A Hitchhiker's Advice To Wannabes. Don't.

As ridiculous as this may sound, at 70 louder. years of age I still enjoy hitchhiking. Safe country, beautiful day, backpack stocked for an overnight – there I am with my thumb out watching the world and lots and lots of cars go by.

Such was the case late last October during a glorious spell of warm weather in Portugal, just south of the Douro River. With the research for my next book going very well at the Senhora do Convento, I decided to venture out from this 1300-year-old monastery and hitchhike south to Trancoso. I'd driven through this ancient market town a year before and promised myself a visit.

Living alone in a castle is harder than you think. The place was seriously haunted. I was getting stir-crazy and the four people who work at the attached winery were gone for the weekend. So Saturday morning I walked out to the winding two-lane road, headed south in no hurry whatsoever.

Two dozen cars passed me by before José The Baker opened the passenger door of his little truck and I climbed in to share a seat with a huge burlap bag full of bread. Not just any bread, but "the best bread in all of Portugal" - big, dark brown, round loaves delivered daily to the best restaurants in the region.

José dropped me at the rough-looking town of Sendim which - and only a savvy world traveller like myself would know such trivia ... is the home of former Toronto Maple Leaf Mats Sundin. The guy's name is on everything!

Fifteen minutes later a fat man in hip waders picked me up and took me ten kilometres down the road. I couldn't understand a word of his heavilyaccented Portuguese so ... he talked



Now I'm standing at the main intersection of a town called Cabacos, eating an apple I picked from a limb that was technically hanging over the fence and therefore on public property and this kid (they're all kids if they're under 40 now) comes up to me and gives me some unwanted advice. Speaking very good English he tells me that the road is closed in the direction I'm heading and I must go the other way, east to Riodades and then south down the other side of Lake Vilar, bypassing the road closure. To this day I don't know if this guy

suffered from a sick sense of humour or if his GPS was homemade because way too late I would learn - there was no road closure. I began my detour toward Escurguela and was almost immediately picked up by a smiling 30-year-old farmer who pointed out all the crops along the way. This medieval town consists of an overgrown soccer field, one lazy Saint Bernard and a population of the farmer, his wife and two kids.

Except for a few farm machines going in the opposite direction, nobody travelled this road. I walked the entire distance from Escurquela to Renso, a town on the original direct route to Trancoso. Now seven miles does not sound like a lot and I have covered much more ground in four hours, but never under a hot sun and over mountainous dirt roads that wind endlessly up and down so that you can never see the end.

Sore, soaked and out of water, I finally got a lift from the same happy farmer who left me stranded in Escurguela! I was glad to see him; my legs hated his guts!

Off to visit family, he dropped me a mile down the road and the couple in the car that had to stop behind us had little choice but to pick me up. A few silent miles down the road I'm out and almost instantly in a white truck with Quinta de Santo Estevao on the side driven by Tiago. Maybe twenty, Tiago gives me a drive-by tour of his parents' country inn. A huge stone farmhouse attached to the ancient Chapel of St. Stephen set among pine and chestnut trees, I knew all this will be Tiago's soon. I promised him, some day I would come back and stav there.

Next, an old man in the traditional peaked wool cap picks me up and drops me five kilometres past Sequeiros, within spitting distance of my destination, Trancoso. Standing across from a very modern gas station, the highway became a freeway with cars accelerating on past me. Any car that might stop risked getting rammed from behind. Everything was going south but me. It was getting dark. I was dead tired. So I walked across the highway and started hitchhiking north. Same thing. That three or

four miles back to Sequeiros might be the hardest walk of my life.

I got to the town, walked into a bar and convinced the owner to drive me to the Quinta de Santo Estevao. Actually, seeing me flop into a chair I might never leave, his wife convinced him to drive me.

Needless to say, Tiago now thinks that "some day" in English means "later the same day" in Portuguese. I got the last room at the inn and checking in, I asked for a bucket of ice.

"Ah ha," said the kid, "the ice, it's for your feet."

"Actually, no," I replied, "the ice ... it's for my Scotch."

I sat on a plastic chair under the shower until the water went cold.

Such calamity, I thought, maybe I should write about it. Oh wait, I already had recorded such disasters in a book titled Never Hitchhike On The Road Less Travelled. Time to take my own advice ... and maybe a bus or two.

- 2 1/2 cups graham crumbs or 2 sleeves crushed.
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter (for crust)
- 2 cups of powdered sugar, sifted
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, softened (for filling)
- 4 oz cream cheese, softened
- 8 oz container Cool Whip
- 20 oz can crushed pineapple, drained well

Preheat the oven to 300 F. Melt 1/2 cup butter in the microwave and let it cool. Combine the crumbs and butter, then press 2 cups of the crumb mixture firmly into a 9×9 square pan and bake for 8-10 minutes. Place on wire rack to cool. Beat the cream cheese and 1/2 cup butter together until creamy. Turn



the mixer down to low and add the powdered sugar one cup at a time until incorporated. Turn up and beat well for a minute or so. Add a heaping tablespoon of the drained crushed pineapple and stir in with a rubber spatula. Spread the cream cheese and pineapple mixture over the crust. Fold the remaining pineapple into the Cool Whip and spread on top of the cream cheese mixture. Sprinkle the remaining graham cracker crumb mixture on top. Refrigerate for at least 4 hours, preferably overhight.
