By Rosalind Russell - When a person is dependent on a substance such as alcohol or drugs, quitting can be difficult. Even reducing your intake can seem impossible. A program on Manitoulin Island provides support to those from the North Shore and Island area wanting help dealing with their addictions. Community Withdrawal Management Services (CWMS) offers assessment, support groups, home-

The Dennie Race - Canoe And Kayak Race Just Around The Corner

Do you love to canoe? Kayak? Then, the big water of the North Channel could be an ideal body of water to not only explore, but explore the old-fashion way, by paddle.

The race is held in memory of Blind River's David Dennie who was only 36 years old when he died after his sport utility vehicle collided with a tractor trailer in February of 2014. Off duty at the time, Dennie was an officer with the OPP. He loved the outdoors and kayaking, so the race was created in his honour.

The Dennie Race will take the format of the stage race, on Friday, August 19th and Saturday, August 20th, 2016. This will require that paddlers camp overnight and complete the course in two days, thus eliminating paddling through the night. Winners of the two-day, full-course race, will be determined by the shortest total time.

A one-day course for those wanting a less-demanding option will also be available for paddlers. The one-day race course will have racers begin on Friday, August 19th, at Spanish. They will run the second stage of the race, to the finish just outside Little Current.

Starts from both locations will be mass starts. There are no portages, but navigation through the thousands of islands that protect the route will be key. The route is a traditional Voyageur Route and should be attractive to Voyageur Canoe teams. Both legs are approximately 65 km in length.

The race course will follow a traditional route of the First Nations and Voyageurs, through the North Channel of Lake Huron. The race will begin in Blind River and finish on Manitoulin Island, which is touted as the "Largest Freshwater Island in the World".

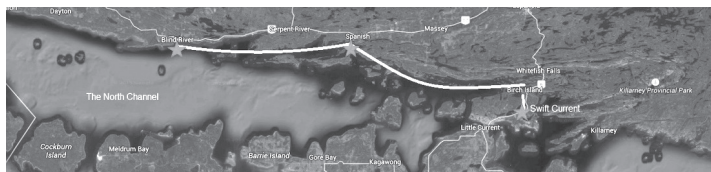
The first stage will begin at 9:00 am on Friday, August 19th, from the Blind River Marina. Paddlers

will begin east into the larger waters of North Channel, passing South Passage and Turnbull Passage and along the shores of the Serpent River First Nation entering the protected waters of the Whalesback Channel. Paddlers will then continue east into the mouth of the Spanish River and finishing the first stage at the Spanish River Marina.

The second stage will begin at 8:00 am on Saturday, August 20th. Paddlers will continue east passing through Little Detroit and into the McBean Channel. They will continue east along the shore of the Spanish River First Nation passing such historical land marks as Forte La Cloche entering the protected Bay of Islands. Navigation will be a key factor here as the vast number of islands leaves paddlers with a variety of route options.

They will continue into the Swift Current/La Cloche Channel, which separates the Whitefish River First Nation and La Cloche Island. Highlights of this area are the significant First Nation landmarks of Dreamers Rock and the Bell Rocks. Paddlers will travel southwest, passing under the 100-year-old swing bridge, the only land connection between Manitoulin and the North Shore. Paddlers will then make their way to the finish line at Low Island Park, Little Current. Both the two-day and one-day race options will finish at the Low Island Park in the Town of Little Current.

Manitoulin Island Addictions Services Program Changes Health Centres – Provides Supports Across The North Shore And On The Island

supported counselling, and a connection to other services.

The program was created 17 years ago and operated by Manitoulin Health Centre (MHC). At the time there were no other providers equipped to offer it. That has since changed. With the help of funding from the North East Local Health Integration Network (NE LHIN) the Noojmowin Teg Health Centre has grown into a place of healing as well as the new home of CWMS.

“Manitoulin Health Centre has long recognized the need for client assessment and for services that relate to withdrawal programming, and have looked historically to help fill this need,” said Derek Graham, President and CEO of Manitoulin Health Centre. “MHC looked to our local community partners for opportunities for enhancements. Coupled with the needs locally for culturally appropriate services, and given the range of community services available through Noojmowin Teg, the situation was right for this transition.”

Noojmowin Teg Health Centre, on Aundeck Omni Kaning First Nation, offers community-based programs to the local Indigenous population. These services include primary care, allied health, mental health and addictions, traditional healing, health promotion, as well as home and community care.

“Clients going through withdrawal are often dealing with underlying mental health issues,” said Pam Williamson, Executive Director at Noojmowin Teg Health Centre. “We are able to offer a broad range of services and better address the myriad of needs that person may have. We aim to help people see a pathway and figure out their goals.”

This move is in line with the NE LHIN’s priority to improve access and increase care coordination to addiction

services. Last year, the NE LHIN commissioned Dr. Brian Rush to review the North East region’s addictions services providers. Dr. Rush recommended enhancing support for community-based withdrawal management services.

“The Manitoulin Health Centre has been committed to this program and to clients for nearly two decades, but treatment needs have changed – and today Noojmowin Teg is better able to meet those needs,” said Kate Fyfe, Interim CEO, NE LHIN. “This is an opportunity to have different services and programs work collaboratively to respond to this client population.”

Three months after the move, one woman expressed how grateful she is that the CWMS program exists, and how satisfied she is with her treatment during the transition of the program to Noojmowin Teg.

“I’m very proud of what the assessment people provide. They make you feel very welcome and they don’t judge you. I was open to the people I spoke with and I felt very happy with every appointment I attended,” she said.

The transition of Community Withdrawal Management Services from Manitoulin Health Centre to Noojmowin Teg took about eight months and was seamless for both clients and staff. Noojmowin Teg leased a new space and incorporated the existing two-member team within its Mental Health and Addictions program.

“Our commitment is to maintain the existing priorities, and to build further support to the three local alternative therapies clinics, to increase program awareness and accessibility, and to seek more engagement with the partners of the Island Mental Health and Addictions Network,” said Williamson.

Recipe



My mother in law gave me the following recipe to share in my column and with it came an interesting story. On a trip to Greece, they met a Finnish lady from Sudbury who had paid for her entire trip using the money she had earned from picking and selling blueberries. The tour group later had a reunion and the lady brought these delicious muffins and the recipe. This is a perfect time to try this recipe while blueberries are in season. If you don't like to pick blueberries or don't have the time or place, you can find many sellers along the roadside right now who would appreciate your business.

Blueberry Muffins

- ½ cup orange juice
- ½ cup oats
- 2 eggs
- ½ cup sugar
- ½ cup oil
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 1 ½ cups flour
- ½ tsp baking soda
- 1 ½ cups baking powder
- ¼ tsp salt
- 1 cup blueberries

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease 12 muffin cups or line with muffin liners. Mix together the orange juice and oats. In a separate bowl beat the eggs with the sugar. Add the oil and beat again. Mix in the vanilla and oat mix. Add the flour, baking soda, baking powder and salt. Mix until just combined. Fold in the blueberries. Fill cups and bake for 15 minutes.

Repairs Completed On Bridge - Now Future Being Looked At

The repairs on the Swing Bridge in Little Current are finished.

For the past two months, the Ministry of Transportation (MTO) has been investigating the replacement of the over century-old Manitoulin Swing Bridge, and this could even mean a tunnel, or chunnel as it were, in Manitoulin's future.

So far, the MTO says that the preliminary design for a new bridge will include reviewing alternate locations and a variety of designs.

There have been delays crossing the bridge due to repairs, but those delays are now over with the work being completed just over a week ago.

The bridge only opened to marine traffic three times a day while the repairs were made to one of the four supports over the last couple of weeks.

The schedule returns to normal today with the bridge swinging open to traffic at the top of every second hour for ten minutes throughout the daylight hours.
