Espanola Police Chief Suspended – Investigation Underway



The chief of the Espanola Police Service has been suspended over an alleged code of conduct violation.

The Espanola Police Services Board said in a release, a week ago Tuesday, that Chief Steven Edwards has been "suspended with pay pending an investigation," in accordance with a section of the Police Services Act concerning misconduct.

Section 77 (4) of the act authorizes a police board to review a complaint concerning a chief of police and, if determined the chief's conduct; "may constitute an offence under a law" or misconduct as defined in the act, it can ask the Ontario Police Commission to "assign the chief

Get Lost! Seriously, Go Get Lost!

Apparently, getting lost is good for you. But grocery stores don't count. Not particularly proud of it, but I've been lost on sea and land and yes, even in the air. Flying with a friend at the stick of a single-engine Musketeer out of Orillia and headed home to Niagara, we were suddenly engulfed in thick fog. Travelling blind with no instruments, John dropped out of the clouds, too quickly for my stomach's sake and pulled up before we hit the land. Did you know that unlike commercial airlines, tiny, personal aircraft do not come equipped with barf bags? So yeah, when it comes to travel, I'm a one-man lost but always found department. I know the word 'where' in 19 languages including Urdu. And honestly, I wouldn't have it any other way. I can't tell you the number of great people I've met, the hidden treasures I've found while travelling where others have not tread. I love pouring over maps, highlighting routes and calculating arrival times. I hate Google maps and GPS. I despise the voice of Siri.

So I've been ridiculously lost at times, but never so hopelessly turned around I didn't know which end was up. But Noel Santillan has. Several years ago Noel was sitting on his couch in New Jersey watching Iceland's Eyjafjallajökull volcano erupt in flames and ash and he said to himself – I gotta go there! Really? Because my recollection of that event was that planes were grounded all over Europe

and North America as most people struggled to avoid that disaster. But not Noel. "Oh look! A big fire! Anybody got gasoline?"

So last February, the 28-year-old Sam's Club marketing manager found himself driving his rented Nissan north out of Iceland's Keflavik airport with his GPS guiding him every mile of the way. His hotel was on Laugarvegur Road, a thoroughfare he could not pronounce let alone find on his own. So he just drove - into daylight, into remoteness, onto icy roads. Noel drove and drove. Sleepy, jet-lagged and hungry, Noel reset the GPS which told him to just keep on driving. So he did because he trusted the technology. Finally the GPS directions ended at a lonely house on the edge of a tiny fishing village that was so forlorn and boring even The Vikings had avoided it in favour of the north shore of Newfoundland. Noel walked up to the house with his hotel reservation in hand where a woman informed him, between fits of laughter, that no, his hotel was 380 kilometres south, in the capital of Reykjavik, actually not far from the airport. This town named Siglufjördhur was on Laugarvegur Road, not Laugavegur Road. Expedia misspelled his destination by adding an unnecessary "r".

A few things became abundantly clear to "Noel The Vole." Another hour of driving and it would have been Santa Claus giving him

of police of another police force to cause the complaint to be investigated promptly."

Police Board Chair, Mary-Lou Mick, told Around & About, a complaint was made on Wednesday, December 6th, by a member of the police service, and Chief Edwards was suspended on Thursday, December 7th.

Mick said she would not speak to the specific nature of the complaint at this point in the process, other than to say it falls within code of conduct rules that are consistent for all police services in Ontario, adding the board sought legal advice after fielding the complaint "to find out whether charges should be laid, and according to the lawyer the charges should be laid under code of conduct."

An investigation will be carried out by the Ontario Civilian Police Commission, she said, as well as by an outside police

Once that process is complete, "they will determine what the actual charges are and go from there," she said. "I can't tell vou what nature they are. because I don't know where they fall under the police act." She said ordinarily the board would have turned to the Espanola OPP as an outside source to investigate a matter like this, but since the municipality is in the midst of a review to see if the OPP should take over policing in the town, it was felt there would be a conflict of interest and the integrity of the investigation could be compromised.

"It has to be arm's-length," she said. "It could have been the OPP, but because of the costing situation, we don't feel it is right to bring them in. Council has asked for a costing to determine if we should stay with a municipal force or go with the OPP."

Instead, the board is engaging

a police service from southern Ontario, she said, to investigate the allegation against the chief. In the meantime, Sgt. William Lamour has been assigned as interim police chief. He is the highest-ranking officer in Espanola and will temporarily fill the position, until the police board can recruit another individual to be interim chief.

"We will be looking to bring in a more permanent temporary chief, I guess you could call it, until everything is resolved," she said. "We are already in contact with someone and have a tentative candidate."

Mick said it could take quite a while before the investigation is complete.

"This is going to be a fairly long investigation," she said. "Everybody will have to be interviewed. I can't see it happening immediately."

However, by the investigation must be completed within six months. Edwards became a member of the Espanola Police Service on May 29, 1995, re-locating back to the area from London, Ontario where he served as a police constable for five years. In 1999, on the approval of former Chief Ray Freeman, the Police Services Board, and with support of the community, the K9 program was developed with Edwards as the dog handler. Edwards and Jag, his German Shepherd, became a certified police K9 team in April 2000.

On June 1, 2001, Edwards was appointed Acting Sergeant and on January 1, 2007, he was promoted to rank of Sergeant. 2011, Edwards In honoured with the Governor General's 20 year Police Exemplary Service Medal.

On January 7, 2015, he was sworn in as Espanola's sixth police chief.

Recipe

I just made these delicious squares; they taste a lot like pecan pie and are so easy to make. The recipe contains very few ingredients and the procedure is not time consuming; a perfect last minute addition to your cookie tray for the holidays.

Pecan Graham Bars

- 1 cup butter
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1 cup pecans, chopped
- 20 graham cracker squares



Line ungreased cookie sheet with graham cracker squares. In saucepan, melt butter and brown sugar. Bring to rolling boil and boil for 2 minutes. Do not over boil or it will become sugary. Stir in chopped pecans. Pour over graham crackers and spread evenly. Bake in 350° oven for 10 minutes. Allow to cool, and break squares into halves. Enjoy!
