The Global Disease Of "Stupidity" Is Spreading

ongoing series of travel books written, as always, from the keen eye of a curmudgeon is titled The Road To Little Dribbling. Not my favourite, but few writers can take the utterly mundane and make it instantly funny as hell.

In this book about meandering around his adopted country of Britain, he referenced the Dunning-Kruger Effect, a theory put forth by two academics at N.Y.'s Cornell University claiming that this world has become so stupid, we the people are unable to realize how stupid we have become.

And it's not just individual stupidity. Not just what Justin Bieber does or Donald Trump says or Lady Gaga wears, although the puzzling support for Trump's bid to become President of the United States suggests a public dumbing down of an entire nation that is happening faster than the onslaught of global warming.

The Dunning-Kruger Effect points to a more general slide in values and poor judgment in the world - global brain cramps like The Panama Papers, Brexit and the ongoing existence of the Canadian Senate.

A small section illustrating the rape of our oceans is based on the book Ocean Of Life by Callum Roberts. As we constantly overfish and under-manage our seafoods and driving all life below the surface into extinction, Roberts offers up a startling example of deep sea stupidity. The following is a documented ledger of British leaders stumble down the path a fishing boat off the Pacific coast with a licence to catch only mahi-mahi, thereby making all other types of sea life illegal to keep. In one day, this professional trawler caught 211 mahi-mahi, but in the process hauled aboard and tossed back



Universities Coming To EHS

Representatives from Ontario's twenty-one universities will be at Espanola High School on Monday, October 3 from 10:00 – 11:00 a.m. for the University Information Program (UIP).

This free event offers high school students from the surrounding area, and their parents, the opportunity to speak in-person with multiple university representatives. Students and families from any high school in the area are welcome to attend.

The UIP offers students who are considering an Ontario university the opportunity to learn more about admission requirements, scholarships, residence, the application process, campus life and much more. The event is designed to assist graduating high school students in making an informed decision before they apply to university in January 2017. The event also aims to help younger students with high school course selections in order to guide them toward future university programs.

Students and their parents will have the chance to attend a fairstyle session, held in the school's gym, where they can visit each Ontario university representative individually.

Students can confirm the UЛР schedule with their guidance office. The UIP is hosted exclusively by Ontario universities. Each university participates in joint visits to high schools across the province each fall. Recipe

Use a leftover ham bone to make this creamy, satisfying, and very wholesome soup. Cooking it low and slow is the best method for creating creamy, delicious split pea

creamy, delicious split pea soup. It all starts with a 16 ounce bag of green split peas which are rich in soluble fiber keeping cholesterol and blood sugar levels in check. They are high in protein and low in fat, and make us feel full for a long time. Be sure to rinse and pick through the peas to remove any small pebbles or debris that commonly get mixed into the bag.

Slow Cooker Split Pea Soup


Servings: 6 to 8 servings

Ingredients

- 1 (16 ounce bag) green split peas, rinsed well and drained
- 2 carrots, peeled and chopped small
- 2 ribs celery, chopped small
- 1/2 cup finely chopped white or yellow onion
- 1 tablespoon minced garlic
- 1/3 cup chopped fresh Italian (flat leaf) parsley
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh thyme
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 teaspoon salt, plus additional as needed
- Fresh ground pepper, to taste
- 1 meaty ham bone
- 6 cups low-sodium chicken broth (or more, as needed), divided

Layer the ingredients, around the ham bone, in a slow cooker in the order listed. Add about 4 to 5 cups of chicken broth, just enough to cover ingredients. Reserve remaining chicken broth for later. Cover and cook on HIGH for 7 to 8 hours. Stir occasionally during cooking time. When peas are tender, remove ham bone to a cutting board. Pull off and tear the ham into small pieces and return it to the slow cooker. Discard ham bone and bay leaf. Use a spoon to lightly mash some of the peas against the side of the slow cooker and stir until nice and creamy, adding more broth, if needed, to reach desired consistency. Taste and season with additional salt and pepper, as needed.

This soup freezes exceptionally well. Freeze cooled soup in freezer containers. Thaw overnight in the refrigerator and then reheat in microwave or in a saucepan on the stove. When reheating, thin with a little water or chicken broth, if desired.
