




DTY Christmas Decorating Ideas


- Decorate an entryway or a tiny apartment with fir, spruce or pine branches in an oversize jar and hang ornaments from them.
- Whip Up a centerpiece. Separate red, green and silverwrapped candy and layer them in a large, glass vase.
- Transform mittens into hanging holders for tiny treats. Simply stitch on a loop of ribbon to the top and fill with goodies. Also makes a great favour for Christmas parties.
- Who says food can't double as decor? To add warmth to your home, create a cocoa brewing station, made complete with mugs, stirrers and a dispenser.
- A baby version of your large Christmas tree is the perfect size for a table. Put a tiny tree in a small pot, wrap the pot with burlap and instead of a star, tie

a bow to the top.

- Dangle pinecones from every cabinet door: Form a 12-inch-long ribbon into a loop, and hot-glue to the pinecone's base. Tie another 12-inch-long ribbon into a bow, and hot-glue over the ends of the first ribbon.
- Shiny ball ornaments don't just look good on trees they actually make for a lovely holiday centerpiece, tucked neatly into a bowl full of greens.







DTY Clothespin Snowflakes

Easily transform clothespins into pretty snowflakes. If you don't have a stash of wooden clothespins, they can be found at any dollar store. Use these snowflakes to embellish gifts or hang on a tree as an ornament.

DIY CLOTHESPIN SNOWFLAKES

- Wooden clothespins {8 total for one snowflake}
- Hot glue
- Paint, glitter anything to embellish (optional)











Begin by taking apart 8 wooden clothespins. The wooden slats easily slide right out of the metal spring with a little maneuvering. Each clothespin will give you two wooden pieces — simply align the flat sides of these two pieces and hot glue together. To start the snowflake shape, take two of the 'glued' pieces and hot glue them together along the small angled end. Continue with two more 'glued' pieces until you have an "x" shape. Insert the remaining four 'glued' pieces into each corner and secure with more hot glue. If you are making these into ornaments — slide a piece of thread or ribbon in between the last two pieces, before they are glued together, to create the hanger. Your snowflake is complete and ready to paint or embellish. Since these are made of wood they can be embellished a number of different ways but are also pretty left natural. Metallic glitter spray paint is pretty sprayed on these as well.

Reindeer Luzzle Ornament

Here is a great DIY ornament craft utilizing old puzzle pieces


REINDEER PUZZLE ORNAMENT

- Brown paint
- Glue stick
- Old puzzle pieces (4-5)
- Googly eyes
- Red pom pom nose
- Red ribbon

Choose 4-5 puzzle pieces about the same size. Arrange the puzzle pieces as shown below and glue together using



the glue stick. Paint the back of the puzzle pieces brown. Allow the pieces to dry approximately 10-15 minutes or longer. Once the pieces are dry, add googly eyes and a red pom pom nose. Add a red ribbon on the back of the ornament for the finishing touch.

THE RULES:


- 1. Pick someone who has had a tough time or would simply benefit from some festive goodwill. It doesn't have to be someone you know well.














Reindeer Noses Gift Jars

A cute little DIY gift for those people on your list that you want to give a little something to over the holidays.

REINDEER NOSES GIFT JARS

- Whoppers
- Red gumballs
- 2 brown pipe cleaners per reindeer
- Brown paint
- Tags
- · Hot glue gun
- Mason jars
- Ribbon
- Googly eyes
- Red bright pom poms



Tape off a middle section of the jar and paint brown. Allow paint to dry. Glue the googly eyes and nose on with the glue gun to make a face. To make antlers cut one pipe cleaner into ½ pieces and cut another pipe cleaner in half. Glue the ½ pieces onto the half pipe cleaner to make an antler as pictured above. Make two of these. Glue the two antlers to the top of the lid.. Cut a piece of ribbon to go around the edge of the lid and attach with glue. Make a tag labelled "reindeer noses" and attach to the jar with ribbon. Fill jar with Whoppers and few red gum balls

This sparkling cranberry pineapple punch has just the right amount of sweetness and is loved by grownups and children, so it's perfect for any party. The combination is crisp and refreshing. The lime and cranberries give this an extra punch so don't skip them.

SPARKLING CRANBERRY PINEAPPLE PUNCH

Serving: 10 cups

- 3 cups (24 oz) canned pineapple juice, chilled
- 3 cups (24 oz) cranberry juice cocktail, chilled
- 4 cups ginger ale
- ½ cup fresh or frozen cranberries
- ½ lime, thinly sliced
- ice

In a large pitcher or punch bowl, stir together: 3 cups pineapple juice, 3 cups cranberry juice and 4 cups ginger ale. Add cranberries, sliced lime and ice. Stir gently to combine and serve.

*Cranberries keep well in the freezer for at least a year so buy them during the holidays and freeze to use in this punch throughout the year.



Kris Kringle Christmas Cookies

This recipe makes a large batch, and is the perfect homemade gift for friends and family, and of course to leave out for Santa. They are packed full of yumminess with cranberries and white chocolate, and have a soft, chewy texture.. They also freeze really well. After they've completely cooled, pop them in a large freezer bag and lay it flat in the freezer for up to one month. You will be on Santa's "nice list" with these scrumptious Christmas cookies served with a big, glass of milk.

KRIS KRINGLE CHRISTMAS COOKIES

- 1 cup butter, softened
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 large eggs
- 2 teaspoons pure vanilla extract
- 2-1/4 cups all purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 1 cup white chocolate chips
- 1 cup dried cranberries

Heat oven to 375 F. Line a large baking sheet with parchment paper or spray with non-stick spray. Beat butter and sugar in large bowl with mixer until light and fluffy. Blend in eggs and vanilla. Add flour, baking soda



and salt; mix well. Stir in white chocolate and cranberries. Drop rounded spoonfuls (about 2 tablespoons) of dough, 1-1/2 inches apart, onto baking sheets. Bake for about 9 minutes. Cool on baking sheets for about 1 minute and remove to wire racks to cool completely.



Lepperoni Roll-Ups

Here is a fast, appetizer recipe that is loved by all ages and perfect for your Christmas celebrations. Each bite has gooey, melted cheese and real pizza flavour. Serve with pizza sauce or marinara sauce for dipping.

PEPPERONI ROLL-UPS

Yield: 8 appetizers

- 1 tube (8 ounces) refrigerated crescent rolls
- 16 thin slices pepperoni, cut into quarters
- 2 pieces string cheese (1 ounce each), cut into quarters
- 3/4 teaspoon Italian seasoning, divided
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic salt
- Pizza sauce or marinara sauce for dipping

Unroll crescent dough; separate into eight triangles. Place eight pepperoni pieces on each triangle. Place a piece of cheese on the short side of each triangle; sprinkle with 1/2 teaspoon Italian seasoning. Roll up each, starting with the short side;



pinch seams to seal. Sprinkle with garlic salt and remaining Italian seasoning. Place 2 inches apart on a greased baking sheet. Bake at 375° for 10-12 minutes or until golden brown. Serve warm.
