This is a good time for the amateur birder to observe birds closely, especially those that remain with us during the winter months. With so many bird feeders available on the market it can be confusing as to what feeder one should purchase. My advice is to purchase a feeder that is easy to fill and of course squirrel proof, many feeders that are available are made of plastic, and I would personally stay away from these products, because somehow, some way the squirrel will eventually chew its way into them, especially the North American grey squirrel, which appears to be around in good numbers. Once you have decided what feeder you are going to purchase, next comes the selection of food. My advice

is to stay away from feed that has a high content of split corn. Many birds tend to eat a little and then go about throwing the rest out of the feeder, to get to the seeds it prefers.

Attracting some of our more beautiful winter resident birds requires specialty foods which cost a little more than normal bagged bird foods, but in my mind is well worth the extra few dollars. Next week we will cover pre-mixed seeds and where to purchase, and the birds you are most likely to attract.

Espanola Town Council Report

By Chloe Kneer – Some of the most heated debate at the recent meeting of council didn't pertain to the passing of a by-law, rather it was an exchange between the mayor and Councillor Ray Dufour, who requested to be assigned to the Corporate Services Committee. Dufour stated that it had been agreed upon early during this council's term that mid-way through (which is where they are now), the various committees' memberships would be changed up, thereby giving each councillor a chance to experience sitting on a different committee. Mayor Ron Piche stated that he was happy with his decision not to move Councillor Dufour to Corporate Services, instead keeping Councillor Bill Foster on for another year, and that he would consider the switch once this year is up. Dufour was displeased, yet didn't accept Councillor Ron Duplessis' suggestion that he step down and allow Dufour to take his place.

Other discussion surrounded the need for building permits on certain residential renovations. A notice of motion was carried to allow further discussion at the Community Services Committee level, along with the requesting of a staff report comparing Espanola's requirements for permits to other municipalities. With the school shuffling in Espanola, crossing guards have been under study and it was decided to reinstate the guard in the morning and afternoon at Mead Street and Spanish River Drive. The guard on Highway 6 will be in place for one hour per day. In the comments portion at the meeting's end, Councillor Yocom spoke about the library's 100th birthday and the events that will follow to celebrate it. Councillor R. Duplessis informed the rest of council of the repairs that Espanola Fish and Game are making to the boat launch at Black Creek. The next regular meeting will be November 8 at 7:30 p.m.

Recipe

Bread pudding is where leftover stale bread gets a second chance at greatness. Up until recently I didn't like the idea of bread pudding, but then something life changing happened; my mom made some and brought me a sample. Now I crave it. It's basically an upgraded French toast with a soft middle and crunchy edges covered in a delicious, creamy sauce. What's not to love? I made this recipe yesterday and have enough ingredients leftover that I think I'll make it again today for um...the cats. Bread puddings are not the place to skimp or substitute lower-fat ingredients. The rich milk and eggs are what make this dish delicious. It's quite simple to make and is a crowd-pleasing dessert.



Old-Fashioned Bread Pudding with Vanilla Sauce

- 4 cups (8 slices) cubed white bread (a few days old or toast cubes in the oven to dry them out)
- 1/2 cup raisins
- 2 cups milk
- 1/4 cup butter
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 eggs, slightly beaten
- 1 tablespoon vanilla
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg

Sauce Ingredients:

- 1/2 cup butter
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup heavy whipping cream
- 1 tablespoon vanilla

Directions for pudding:

Heat oven to 350°F. Combine bread and raisins in large bowl. Combine milk and 1/4 cup butter in 1-quart saucepan. Cook over medium heat until butter is melted (4 to 7 minutes). Pour milk mixture over bread; let stand at least 10 minutes or up to 60 minutes. Stir in all remaining pudding ingredients. Pour into greased 1 1/2-quart casserole. (You can let it sit at this point in the fridge until ready to bake). Bake for 40 to 50 minutes or until set in center. (my oven gets quite hot and it only needed 30 minutes, so check it)

Directions for Sauce:

Combine all sauce ingredients except vanilla in 1-quart saucepan. Cook over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until mixture thickens and comes to a full boil (5 to 8 minutes). Stir in vanilla. To serve : Spoon warm pudding into individual dessert dishes; serve with sauce. Store refrigerated
