Zimmerman takes over the position immediately.

#### Water Project For Whitefish River First Nation

A major water improvement project is underway Whitefish River First Nation. Cecchetto & Sons Limited of Sudbury has been awarded the contract to build a reservoir. Once constructed, the elevated storage reservoir will serve the community's long-term drinking water needs and provide sustainable long-term water pressure to improve fire protection to the community's residents and infrastructure. Chief Shining Turtle says

citizens depend on safe and

secure drinking water from source to tap and the reservoir will complement the water treatment plant, which began operating in 2010.

The federal government is providing \$3.5 million toward the project.

Construction is scheduled to begin immediately and is expected to be completed by October 2018.

Whitefish River First Nation is located about 25 minutes south of Espanola and has 450 residents.

#### First Nation Education Takes Another Step Forward



Self-governance in education has taken another major step forward.

On behalf of the Anishinabek Nation, Grand Council Chief Patrick Madahbee extended congratulations to the 23 Participating First Nations and the Kinoomaadziwin (KIN-OH-MAD-SWIN) Education Body on the Royal Assent of Bill C-61, the Anishinabek Nation Education Agreement

Madahbee said for so long, First Nations having their own education system was a dream, but today, they take a step forward on their journey to building a better education and realizing a better future for Anishinabek youth.

The Agreement recognizes Anishinabek law-making powers and authority over education on and off reserve from Junior Kindergarten to Grade 12, as well as administrative control over funding for post-secondary education.

The next steps are to prepare for the target effective date of April 1, 2018 for enactment.

The Anishinabek Nation Education Agreement is an important step out from under the Indian Act toward greater self-determination for the participating First Nations.

The Agreement is the largest education self-government agreement in Canada, and the first of its kind in Ontario.

#### Boy Suffers Severe Burns – Gofundme Set Up

The North Shore is pulling together to help the family of 12-year-old Ethen McCutcheon of Spanish who was badly burned earlier this month.

On Sunday, December 3rd, Ethen and a friend went into the woods armed with all the makings of a great bonfire.

But, it got out of control and Ethen was burned badly on the left side of his body, the most severe on his left leg, left hand and right thumb.

Ethen was airlifted to Toronto's

Sick Kids hospital where he underwent surgery to relieve and sterilize his wounds.

The next several months are going to be especially difficult since he will require several more surgeries and rehabilitation, and he may not regain complete mobility in his left leg and hands. A GoFundMe has been set up to assist the family with the costs associated with an extended stay at the hospital.



#### Espanola Awarded Funding for a Commuter Cycle Plan



A new bike trail will connect Espanola with the rest of the world ... literally.

The Town of Espanola was successful in applying for a grant to the Ontario Municipal Commuter Cycling program fund that was announced this summer by the Minister of Transportation.

It is part of the Province's Climate Change Action Plan 2016-2020 initiatives to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in Ontario

Espanola EDO and program manager, Cheryl Kennelly, says the grant of \$25,000 will go towards the development of a commuter cycle plan.

She says the funding is designated to create a plan to lay down the framework to

develop an active transportation network and improve cycling infrastructure and signage, the identification of trails and increase cycling amenities.

Espanola is now part of the designated Lake Huron North Channel Waterfront Trail system.

Next year, it will also be a part of the new Georgian Bay Cycling Route connecting the system to Manitoulin and the Bruce Peninsula. With being a part of both systems, Espanola effectively becomes a major stopping point and hub for the cycling community.

The work will be carried out in 2018.

#### Recipe

you can just snack on it while watching television like I've been doing. I've made it once and I am picking up more ingredients to make it again. Warning, it is very addictive!

# Praline Crunch (makes 10 cups)

- . . .
- 8 cups Crispix cereal
- 2 cup pecan halves1/2 cup brown sugar, packed
- 1/2 cup corn syrup
- 1/2 cup butter
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1/2 tsp baking soda



Preheat oven to 250°F. In a large bowl, combine cereal and pecans. In a medium saucepan over medium high heat, combine brown sugar, corn syrup and butter. Bring to a boil, stirring occasionally. Remove from heat and stir in vanilla and baking soda. Pour over cereal mixture, tossing to coat evenly. Pour cereal mixture into a 9x13-inch casserole dish. Bake for 1 hour, stirring every 20 minutes. Pour onto wax or parchment paper to cool. Break into pieces.
