NOTICE OF THE PASSING OF ZONING BYLAW

(Planning Act-Section 34(18))

TAKE NOTICE that the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers passed Bylaw 2017-30 on the 22nd day of November 2017.

The land to which the bylaw applies is described as Salter Township, Section 25, Plan D-270 Unit 6, Parcel 6-1, #210 Tansy Lane, Massey.

The purpose for the amendment is to rezone from General Commercial to General Residential and to provide for a reduced lot depth. This application is also subject of a consent application under the Planning Act to allow for a new residential lot.

The last date for filing a notice of appeal is December 25, 2017. A Notice of Appeal must be filed with the Clerk of the Corporation of the Township of Sables-Spanish Rivers, setting out the reasons for the appeal. This must also be accompanied by the fee required by the Ontario Municipal Board.

Only individuals, corporations and public bodies may appeal a zoning bylaw to the Ontario Municipal Board. A Notice of Appeal may not be filed by an unincorporated association or group. However, a Notice of Appeal may be filed in the name of an individual who is a member of the association or the group on its behalf.

No persons or public body shall be added as a party to the hearing of the appeal unless, before the bylaw was passed, the person or public body made oral submissions at a public meeting or written submissions to the Council or, in the opinion of the Ontario Municipal Board, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party.

This bylaw is available for inspection in the municipal office during regular office hours.



The Dog Union – Working Canines of the World Unite

Recipe

This recipe takes green beans to another level. Roasting beans gives them a bit of a nutty flavor and the caramelized onions add a mild sweetness. This



recipe is super easy and quick to throw together. Toss them on a cookie sheet and forget about them for 20 minutes. This is a perfect side dish for holiday dinners or you can half the recipe for a smaller week night dinner.

Roasted Green Beans

10 to 12 servings

- 4 pounds fresh green beans, topped and tailed
- 16 slices thin bacon, cut into tiny pieces
- 1 large onion, finely chopped
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

Preheat the oven to 425 degrees F. Put the beans on 1 or 2 baking sheets. Sprinkle over the bacon and onions, and add the olive oil, salt and pepper. Toss around to mix and coat everything in oil. Bake until the bacon is sizzling and the beans are starting to brown, 18 to 20 minutes.

*The bacon can be spread on the baking sheet and precooked for 5-7 minutes before you add the onions and beans if you like your bacon crispier.


